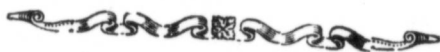

MINUTES

OF THE

THIRD NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE

The third session of the Nova Scotia Annual Conference the Methodist Church of Canada, began at Windsor, on Wednesday, June 21st, 1876.

The Rev. A. W. Nicolson, President of the Conference, took the chair at 9 o'clock, a. m.

After singing and the reading of the Scriptures, prayer was offered by the Rev. James G. Hennigar and the Rev. Thomas H. Davies.

The Conference proceeded to elect by ballot its chief officers when the Rev. Robert Alder Temple was elected President and the Rev. Stephen F. Huestis Secretary.

The Rev. Jabez A. Rogers was elected Journal Secretary.

The Rev'ds Cranswick Jost, Arthur D. Morton, and Ralph Brecken were appointed Assistant Secretaries; the Rev. Ebenezer England, Assistant Journal Secretary; the Rev'ds. John Read and Robert McArthur, Letter-writers, and Rev. J. I. Borden, Conference Reporter to the WESLEYAN.

6.—REPORT of the EXAMINING COMMITTEE OF THEOLOGICAL STUDENTS to the Conference of Nova Scotia—1876.

The Committee in submitting their report, would express the great satisfaction felt at the increasing efficiency of the Theological department of the Mount Allison Institutions.

A very comprehensive course of theological study has been provided for, and the theological tutor has had valuable assistance in the work of training candidates for our Ministry. Dr. Allison has had charge of a large class in New Testament Exegesis, and Mr. Kennedy, B. D., has given instructions in Church History, while Professor Burwash has accomplished much good by his weekly training of the students in elocution. In this connection the Committee would commend the example of John McDonald Esq., M. P., of Toronto, who has agreed to give a yearly prize of \$25 for excellence in elocution, to be competed for by the students in theology. Dr. Stewart has this year conducted the students under his care through a course in Systematic Theology and Old Testament Exegesis. The examination in these departments were most satisfactory to the Committee, not only comparing favorably with those of last year, but greatly surpassing them in interest, because there has not only been the inculcation of those doctrines and views distinctively Methodist, but also a comprehensive study of theology as a science and a system. There were twelve students connected with the theological department last year, of whom four belonged to the Nova Scotia Conference, viz :—Messrs. William A. Bennett who has been three years at the Institution; Byron C. Borden and John Gee, who have been two years at the Institution; and George Johnson (B) who has been one year at the Institution. In their deliberations, it was the privilege of the Committee to have associated with them the following ministers :—Messrs. McMurray, Pope, Taylor, Duncan, McKeown, Lathern and Paisley. Of the Committee (proper) Dr. Pickard was chosen Chairman, and Mr. Morton Secretary. The usual disciplinary questions regarding personal religion, and attachment to methodist doctrine and discipline having been put and satisfactorily answered, the following recommendations were concurred in :

It may be premised that these recommendations were based upon the report of the Theological Tutor jointly with the impressions produced upon the minds of the Committee by the examinations they had witnessed.

1. William A. Bennett, who receives high commendation for his general deportment, and who has made most satisfactory improvement in his studies, completing his collegiate course and graduating as Bachelor of Arts, is recommended for the regular work of the ministry.

2. Byron C. Borden whose deportment has been commendable, and whose examinations have been satisfactory, is recommended to be allowed to return to the Institution.

3. John Gee, who has applied himself closely to his studies, and sustained a good moral character, is recommended to be allowed to return to the Institution.

MODE OF EXAMINATION.

Papers prepared by the Examiners upon the books, &c., assigned to them are to be sent to the Secretary of the Examining Board by the first of January,

Each *Chairman* and Financial Secretary shall meet the Candidates and Probationers in their Districts, on the last Wednesday in April, at some place appointed by the *Chairman*; lay the printed questions before them, and transmit their written answers to the respective Examiners, who shall immediately report the result to the Secretary of the Examining Board. A meeting of the Examining Board is to be held on the day previous to the opening of the Conference, at 9 o'clock a. m., in order to be ready to report to the Conference. The Superintendent of the Circuit which recommends a Candidate to be received on trial, is required to give a written statement of his religious character, talents, and usefulness; educational advant-

ages, acquirements, and other particulars, as required by our Discipline; which statement shall be signed by him, and recorded in the District Book.

No Probationer shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are satisfactorily completed.

The Conference requires Candidates received on trial for our ministry, to preach a trial sermon before the District Meeting by which they are recommended, or before a Committee appointed by the District Meeting, who shall report its opinion on the sermon, and embody it in the recommendation of such Candidate to the Conference.

Chairmen of Districts are requested to inform the Secretary immediately after the March Quarterly Meeting of those who are to be Candidates for Examination in the Preliminary Course of Study.

7.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK OF GOD,

HALIFAX DISTRICT.

Foremost in point of numbers, wealth and general influence, the extensive District of Halifax seems to have derived the largest and most widely spread blessings of grace during the past year. Without entering into detail, it may be observed, that in the chief centres, such as Halifax and Windsor, as well as in adjacent rural circuits, the Lord has been pleased to manifest, in a signal and glorious manner His power to save. Not only have conversions been numerous, but according to outward evidence, deep and thorough, reaching to all classes and ages.

TRURO DISTRICT.

In reviewing the spiritual work of this district during another year, the Brethren labouring within its limits, express their deep obligations of gratitude to the Lord of the harvest, for the meed of reward with which their labours have been crowned. Diligence for Christ has received more than a sevenfold recompence, and the prospect for the future is encouraging.

CUMBERLAND DISTRICT.

A retrospect of the year's work connected with this region is decidedly encouraging. With scarcely an exception, harmony and prosperity have prevailed in all our circuits and peace has dwelt in all our borders. Special showers of grace have been realized on the Pictou, Wash, Athol, Parrsboro', Amherst, and River Phillip circuits, resulting in the quickening of believers and the ingathering of many souls. Nevertheless the supineness and worldly conformity which in

measure prevail, are a source of constant and prayerful anxiety, for the removal of which the brethren still look upward to the Lord of Hosts.

GUYSBORO' AND C. B. DISTRICT.

Here, as in the last named field of toil, almost every Circuit has rejoiced during the year in large and unwonted effusions of saving grace. These have issued in the greater vitality of christian professors, and in accessions to the church of God, of many who had formerly lived without the knowledge of, or desire for pardon through the blood of Christ. Another attendant result has been the formation of additional Society Classes, and a goodly degree of prosperity appearing in our Sabbath Schools.

ANNAPOLIS DISTRICT

Tidings of similar import to the preceding accounts reach us from this portion of the Lord's vineyard. The formation of new and the enlargement of old Societies, are the natural and necessary outgrowth of many visitations of the Spirit on several of the Circuits. But even in localities where these have been withheld, sufficient indications remain to augur well for the future.

LIVERPOOL DISTRICT.

Last in order, but by no means least, either in importance or spiritual fruitage. The returns from this district abundantly attest the all-victorious power of the Lord. Several Circuits might be named in which—largely through the instrumentality of special efforts—additions to the ranks of Christ have been made, and an improved tone of piety developed. On the Yarmouth South Circuit special attention has been paid to the matter of Christian Holiness, with results such as have amply justified the prominence given to that important subject. The missions in the neighbourhood of Yarmouth are proving more and more successful, while even in those parts where Methodism is in its infancy, the outlook is hopeful. The efforts to organize a cause at Lockeport has met with encouraging success, and there is now a prospect of erecting a church in that thriving place.

This report, however, would neither be faithful nor complete did it omit all reference to causes, which in various localities throughout our Conference bounds, prove more or less obstructive to true piety. Worldly conformity on the part of many professing the love of God, cannot but retard the progress of the truth, and tempt the unbelieving world to disparage *all* religion as spurious and unsubstantial.

Closely connected with this, is a great neglect of class meeting by many, while others are found who have entirely forsaken this valuable assistance to growth in grace. Persuaded of the efficiency which has always attended the faithful maintenance of this time honored institution, the brethren are still determined by the grace of God, to employ the best means of reviving and sustaining a practical appreciation of its value. Congregational Bible Classes and Social Services have done, and are doing, a large and appreciable work in the conservation of godliness, yet no means of grace is so immediately and constantly

productive of permanent good as is the Society Class, conducted according to the original design.

While part of the seed sown during the year has failed to spring up for lack of earth, and others, though such as promised fair, has been choked by worldly cares, it is evident that much has fallen into good ground, and is now yielding a hundredfold.

The total increase of full and accredited members for the year 895, while these remaining on trial amount to 1256, making a total membership of 9884.

8.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

That this Conference hails with great satisfaction the increased impetus, which has been given during the past year to the temperance cause, within this Province and throughout the Dominion generally.

That we heartily concur in the efforts which are now being put forth to secure the legal prohibition of the liquor traffic.

That while we rejoice in the success of all those institutions which are striving to promote the temperance cause, we at the same time believe that the Church of Christ should ever be foremost in every moral reform. We therefore urge with renewed emphasis upon all our members strict obedience to our rule which forbids "Drunkenness, buying or selling of spirituous liquors, or drinking them, unless in case of extreme necessity." We further suggest the advisability of forming open Total Abstinence Societies, in connexion with all our churches and congregations; and also that special reference be made to this reform, in connexion with the prayer meetings upon the several circuits, once in each month.

That apart from the question of the use of fermented wine at the Lord's Table, we regard the employment of the drugged and impure compounds bearing the name of "Wine", as being injudicious in connection with this holy ordinance. We therefore urge upon our people that special attention be given to securing pure wine for use in the Lord's Supper; and suggest that if possible, some agency be instituted to secure the accomplishment of this end.

3.—INSURANCE.

In view of recent fires causing the total loss of Conference property, upon which there was no insurance, therefore

RESOLVED

That the Conference desires to impress upon the Trustee Boards of the several circuits, the great importance of insuring as largely as practicable, the churches and parsonages under their care.

4.—REV. A. W. NICOLSON.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Conference are hereby presented to the Rev. A. W. Nicolson, Ex-President, for the able, satisfactory and brotherly manner in which he has discharged the duties of his office during the term of his Presidency.

5.—THANKS TO THE SECRETARIES.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Conference be presented to the Revs. R. A. Temple, Secretary, S. F. Huestis, Journal Secretary, and the Assistant Secretaries, for their valuable and efficient services during the past year.

FINANCIAL ECONOMY.

The Conference recommends to the Quarterly Meetings of the several Circuits, the following plan, by which it is hoped they may the more effectually raise the amount necessary to meet the allowance of the ministers and preachers, and which will make the collection of class and ticket money hereafter unnecessary.

1. Let the Quarterly Boards at the beginning of each financial year, estimate the amount needed for the year.

2. Then ascertain from each member of the church, and, as far as practicable, from each attendant of the congregation, what each proposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.

3. Let these sums be entered by a steward appointed for that purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.

4. If the total amount of these sums does not equal the amount needed, then let the stewards apportion the deficiency among such as are willing, for Christ's sake, to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.

5. Let the stewards then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month, by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly or of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the quarterly meeting. The said steward shall keep an individual account of all the pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the quarterly meeting, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That quarterly meetings adopting the envelope system be recommended not to include in their estimates the claims of Foreign and Home Missions, but to provide for these funds as in time past, by special collections and subscriptions.

STANDING ORDERS.

1.—FINANCIAL DISTRICT MEETINGS.

1. The attention of the Chairmen of Districts is called to *Sec. VI., p. 49, and Sec. 1., p. 112, of the Discipline.* The Conference directs that the greatest care shall be exercised in preparing the estimates of Receipts and Expenditure on the dependent Circuits. The expenditure shall in no case exceed \$750, exclusive of the Children's Fund claims and house rent. These estimates, together with a detailed statement of the removal expenses of ministers, shall be forwarded to the Rev. S. F. Huestis, Secretary of the Missionary Committee, who will transmit them to the Central Missionary Board.

2.—CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

2. *Missionary and Educational Societies.*—Each Superintendent is required to present at the District Meeting, in a form for publication, lists of the benefactors and subscribers to these Societies of one dollar and upwards, all amounts under one dollar to be entered under small sums, with an account of their respective contributions, and all other monies received during the year; and the Chairman of the District shall forward such lists to the Treasurers of the respective Funds.

3. *Contingent and Supernumerary Ministers' Funds.*—Superintendents are requested to see that the annual public collections are taken for these funds at the times appointed. For the latter fund subscriptions and donations shall be taken in the Classes and among the lay friends of the Church, and the names of all annual subscribers of five dollars or more shall be forwarded to the Treasurer for publication in the Minutes of Conference.—(*Dis. p. 115.*)

4. *Children's Fund.*—The Financial Secretaries of the several districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meeting, the names of all ministers in their respective districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed; and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

3.—SABBATH SCHOOL REPORTS.

5. Each Superintendent is directed to see that an Annual Report of the state of the Sabbath Schools in his Circuit, is prepared, in tabular form (*Schedules Nos. 1 & 2, issued by the Board of management*), and presented to the Quarterly Official, and District meetings.—(*Dis., pp. 79 & 98.*)

4.—REPORTS OF RELIGIOUS STATE.

6. Each Superintendent is directed to prepare a Report of the religious state of his Circuit or Mission, to be read at the Annual District Meeting; at which meeting a summary of such Reports shall be prepared and entered in the District Minutes for the information of

the Conference. The condensed Reports of Missions shall also be prepared in a form to be transmitted to the General Secretaries.

5.—BOOK-ROOM ACCOUNTS.

7. Every Minister and Preacher is peremptorily required to settle his book account for the preceding year at each Annual Conference, and also regularly to transmit the money in his hands, without any reservation or deduction whatever, to the Book Steward, whenever it shall amount to ten dollars. (*Jour. Gen. Conf. p, 168.*)

6.—THE WESLEYAN.

8. Chairman of Districts are directed to institute enquiry at the Annual District as to the deligence and fidelity of each Minister and Preacher responsible for the collection of subscriptions due for the Wesleyan.

7.—DISTRICT MINUTES.

9. Chairmen of Districts are required to take to Conference three complete copies of the Minutes of the Annual and Financial District Meetings, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary;—one copy, inserted in the District Book, for his own use; one for the Secretary of the Conference; and one for the members of the District and of the Conference.—(*Dis. p. 49.*)

8.—SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

10. Sermons on the Obligations of the Sabbath shall be annually preached on all the Circuits on the third Sabbath in the month of January.—(*Jour. Gen. Conf. p. 192.*)

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

Dearly Beloved Brethren;—

Grace, mercy and peace, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour.

We assure you of the very deep interest which we feel, in all which concerns your present and eternal welfare; and it is because of this solicitude that we now address you words of comfort and counsel. "For what is our hope, or joy or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye, in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming? For ye are our glory and our joy."

We devoutly render our thanks to the great Head of the Church, that we are able to bring to you glad tidings of great joy, concerning the prosperity of the work of God among us during the past year. Never in our history, as a Conference, have we been permitted to chronicle so large an accession of converts to our Zion. Never, we believe, has our Church been so "filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God," When we tell you, that, during the last year we have seen an aggregate of 2027 accept the "word of God, the gospel of our salvation," we are sure that "for this cause also" will you "joy and rejoice with us." We devoutly call upon you, beloved, to join us in humble acknowledgment of our deep unworthiness of so great favor from God; and in ascribing all the glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost!

But we desire to remind you, dear brethren, that, with increased blessing, comes enhanced responsibility, and especially do we urge upon you, to watch lovingly over these who are yet but babes in Christ, so that they faint not by the way. We fear that for the want of christian sympathy and oversight, hundreds and thousands of precious converts, have been lost to the Church and to God. And while the duty of "exhorting one another daily" is one from which no christian may claim exemption, we especially appeal to our dear and honored brethren, the Class Leaders of our Church, and who occupy a position, second only in responsibility, to that of the Pastor himself. We are not disposed to debate the question, whether the Class Meeting, can, in our economy, be dispensed with, it is

only a spirit of cold formality, which would permit such a discussion. When spiritual life becomes intensified, we have no fault found with the institution of the Class. But we remind you, that the Leader may very largely make or unmake his Class Meetings. Let him be a man of prayer, let his own soul be filled with the Savior's love; and he therefore be brought into genuine sympathy with his work, and we will not fear for his success. Dear brethren, "suffer the word of exhortation;" seek the baptism of the Holy Ghost; live close to Jesus; feel your responsibility; take largely upon yourselves the burden of souls; *visit your members* as often as you can, especially those who seem to be growing weary. Your own soul shall then feel the holy impetus which such solicitude for others ensures; and, thus laboring, you shall secure one of the greatest joys that can be yours this side of Heaven—the joy of proving that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

It is with intensest interest, that, while including within the circle of our solicitude our whole membership, we address ourselves especially to those, who, during the past year "have received Christ Jesus the Lord."

"God is our record, how greatly we long after you in the bonds of Jesus Christ; and this we pray, that your love may abound more and more, in knowledge and in all judgment, that ye may improve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ; being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God." The thought that any of you may "make shipwreck of faith and of a good conscience," causes us to shudder. We have rejoiced over you, as those who have found great spoil; and while we dare to feel that you are more needed in the church on earth, than in the church in Heaven, yet we would the rather rejoice to stand over your open graves, knowing that you had gone to Jesus, than to see you live to wander away from this fold. "Therefore dearly beloved and longed for, our joy and our crown, so stand fast in the Lord, dearly beloved." "Abstain from the very appearance of evil." Do not tamper with aught which would conflict with the development of your spiritual life. The price of conscious communion with God, is infinitely too dear to pay for" the revelling, banqueting and the abominable idolatry; wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you; who shall give account to him that is ready to judge both quick and dead." The church of your choice has ever given a certain sound with regard to "the taking of such diversions as cannot be used in the name

of the Lord Jesus." For this we have in past time been accused of being righteous overmuch; but now all the churches are drawing up to the same standard.

We urge upon you also to make diligent use of all those means of grace which are so indissolubly allied with spiritual growth. Strive much after private, heartfelt communion with God. "For-sake not the assembling of yourselves together as the manner of some is." See to it that your places in the class and prayer meetings, and in God's house, are not vacant for any reason that you would hesitate to offer at the bar of God. Rest, no not for an hour, without the conscious knowledge that you are the Lord's. *Study diligently the word of God.* Much of the inefficiency of christian labor and instability of religious life have their origin in a lack of adequate knowledge of the Holy Scriptures. Let Bible Classes be everywhere established, not for disputation, but for the honest, reverent searching of the Divine Word. Heed the call of Jesus, "Son go work to-day in my vineyard." Spiritual weakness is largely the result of spiritual idleness. Many doubts and fears which cannot be cured by the Bible and hymn-book might be destroyed by a hearty effort to do good to some one.

Amongst the various fields for christian usefulness which present themselves, we especially commend to our whole church, our sabbath school enterprise. We rejoice in over 400 conversions in connection with our sabbath schools during the past year. But we regret to find that out of 364 preaching places within the Conference of Nova Scotia, 205 are without schools for the religious training of our children. Let old schools be re-enforced with laborers, where they are needed. Let new schools be established wherever practicable. We hail the system of uniform lessons as it now obtains, and urge it upon you all. But we raise our voice clearly and strongly against the exclusion of our catechisms from any one of our schools, or any one class of scholars. Make every effort to keep up the sessions of the schools during the whole of the year.

We commend to your praying faith and zeal, the great work of the Temperance Reformation. As a church we protest earnestly against the crime of the liquor traffic. We rejoice in the quickening of the general conscience in this respect; and we hail every judicious effort put forth to suppress this vice.

It is coming to be a generally recognised principle that the religious press, is an indispensable adjunct of the christian church.

Therefore, if you would be intelligent and efficient Methodists, read our Conference Organ, and, as far as possible, our theological and biographical literature.

We rejoice exceedingly, brethren, in that more and more it is being evidenced that the great family of christians in heaven and earth is one. The din of old controversies is dying away; and where exclusive intolerance was wont to discern an enemy, a nearer approach to Jesus and each other discovers a brother. We deplore every cause which tends to disturb this important element in true christianity. But while urging upon you to avoid every occasion of discord with dear brethren of other denominations, we scarcely need remind you that there is every reason for devoted loyalty, on our part, to Methodism. In doctrine and polity, and the happy combination of every qualification necessary to ensure success, we believe that Methodism is second to no church organization now in existence on the earth. Wherever it is found to-day, it is proving gloriously that "God is in the midst of her." She may in a long course of years, become unfitted for the purposes of Providence, and in that case share the fate of all human systems; but she is healthful and vigorous yet, and if her spiritual life remain, who that loves God or goodness would wish to see her die? We revere her as a pure and efficient form of christianity. We feel the holy influence which still rests upon her assemblies, and subdues the people under her; a phenomenon which no human eloquence can produce; no "opposition of science, falsely so called" explain away. We reverently thank God for success unparalleled since apostolic time, and anew address ourselves to the contest. With nothing less of conquest will we be content, than that which will satisfy the heart of the Saviour. He loved the world and died to save it. Our hearts cry out "*The world for Jesus!*" We move onward in humble reliance upon the God of our salvation. "Watch, &c.; Stand fast in the faith; quit you like men; be strong." From the midst of the throne our glorious King calls to us. "Behold I come quickly, and my reward is with me, to give to every man according as his work shall be."

Amen! "Even so come Lord Jesus!" "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, be with you all. Amen.

**REPORT OF THE MISSIONARY AUXILIARY SOCIETY.
FOR THE
NOVA SCOTIA CONFERENCE.
1876.**

The Large Report of our Missionary Society, shortly to be published and to which all subscribers of four dollars and upwards are entitled, will be found to contain ample details of our whole Missionary operations. It is therefore not necessary that our Conference Report should be more than a brief abstract of recent Missionary intelligence, together with a condensed summary of our Missionary statistics.

The Society's sphere of operations embraces Missions in British Columbia, in the English speaking communities, as well as among the Indian tribes and the Chinese immigrants in that portion of our Dominion; in the Saskatchewan and Red River Districts and the Hudson's Bay Territory; the Indian Missions of Ontario and Quebec; Missions among the German populations in various parts of Ontario and the North West; French Missions in the Province of Quebec; the Domestic Missions belonging to the different Conferences of the United Church; and also the more recently established Missions in the far distant Empire of Japan.

At the Anniversary of the Society, held in Coburg, Ont., representing the entire Missionary Constituency of the Methodist Church of Canada, encouraging testimonies were given from the Missions of British Columbia, the North West, Japan, the Indian, French and German Missions, Newfoundland, and from various Domestic Missions, all exhibiting steady progress in the material and spiritual elements of Missionary Work.

The income of the Society for the past year was \$147,168,—the expenditure for the year \$185,268. This excess of expenditure above the income, amounting to \$38,000, arose from the exigencies of the Work in some of the older Missions, and the establishment, during the previous year, of new Missions, presenting most promising openings, and which were entered upon, it is believed, in obedience to the beckoning Hand of the Divine Head of the Church, and in the confidence that the missionary spirit of the supporters of the Society would sustain the Central Board in yielding to these imperative calls for the extension of the Work of God. The enlargement of the Society's

operations will now demand the strictest regard to economy in the expenditure for the present year; yet it is hoped that our whole church, notwithstanding the existing monetary pressure in commerce and trade, will with enlarged faith in Divine Providence, and increasing zeal in the cause of the world's evangelization, so advance at once in Missionary contributions, that the demand upon the income of the Society may not again be found in advance of the Society's receipts.

The following summary presents, in brief, the statistics of the Society:— Missions 383, Missionaries 392, Communicants on Mission Stations 30,070. Day schools among the Indians 31, with 31 teachers, Interpreters 25, Ministers supplying small bands of Indians 5, Native Assistants 13. Making a total of paid agents in our Missionary Department, of 466.

We now proceed to give a few items of intelligence from some of the Missions of the Society.

BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The Rev. W. C. Bryant writes from VanCouver's Island, as follows:—

We are hoping and praying for a general awakening by the Holy Spirit throughout the District. To the thousands of our praying people at home we would say "Pray for your scattered and isolated brethren who are watching and toiling in the outposts of British Columbia! And Oh, may there be showers of blessings." Of the work among the natives, he says, "The Indian Church and School I found in a comparatively feeble state, arising from the proximity of a reckless class of godless whites, who, through the illicit whiskey traffic, are effectually doing their demoralizing work. Mr. Green, whose heart is in the work, has taken charge of the Indian school, and the beneficial result is seen in a large increase of the scholars, and larger congregations on the Sabbath. I devote all the time I can spare to work among the Indians, having visited through their tents and held open air services in the heathen part of the camp. I was delighted in one instance with a little boy, whose name is Alfred Wesley, his parents having adopted Wesley as their family name. This lad, with tearful eyes and trembling utterance, told of his love for Jesus. The school teacher wishing to reprove some of his pupils for a violation of the Sabbath called upon Alfred, who at once addressed his school-fellows in the most earnest manner, and warned them of the consequences of their sins, and the tears coursed down his cheeks while he expostulated and told them of their wrong doings."

The condition of the Chinese immigrants has awakened the christian sympathies of some lovers of Jesus, and a day-school for their benefit has been established, with results that have fully met the expectations of its most sanguine friends. The attendance has been large, and a number give evidence of having received the truth as it is in Jesus. One of these Chinese converts wrote a letter in English to the gentleman who mainly had been instrumental in establishing the school, of which the following is an extract:

"You are very kind to send dear Miss Pollard to teach all China people learning English language; and I like very much to learn English language; and I very much obliged to you, sir, because you so good. I wish you come

I am glad to see you, sir, and all China people glad see you, too; and I am try learn little by little every day; and try to do best way I can; and try to be good every day, because I want be Christian; and I go Church, and pray God every day, because I love so well, and love everyone. I hope God make me useful man. I cannot write good letter now; I hope soon be better."

THE NORTH WEST.

We are quite unable, with the little space at our command, to present, as we would wish, the importance of our Missions in the Saskatchewan and Red River Districts. The letters of the Missionaries show that the work in their hands is rising in interest year by year. In these Missions we have 15 Missionaries, besides native assistants, and highly efficient day-school teachers, all earnestly intent upon the accomplishment of the trust committed to them by the Head of the Church, for the evangelization of the tribes and people looking to them for the instruction in God's own truth.

The hearts of our people throughout the Dominion was, during last winter, filled with sorrow, by the startling intelligence of the death of the veteran Missionary, the Rev. Geo. McDougall, a man who was in every way so admirably fitted for the post which he occupied, and upon whose sagacity and zeal, and knowledge of Indian habits, so much seemed to depend for the extension and consolidation of our Missions in that vast territory. We can only bow in humble submission to the sovereign will of the Great Master, whose servants we are, who cares so deeply for every interest of His Church, and who doeth all things well. One of the last letters written to the Secretaries by our beloved, and now sainted McDougall, contains the following:—

"Our prospects are brightening in this western land. Contrasting the past with the present we are greatly encouraged—a spirit of peace rests upon the tribes. The present policy of our Government, if faithfully carried out, will without doubt be eminently successful. The Mounted Police have done a good work, and we are grateful for their services, but at the same time we would most earnestly recommend the strictest vigilance on the part of the authorities. The small number of whites amidst the overwhelming number of aborigines, who but a short time ago received the harshest treatment at the hands of the pale-face, and who saw their country, which to them was a terrestrial paradise, changed by the whiskey trader into an infernal region, these men are not going to forget in a few short months all past grievances.

We are profoundly grateful for the comprehensive proclamation prohibiting the importation of intoxicating liquors into the North-West, and we sincerely hope there will be no modification of these laws. There are those in this country who have recommended that canteens should be opened at each Fort, and that under certain restrictions white men should be allowed the use of intoxicating drinks; nothing could be more disastrous to the best interests of this country than to allow the sale of intoxicating liquors at Government establishments. Since last August I have visited almost every Indian camp between Manitoba and the Rocky Mountains, and never missed an opportu-

ity of conversing with the chiefs on the subject of temperance, and their reply has invariably been, "We are grateful to the 'Great Chief' for prohibiting his people from bringing fire-water into our camps. We love the fire-water. When we see it we want to drink it, and then all kinds of troubles come upon us. When we do not see it we do not think about it, and we all know we are better without it."

JAPAN.

Not quite three years have elapsed since our Mission in the Japanese Empire was established, by the appointment to that far off land, as our first Missionaries there, of the Rev. G. Cochran, and the Rev. Dr. McDonald. The openings of providence favouring the labours of these servants of the Lord, and their encouraging success, so soon granted them by the blessing of the Most High, have been truly marvellous. A loud and earnest call reaches the Church for additional labourers for that interesting field, and two excellent brethren, by their scholarship, piety and experience, admirably adapted to that work, have been appointed as a reinforcement to the infant Mission, the Rev. Chas. S. Eby, A. M., and the Rev. Geo. M. Meacham, A. M. Messrs. Cochran and Eby are stationed at Teddo, Dr. McDonald at Shidzuoka, and W. Meacham at Numadza.

The correspondence of the brethren in that Mission is of thrilling interest; but we must content ourselves with giving an extract of a letter received quite recently from Bro. Cochran, the Chairman of the District. He says:—

Since last writing, I have baptized six more persons in Yedo—four young men and two women (the wife and daughter of Mr K. J. Nakamura). Three of the young men are students—undergraduates in the Imperial College. They are good English scholars, which adds greatly to my opportunity of giving them religious instructions, as they can make use of English books.

About three months ago we organized our Church, and appointed Mr K. J. Nakamura leader, and his son steward. They enter into the spirit of class-meeting exercise quite readily, and speak and pray with freedom and propriety.

NATIVE PREACHERS.

I have a regular Sabbath afternoon, service in my own house, conducted wholly in the native tongue; and there are seven of the natives who prepare short discourses, under my supervision, which they deliver at this service, each taking a Sabbath in turn. By the help of the members inviting their friends and acquaintances we get quite a large number of people who listen with great attention to the preaching of the word. We are not permitted yet to go out into the streets to proclaim the glad tidings; but we can use our own hired house for this purpose "no man forbidding us."

One of the young men whom I baptised over a year ago—Mr. Asagawa—is now devoting all his time to the study of the Bible and theology. He lives near me and comes in several times a week for instructions; nor does he spend all his time in study merely; he invites the people to his private room and there he preaches the gospel to them every evening. He is a good Japanese and Chinese scholar and knows enough of English to make use of

English text-books. But the best of all is, his soul seems to be aflame with the one desire to make known to his fellow-countrymen the truth of the gospel which has saved himself. I am not sure but he may yet become one of our best native evangelists. I am giving him suitable instructions with this end in view.

THE SABBATH IN JAPAN.

One of the difficulties of Missionary work here has been that there is no Sabbath; and the official classes have been unable, in many instances, to attend the services, on account of public duties from which they could procure no release. Some have been deterred from making a profession of faith in Christ, as it would involve the obligation to keep the seventh day holy. In some instances this would involve loss of employment and of the means of livelihood. But Providence has removed this obstacle out of the way sooner than we expected. By Government Proclamation, the public holidays have been abolished, and the first day of the week appointed as a day of rest; and all public offices closed on Sunday.

NEWFOUNDLAND.

Of our Mission in Newfoundland no one is more competent to express a judgment than the lay gentleman who represented that Island at the Anniversary of the Society; of whose address on that occasion the following mention is made in the Missionary Notices:—

The Hon. J. J. Rogerson, Finance Minister of Newfoundland, moved the adoption of the report. Mr. Rogerson furnished most interesting information respecting the mission work which Methodism had accomplished on his island. Twenty years ago the cause was small and feeble, and the opposition strong and influential. But all this is now passed. The work is advancing beyond expectation. Enemies have turned into friends. In the last four years the body had increased thirty-five per cent. During the year just closed 600 members had been added to the Church, and 1,200 had been received on trial, whilst some twenty labourers had been sent out in the vineyard. Mr. Rogerson said his island home was not as wealthy as the Goshen of Western Canada, but the little handful in that fishermen's isle, depending upon the varied fortunes of their precarious calling, had contributed \$5,000 to aid the Mission cause. Newfoundland showed the true Missionary spirit, for in their poverty the people were reaching in desire and prayer and effort towards the population of Asia, in China, and Japan. The speaker's remarks were repeatedly interrupted by the cheers of the audience.

DOMESTIC MISSIONS OF OUR OWN CONFERENCE.

For information respecting the state of the Work of God in Nova Scotia, we refer to the abstract of the spiritual report, as given in the Minutes of our Conference. We are happy in being able to state that the income of our local Auxiliary Society is nearly \$500 in advance of that of the previous year. This fact, considering the existing depression of trade, and the reduction of the grant to our Mission, and the consequent extra efforts of the circuits to raise the salaries of their ministers, is a highly gratifying evidence of the hold which the cause of Missions has upon the hearts of our people.

Only let the Church consecrate her choicest—the firstlings of the flock, the first-fruits of the increase, the first-born or the best-beloved of her children—and Heaven will honor the spirit of sacrifice, and respond to it in wealthier blessing and in diviner displays of power. Then shall the increase be rapid as well as sure. "The plowman shall overtake the reaper, and the treader of grapes him that soweth seed." "He shall finish the work, and cut it short in righteousness;" and in the ears of many a tired watcher, who has grown weary in watching the face of the weather and of the fields, shall sound the glad summons which inspires the reapers for their toil: "Thrust ye in the sickle, for the harvest of the earth is ripe."

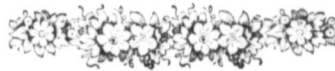

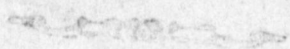

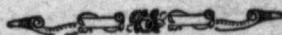
