If their demand is rejected they may, and doubtless will, resort to the same methods which the coal miners have so successfully employed, and, in all probability, with a similar result. The general adoption of the principle of the minimum wage, the demand for which has been encouraged by the action of the Asquith Government with respect to the coal miners, necessarily involves the tariff protection of British industries. 


