Turker.—Private letters from Vienna say, that news had been recieved direct from Constantinople, dated the 26th of August, according to which the Stiltan is the substitution of the designs of the conspirators. Five hundred persons who were considered by the Saltan as gallty had been obliged to explate the suspicion with their lives. It appears to us inconssivable, that the conqueror should have refrained from obtaining, by the occupation of the Dardanelles and the forts on the Bosphous, some security for the sincerity of the Sultan's repentance. Probably you will have received letters from Vienna with similar accounts.
