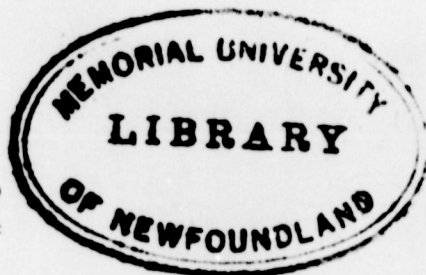

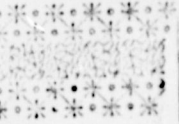

MINUTES OF THE
NEWFOUNDLAND CONFERENCE

THE METHODIST CHURCH
HELD IN CARBONEAR.

The SEVENTEENTH SESSION of the Newfoundland Conference was opened in Carbonear Church, on Wednesday, June 27th, 1900, at 9.30 a.m., the President, Rev. R. W. Freeman, in the chair.

After singing hymn 746, the Secretary read St. John 15 chap., and the Rev. Levi Curtis, M.A., and Hon. J. J. Rogerson engaged in prayer.

QUESTION XXIV.—What are the Reports of the several Conference Committees?

REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

The Conference schedules show that we have now 23 Leagues, with 849 active members, and 429 associate, making a total of 1378.

We are sorry to note that there has been a serious falling off in the Twillingate District. They have reported five leagues less, and a loss of 211 members.

On motion it was resolved that the attention of the Conference be called to this serious falling off in the Twillingate District.

On motion it was resolved that we recommend Conference to urge upon all superintendents the great need of introducing Epworth League work on all our circuits and missions, believing, as we do, that the hope of our church rests largely in the proper mental and spiritual cultivation of our young people.

We are glad to notice that there has been considerable progress made by the Leagues in the matter of finance, the total amount raised being \$869, almost double of what was raised last year.

Resolved that the Conference be asked to make arrangements for the holding of a Conference Epworth League Convention at some suitable time during the coming year in the city of St. John's; and that a committee be appointed to make and carry out these necessary arrangements.

SUPERNUMERARY FUND.

Reviewing the returns from the Circuits and Missions, your committee is gratified to observe the substantial increase of upwards of \$193 in the ordinary income of the fund, and that each district has contributed towards this increase. We would still, in view of the heavy deficiencies of the Supernumerary Ministers and Widows (amounting this year to 30 per cent. of their just claims) urge that strenuous efforts be made by the observance of disciplinary provisions, and other special means to increase the annual income that all claims may be paid in full.

We further strongly recommend that each Circuit and Mission shall contribute a minimum sum of 2 per cent. of the amount reported in the minutes of Conference for the previous year as having been raised for Ministerial support, and the following connexional funds, viz., Missionary, Supernumerary, Educational, Contingent, General Conference, Union Church Relief, S. S. Aid, Sustentation, Annual Conference, Temperance, General Epworth League and Children's Fund.

The amount due from each Circuit and Mission to be estimated by the Financial Secretary and reported by them to the Superintendent Ministers at, or immediately after the Financial district meetings each year.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

4.—The income of the Fund shall be derived,

(a) From subscriptions, donations, and collections taken up annually on all our Circuits and Missions. It shall be binding on each Minister and Probationer in charge of a Circuit or Mission to make an annual collection for this Fund, at such time as may be deemed most favorable.

5.—The management of the Fund shall be placed in the hands of a Committee consisting of one minister and one layman for each District; the Ministerial members to be elected at the Annual District Meeting, and the lay members appointed by the Conference.

The President of the Conference shall be *ex officio* Chairman of the Committee. In his absence the Committee shall elect a chairman *pro tem.*; also, a Secretary and Treasurer.

6.—The Committee shall present a report of its proceedings to each Annual Conference, with all its accounts duly audited.

CHURCH PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

Your Committee recommends:

1.—That the request of Trustees of Harbor Grace Church property, "To sell a portion of land in the rear of Mr. Valentine Webber's property for a nominal sum be granted.

2.—That permission be granted to sell the Noad Street property.

3.—That the Chairman of St. John's District be directed to furnish the Missionary, stationed on Labrador for the summer months, the necessary forms and instructions for the transfer of the Church built at Batteaux by Capt. La Messurier to the Newfoundland Conference of the Methodist Church.

4.—That this Conference suitably express to Capt. LeMessurier its high appreciation of his generous gift.

5.—That the Missionary stationed at Labrador for the summer months, be instructed to enquire into the condition and ownership of the Church at Indian Tickle and elsewhere, and report to the Chairman of St. John's District forthwith.

6.—That the Superintendent of each Circuit and Mission be instructed to carefully enquire into what property is held by us as a Church and report the same at the next District meeting.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

BELOVED BREEHLEN,—

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." It is with feelings of profound thankfulness we avail ourselves of the opportunity, by this our Annual Assembly, of sending you our greeting, with words of counsel and of cheer. We do this not merely as

ference than any other movement of the century. We feel we must express our high appreciation of your spirit and generosity. The manner in which you have responded to the call of the Church to fit and prepare her more fully and perfectly for the service of God and humanity, fills our hearts with profoundest gratitude, and leads us to look towards the coming century with a brighter hope, a larger confidence, and to anticipate such manifestations of the Divine Presence and Power as neither we nor our fathers ever realised. The century now closing is certainly a notable one, the most notable that the world has seen since the dawn of the first Century of the Christian Era; yea the most remarkable century in the world's history. No preceding century ever saw such changes, such progress in all the branches of civilization and evangelization as the Nineteenth Century has seen. The world has simply been transformed, and in no particular has the advance been more marked than in the uplifting of humanity to a higher and holier plane of life. The work of the Christian Church, and of our Methodism in particular, stands forth most conspicuously among the records of the greatest achievements of this the greatest century. Of this we make no special boast, but sincerely thank God and take courage.

Standing on the vantage ground of the closing year of the closing century with unbounded faith in God and the power of the Old Gospel of which the noble Paul was "not ashamed," we can say with the consecrated Judson "*Our prospects are as bright as the promises of God.*" The Twentieth Century will open upon our world with assurances of victory for Christ and His Church such as never characterised the beginning of any preceding century. In the FINANCIAL success of the Twentieth Century Thanksgiving Fund we rejoice, but in the SPIRITUAL success which has already begun, and which will ultimately crown the monetary, we rejoice more abundantly. The ONE MILLION DOLLARS laid on the Altar of God will, we believe, be followed, and that speedily, by a MILLION SOULS and MORE being born into the Kingdom of God. For this we must live, and labour and love.

Let us ever remember that nothing can take the place of personal piety. "Only let your manner of life be worthy of the Gospel of Christ." The lip can never take the place of the life in the service of Christ. Not that we undervalue the testimony of the lip—by all means speak for Jesus—the lip has its legitimate place in His service as well as the life, but be sure that your life always warrants the words of your lips. We cannot emphasize too strongly the importance of holy living in the individual life. Where the pulpit has failed to reach men by the preaching of the word, the pew has succeeded by a consistent, conscientious christian life. Not that the pew can ever take the place of the life, each has its proper sphere, but the exhibition of exalted piety, seen and felt in the personal, practical holiness of the individual christian, nothing can withstand. All cannot occupy the pulpit and preach the word, but all can fill the sphere of life; every man, no matter what his earthly position, high or low, rich or poor, learned or unlearned, can live the christian life, keep himself unspotted from the world, and walk even as Christ walked.

To this end, Beloved, we exhort you to maintain your membership with the Church of Christ. Learn to set a sacred value upon your membership. Remember that the privilege of being united with the Visible Church, which is the Mystical Body of Christ, stands next to your spiritual union with Himself. You cannot value too highly the privilege of church membership; neither can you put too high an estimate upon the advantages of fellowship with the people of God by a faithful adherence to the Means of Grace, both public and private. "They that feared the Lord spake often one to another, and the Lord harkened, and heard it; and a Book of Remembrance was written before Him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon His name. And they shall be mine, saith the Lord of Hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spared his own son that serveth him." Never let it be said of you as it was said of the people of old, "Ye are gone away from mine ordinances and have not kept them." The closet, the Family Altar, the Reading of the Scriptures, the class meeting, the prayer meeting, the Lord's Supper, the preaching of the Word, cannot be neglected without spiritual loss. The soul no more than the body can live without its daily food. "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." If your spiritual life is to be healthy and vigorous then you must avail yourselves of the means of Grace. No branch of the Christian Church can boast of a more perfect equipment, in this particular, for the perfecting of christian life, character and usefulness than the Methodist Church, which it is your high honour to belong.

" Early in the Temple met,
 Let us still our Saviour greet;
 Nightly to the Mount repair,
 Join our praying Pattern there.
 There by wrestling faith obtain
 Power to work for God again,
 Power His image to retrieve,
 Power, like Thee, our Lord, to live."

In thus exhorting you to avail yourselves of the means of Grace. Means which, under God, have made Methodism what it now is, we would also remind you that on your faithfulness largely depends the success which shall characterise the future of our Heaven-honoured Methodism. It is not more machinery that we want, but more POWER to use, and to *rightly* use, what we already have. Truly, "the lines have fallen to us in pleasant places and we have a goodly heritage." If our pulpits, our Sunday Schools, Epworth Leagues, Class Meetings and Prayer Meetings were only supported by the HOME with its Family Altar, and daily fellowship in the Word of God and Prayer, then the Word of the Lord

would speedily appear unto His servants and His glory unto their children. Then indeed and of a truth "the Beauty of the Lord our God would be upon us, and the work of our hands established upon us—yea the work of our hands established for ever."

For the sake of Jesus, "who, though He was rich yet for your sakes, became poor, that ye through His poverty, might be rich," we counsel you to consecrate yourselves, your individual life, to Him and to His service. Consecrate your family life to Him and thus give proof of your own fidelity and faith by commanding your children and your household after you, that they may keep the way of the Lord. Your children are His. He claims them; and you by presenting your children for Baptism have acknowledged that claim and pledged yourselves to respect that claim. Therefore, by the grace which He so freely gives, train them from tenderest infancy as His, and for Him. Your servants are His, and by Him are providentially entrusted to your care. Watch over them in love, knowing that for them you must give account to your Master in Heaven. Your substance consecrate, with a consecration equally sincere and comprehensive. All that you have and are belongs to Him; therefore, whatever your employment, whatever your relationships, you are to serve the Lord Christ, you are to use all for His glory. If the 11,000 members of this Conference will thus pass out of the old into the new Century, how glorious will be the first page of the Twentieth Century Volume of our history. God grant unto those of you, who shall be permitted to pass over the line into the New Century, grace to write a page worthy of your exalted privilege.

Another source from which we would counsel you to seek strength for your life's work is the Library. Every member of the Methodist Church should be a reader, and a reader of Methodist Literature. The lack in this respect is one of the causes of our weakness and failure. No section of the Christian Church provides a purer literature than our own. The Methodist Book Rooms are able not only to supply the demand as to quantity, but also as to quality—besides our own church papers and periodicals, which ought to be in every Methodist home, compare favourably with the best of other churches, and are far in advance of many others that find their way into many Methodist homes. To those who cannot afford to subscribe to *The Wesleyan*, *The Christian Guardian* or *The Magazine*, we recommend our own Conference paper, *The Monthly Greeting*, always full of interesting local news and good general reading matter. Suppose you have to make some sacrifice elsewhere be sure and have one of our own papers in your home.

There is one other matter we must bring before you, and though it comes last in our address yet it is by no means the least, namely, OUR EDUCATIONAL WORK. A work that deserves and demands your deepest sympathy and your strongest support. From the beginning of our history education has been kept ever to the front, and as the years have come and gone more and more prominence has been given to this important department of our work. As a Conference we are purposed to make the best possible use of our educational institutions and to raise them to the highest point of efficiency. From the College with its able staff of

teachers, its wisely directed graded teaching, its brighter future, its crowned triumphs, its examination to arouse every effort, its push forward of both church and

TEMPERANCE.

1.—This Committee recommends that every minister in charge of a Circuit or Mission be requested to preach Temperance sermons, and that the third Sunday in December be observed as Temperance Sunday. Due notice thereof to be given to our people.

2.—We strongly recommend that lessons on the injurious effects of Alcohol and Tobacco be given in our schools, and request our school Boards to give special attention to this matter.

3.—Believing that the use of Tobacco in every form is injurious; we earnestly recommend that every effort be made by our people to discountenance its use and sale.

4.—Recognizing the great influence of women in temperance reform, and the noble work being done by the Women's Christian Temperance Union, we respectfully urge upon the women of our church throughout the country the importance of banding together for the furtherance of the cause we all have so much at heart; and that our ministers be requested to render renewed efforts along their lines.

5.—We recommend that a page of the *Monthly Greeting* be continued in the interest of temperance work.

6.—The Committee, appreciating the beneficial results which have accrued from the adoption and enforcement of local option on many of our circuits and missions, would urge upon our ministers and people the necessity of unceasing agitation for total prohibition.

7.—We advise the appointment of the members of this committee residing in St. John's, with the Secretary of Conference, to be a standing committee, to guard and promote the interests of the Temperance reform.

METHODIST COLLEGE

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF GOVERNORS FOR THE YEAR
ENDING JUNE 30, 1900.

In reviewing the history of the Collège for the past year we are glad to find that it still maintains the proud position it has won in the front rank of our educational institutions.

The work done, so far as it may be judged by the result of the examinations, must be eminently satisfactory to the friends of education and to all who are interested directly or indirectly in the welfare of the Collège. During the year 440 pupils have been in attendance.

In the examinations for London Matriculation, there were two candidates, Miss James and Miss Woods, both of whom passed.

In the Associate grade we had five passes, including 2nd place and prize, besides 11 first places and prizes in special subjects out of 19. The only girl that passed this grade was a Collège girl. In the Intermediate grade we had 52 passes, four times as many as any other school, and won the first, second and fourth places also. In this Grade 160 honors and nine prizes and scholarships were also won. In the Preliminary Grade were 25 passes with second place and scholarship and five special prizes. In the Primary Grade 28 passed. This is only a qualifying examination for young pupils.

In all 112 passed the various examinations and it is also noteworthy that all outport scholarships were won by Methodist Schools whose teachers were old college pupils.

We may also mention in passing that in Athletic exercises the boys of the Collège have competed successfully with those of other institutions. In Cricket they won the Championship and in Football the Championship and cup, and the second place in Hockey. Regular drill has been maintained during the year.

The staff of teachers numbers 16. Some changes have occurred—Miss Forbes taking the place of Miss Simpson, who retired last year, and Miss M. Dawe that of Madame Therouin, who resigned her position in December. The sad decease of Madame Therouin in the following April was deeply felt by the members of this Board, and they have put on record their appreciation of her services and devotion to duty during her long connection with the Collège.

The retirement of Miss Allison at the end of this year is much to be regretted in the interests of the Collège. For the past six years the success which has so eminently attended the education of the senior female pupils is largely to be attributed to her careful and painstaking training, and we believe that the influence of her christian character upon the lives of these pupils will bear richer fruit in the years to come. She has the sincere congratulations of the Board on her approaching marriage and their best wishes for her future happiness.

Rev. M. Fenwick reports well of the Home for the year gone, No contagious disease has made its appearance and the moral and spiritual tone of the Home is also healthy. Discipline has been well observed and

INSTRUCTIONS TO EXAMINERS.

(1) No paper in the candidate's course shall be set for more than one hour.

(2) All papers are to be marked according to an estimate of the value of answers required; but the aggregate must reach 100, allowing 10 for writing, spelling, grammar, and style.

(3) Each examiner shall state on his paper the time allowed for writing.

(4) Five copies of each paper shall be prepared by the examiners (one for each District) and sent to Rev. Jabez Hill not later than December 31, 1900.

N.B.—Where there is more than one candidate, or more than one Probationer of the same year, the person in charge of the examination centre shall be held responsible for providing sufficient copies of the papers sent to him (excepting Greek).

(5) All subjects omitted by probationers must be taken up before ordination.

(6) All papers, when examined, shall be returned to the secretary, Rev. Jabez Hill.

(7) A statement of the marks gained by each probationer and candidate shall be given him signed by the secretary and shall be his certificate of standing.
