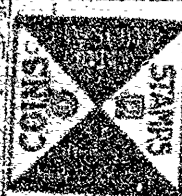

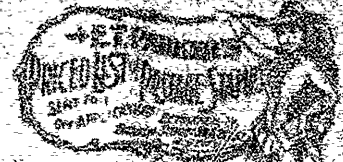

SEVENTH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE CANADIAN PHILATELIC ASSOCIATION.

The Seventh Annual Convention was held according to notice at the Queen's Hotel, Montreal on Sept. 8th, 1894.

About 30 members were represented either in person or by proxy.

The following were present in person: A. E. Labelle, W. Patterson, P. Sicotte, Dr. Burgess, all of Montreal and H. F. Ketcheson, Belleville, Ont.

The Convention was called to order at 7.30 p.m. when a letter was read from President Wurtelle stating his inability to be present owing to the death of a near relative. Mr. A. E. Labelle was then chosen chairman and H. F. Ketcheson Secretary. On motion the minutes of the last annual meeting were taken as read.

The necessary committees were then appointed and report of officers called for. The report of the President was then read by the Secretary and is as follows:

PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT.

number suspended for the non-payment of dues, the net balance stands to the credit of the increase. This in view of the above can be taken as most favourable and doubtless indicates that we can look forward to better results in the twelve months. It may not be out of order to remark here, that it is earnestly hoped and justly expected that the individual members will make an effort to secure new members and thereby show their interest in the Association in a substantial manner.

With regard to the change made in the Official Organ, which became necessary in view of the suspension of the "Canadian Journal of Philately" you are fully conversant with the offer made by Mr. H. F. Ketcheson and accepted by the Officers of the Association whereby the reports have appeared in the "Dominion Philatelist" free of charge to the Association. To the credit of this gentleman it may be pointed out that when the Postal Authorities decided to place a charge against the same in the way for payment for mailing purposes, he continued to issue his paper and at a personal loss. On behalf of the Association the Officers sent an application to the Post Master General with a view of having the charge removed but which they were unable to obtain.

The past year has clearly demonstrated the fact that we have every reason to congratulate ourselves upon the efficient work performed by the Secretary-Treasurer and the Exchange Superintendent, Messrs. T. S. Clark of Belleville and C. C. Morency of Quebec, respectively, for the able manner in which they have conducted the work devolving upon their departments. To these gentlemen is due the success of the past year and a little consideration will serve to establish the fact that their work has been very difficult, particularly as individual members have not given sufficient attention to following the rules and regulations of the Association.

The matter of an Exchange with the Birmingham Society has been carefully gone into and will probably in the near future prove a benefit to the members. In this connection we are indebted to Mr. A. A. Bartlett, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., who was instrumental in getting the two societies into closer relations. It now remains with the members to show their appreciation of this arrangement by a participation in this exchange which is placed in the hands of Mr. T. S. Clark and is separate from our regular exchange.

The report of the Secretary-Treasurer was then read as follows :

SECRETARY TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT.

To the Members of the Canadian Philatelic Association :

GENTLEMEN,—In greeting you again at the Annual Convention I am glad to be able to report progress all along the line. The year has not been without its discouragements, but the affairs of the Society are more hopeful than they have been for some years past.

Referring to the financial statement we have paid off in full the creditors of Mr. Ketcheson's Exchange Dept. and have paid a dividend of 60% on outstanding claims in Grenny's Exchange Dept., and if all goes well we hope to meet you next year with a clean sheet so far as the Exchange Dept. is concerned. The bill for the Official Organ to July 1892 has been reduced by \$13, and the Sec.-Treas. is patiently awaiting a substantial token of appreciation of his arduous labours on behalf of the Association for the past two years.

The membership roll is in a more healthy state than last year, and I have had one or two requests for blank applications which are not yet completed. May I ask the present members to lend a hand. Some of the larger philatelic centres in Canada, notably Toronto and Halifax, are very feebly represented. I regret that it was found necessary to expel one member, Mr. H. A. Fowler, who resorted to very questionable methods to "raise the wind," and endangered the good name of the Association. Another member of the Society, George Warren, has

MR. DAVID COHN in the pages of the *Illustrirte Briefmarken Journal* has been giving some new information with regard to the early issues of the Argentine Confederation stamps. The first issue it will be remembered has small figures of value, while the second has large figures (besides other less striking differences of type). The first or 1858 set consists of a 5 c., 10 c., and 15c., but of the second or 1861 set only a 5 c. has hitherto been recognised, although stamps of the two higher values of this type are also known, but have always been considered as counterfeit, made by adapting and altering the 5 c. stamp. It now appears (though on what authority it is not stated) that these higher values were actually prepared by the government, and held in stock until the corresponding values of the 1858 set were exhausted, but that, owing to the fact that an issue for Argentine Republic was brought out in 1862, the stamps in question never came into use. If this is really the case they must be classed as "stamps prepared but never issued." But we think more light on the subject is required before these statements can be received as final.—*Stamp News*.

FROM the *Montevideo Times* we have some more information about the new issue of Uruguay which we chronicle elsewhere. The stamps, as many collectors are aware, are produced by Messrs. Waterlow and Sons—the new 1 centavo was brought out on the 15th May last, and the other values followed. It may be interesting to put on record the numbers of each value sent out.

Although the two highest values will be eagerly sought after, and probably very few destroyed after use, even if every stamp were carefully saved, the lot would not go far among the world's collectors. Of course this is presuming that a second edition indistinguishable from the first does not appear.—*Stamp News*.

It is our painful duty at once to warn all collectors and dealers against what we consider the cleverest forgery, or rather counterfeit, which has ever been imposed on the philatelic public. It is the Spanish 12 curatos of 1865, with blue frame and rose centre, *with the centre reversed*. The method of procedure is to scrape out the head from an ordinary specimen, and to replace it with another head from another specimen, which has also been reduced in thickness, so that the combined thickness of the stamp and the inserted head are if anything together *less* than the thickness of the normal stamp. The joining is so skilfully done, and the gun so thin, that nothing can be seen even under an ordinary magnifying power. Suspicion is of course first allayed by the *back* of the stamp being intact, as all the work is done on the front. Nothing less than boiling water will separate the pieces. These stamps come from Paris.—*Stamp News*.

At a recent meeting of The Philatelic Society of London, England, a number of various stamps sent for opinions were passed round. Amongst these were a ½d. Dominica on half of the 1d. stamp (watermark Crown and CA), and a copy of the 1s. engraved Nevis stamp, perforated 13, both forwarded by the Scott Stamp and Coin Company, Limited. In regard to the first-mentioned stamp, the general opinion was that the surcharge was forged, the Crown and CA paper not having come into use some years after the ½d. surcharged stamp was issued. The members present were also of opinion that there was not sufficient evidence to show that the Nevis stamp was ever issued in the state in which it was shown.

A NEW set of Brazilian stamps will shortly be issued. Some novel and pretty designs are promised.

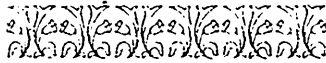
HOOPER NOW A TAILOR.
