Mr. Coles, of devolving the burdens on succeeding generations, had been illustrated by the State of Pennaylvania, where the succeeding generations repudiated the obligations contracted by their ascentors, and by so doing, degraded the credit and character of the State.

Mr. Coorus.—Taxation for roads, if properly administered, was not objectionable. The money raised for each purpose was expended in the country, and the people get the benefit of the expenditure and of improved roads. In countries where there was little or no taxation, there was little or no improvement. He was opposed to an increase of the Taxis, and advocated the principle of an income tax as being the most equitable mode of providing for the public wants.
