BOSTON LETTERS.

Perhaps your readers would like to hear now and then from your news of Boston. Numbers of Nova Scotians are here; a much larger number than any would suppose who are here by hundreds and thousands; Boston and its suburbs are full of them in every trade and profession, in manufacturing establishments, in the banks, markets and railroads. The professional men from old Nova Scotia that I have met are not a few; I will try and mention some of the notable cases from time to time, and our people are appreciative of their services. Often employers have spoken of their faithfulness and ability. I do not write this as an encouragement to those to come here, for a man without some trade or profession, may find it hard to get a start. Several of his class, however, who find it almost impossible to get work; but a person with a trade or a fair education is all right. The amount of money received here by a letter.
