## ANNUAL MEETING AND REPORT.

The Annual Meeting of the Subscribers to the Toronto House of Industry was held at the Institution on Wednesday, January 13th, at 3.30 p.m. There were present, His Worship the Mayor in the chair, Rev. Dr. Topp, Mr. Hobson, Rev. A. J. Broughall, Mr. Sheriff Jarvis, Rev. W. Henry Jones, Mr. Jacques, Mr. W. S. Lee, Alderman Henderson, Mr. J. McBain, Mr. Elmsley, Mr. R. The Secretary, Mr. W. J. MacDonell, read the Annual Report, as follows:-

In accordance with the Act of Incorporation the Trustees and Managers of the Toronto House of Industry beg to present this Report of the year's operat:ons.

Although during the last few years the population of the city has largely increased, the Board are happy to say there has not been a corresponding increase of poverty. A certain degree of want does undoubtedly exist, but this is chiefly among newly-arrived immigrants, whose scanty means being exhausted, they have become dependent upon extraneous assistance. As a rule the Board consider it a duty to relieve, according to the means at their disposal, all immigrants requiring assistance during the first twelve months of their-

The system of Ward Visiting, by which every case is duly examined before entry on the books of the Institution, is still practised with highly satisfactory results. In cases of neces- orship , Rev. Jones, Mr. J. , Mr. d, Dr. certain chiefly s being raneous relieve, ants reof theirs, or un d for the in good sity the Superintendent is authorized to give temporary assistance, pending the customary report of the Ward Visitor.
The Soup Kitchen is now in active operation, distributing about 3000 gallons per month.

During the past year the Trustees availed themselves of an opportunity of securing the freehold of the remaining lots fronting on Edward street; they are now, consequently, in possession of the entire square.

The Board have much pleasure in expressing their full satisfaction with regard to the management of the Institution under the superintendence of Mr. and Mrs. Duckett. They have also to acknowledge the very efficient manner in which the functions of the Medical officer have been performed by Dr. Ogden.

The T'reasurer's accounts have been duly audited and await your approval, also the usual Report of the Medical Officer and Superintendent.

## MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

I beg to report that I have visited the House regularly as usual, and occasionally other parts of the city to verify the statements of applicants for relief as to the existence of sickness in their families, and I regret that in several cases I have had to expose attempted imposition.

I have prescribed for 870 persons, or an average of nearly 17 each week.

Besides diseases of the character usually met with among our inmates, I have had ten or twelve cases of typhoid fever.
Seven deaths took place during the first seven months of the year, but none since July.

The respective ages of those who died were $64,68,70,76$, 79, 83, and 89 years.

One died of Chronic Bronchitis, two of of Senile Debility or old age, one of Chronic Heart Disease, and two of Typhoid Fever.
