



CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

With April at hand, the lumber trade

may be expected to show signs of the activity resulting from the beginning of outdoor operations. This has been the case during the past week in a slight degree only, as in the northern sections of the province winter is still hanging on. The advent of warm spring weather will stimulate building. Architects have plans under way for numerous buildings to be erected in the cities, while in rural districts the usual volume of building is contemplated. The stock of lumber held by retail dealers is not large, and as their resources are drawn upon, they will be compelled to replenish their supply. Locally, the outlook is satisfactory, and judging from inquiries now coming in from the Eastern States, considerable stock will find an outlet there. The firmness which has characterized shingles and lath has been maintained, with prospects of higher prices before the new stock is available. Hardwoods are still dull. Ottawa dealers are paying \$14 for mill run maple and birch, and \$14.50 for basswood f.o.b. cars. Hemlock is worth from \$8.50 to \$10, the latter for 2 inch merchantable.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The timber market at Quebec is quiet and prices unchanged. The local demand for timber at Montreal is being stimulated by the harbor improvements, while if the proposed elevators are proceeded with a considerable quantity of timber will be required. Quebec spruce is held at firm prices, but there is a weaker tone in respect to the Maritime Province production. Mr. R. A. Estey, of Fredericton, recently sold 3,000,000 feet of deals at \$10.75 per thousand, while one year ago Sti was obtained for specifications of poorer quality. The situation is regarded as very uncertain. Operations in the woods have practically closed, and interest is now ceetred in the drives, which will commence very shortly.

Building operations in Winnipeg and throughout Manitoba and the Territories have commenced on a more active scale, and consequently dealers report an improvement in the demand for lumber. Manufacturiers and wholesale dealers are receiving enquiries from retailers to an extent that indicates that the stocks of the latter are badly in need of being replenished. The city of Winnipeg is inviting tenders up to April 18th for the annual supply of lumber. British Columbia manufacturers are shipping quite largely to eastern points, and report a satisfactory volume of business.

UNITED STATES.

A feature of the United States lumber market is the extraordinary demand in some districts for doors and mill work. At Chicago several advances in the price of this class of stock have recently been made, but without having any appreciable influence in reducing the volume of trade. At North Tonawanda and Buffalo the sash, door and blind business is in a healthier condition than it has been for some time, and dealers report that they have been asked to figure on material for a large number of buildings to be built this year. The buying of lumber during the past week has been of moderate volume. Sales made by manufacturers have been at high prices, and a slight stiffening in the upper grades is reported. At Buffalo and other wholesale points there is a good demand for the better grades, but the poorer qualities are somewhat inactive, and prices are being cut in some instances about one dollar per thousand. No. t barn boards in 12 inch widths are selling in Saginaw at \$23, and No. 2, 10 inches wide, at \$18, as against \$24 and \$19 one month ago. Box lumber is also quoted a little lower.

Hemlock lumber is particularly strong. In New York the base price is \$15, and in Buffalo \$13, but it is expected that higher prices will rule before many weeks. In hardwoods the movement is not heavy. Basswood, which has been very strong for some time, is reported to be a little weaker on account of an unexpected supply of low grade stock offering, which has induced box-makers to experiment with the use of shipping and mill culls for their purposes. Less hardwood is expected to be shipped east from Michigan this year than usual. Lath are not offered freely. No. 1 white pine are held at \$3 at Menomince, and the prospects are for a strong market on lath throughout the season.

GREAT BRITAIN.

The unsettled condition of the British timber market has been further intensified by the failure of a firm of merchants in London, by which a large number of brokers and agents were affected. It is now extremely difficult to effect sales, and the prediction is heard that the market is on the verge of a serious break. This is not the general opinion, however That more business has not taken place is due to the firm position taken by shippers, who refuse to concede anything in the way of lower prices. Canadian goods have, under the circumstances, continued remarkably strong, and sales in pine and spruce are being made at high prices. The predicted fall in spruce, as a result of the large stock at some of the leading ports, has not taken place. Quebec spruce has maintained its value at about the opening prices of last year. There is no apprehension entertained by holders of these dea's, except perhaps as regards 2 inch and 21/2 inch stocks, which are moving rather slowly. The freight market is easier, with much less demand for vessels than was the case twelve months ago.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

At Minneapolis No. 1 white pine lath is quoted at \$3.50 and mixed at \$3.

R. J. Wilson has purchased the stock of lumber from T. A. Patrick, of Elgin, Man. The barque Passeportout is loading lumber at Barnet, B. C., for Southern California.

Hemlock lath is selling in Pittsburg at \$2.75 per thousand, a sharp advance over usual quotations.

The Rat Portage Lumber Company, of Rat Portage, Ont., are said to have taken out 50,000,000 feet of logs this season.

The Newville Lumber Company, of Newville, N. S., have taken out 72,000 logs during the past winter, as well as a quantity of spars, piling, and pit timber.

S. P. Benjamin, of Wolfville, N. S., has secured a large cut of logs this winter. He had nine camps on the headwaters of the Avon river, the total cut being 12,000,ooo feet.

George F Jackson, of Buffalo, has secured a contract to deliver a stock of about 1,500,000 feet of hemlock to parties in Montreal as soon as the lakes shall open. The stock is mostly 12 x 12 stuff, and comes from Alpena and other Lake Huron ports of Michigan.

The American Lumberman reports the sale by a Wisconsin mill of five car loads of Nos. 1 and 2 Norway piece stuff, to be delivered via the Canadian Pacific in Northern Ontario.

Flm timber, ex Florida, from Quebec, was recently sold by auction in London at the following prices: 34 pcs. 14-25 ft. 10-13 in., 50s per load of 50 cubic feet; 10 pcs. 13-20 ft. 13-22 in., 60s; 31 pcs. 11-24ft. t0-20 in., 52s 6d.

Poupore & Malone have purchased 12,-000,000 feet of hemlock, spruce and pine timber for the construction of the new pier to be crected of Maisonneuve. In addition, they have on hand 1,000,000 feet of oak which will also be used for the work.

The company handled all kinds of house building material, interior fittings, etc., and among the creditors are a number of lumber importers. The liabilities are stated to be £50,000, and the assets about £40,-000. The firm of Thornham, Reynoldson & Company, of Hull, are also said to have made an assignment, with asset: exceeding liabilities by about £10,000.





The mill owners and jobbers in and about Ottawa are making preparations for a busy season. Navigation will be open on the Ottawa within three weeks, and on the Rideau canal by May 1st. Shioping will commence early on these waters, the English market especially requiring attention

The past winter was a quiet one in local lumber circles. There has been little or no change in prices, which are firm and promise to continue so. Much of the stock to be cut in the mills in the Ottawa Valley and along the river during the coming season, has already been placed, part of it on the English market. In only one line is an over-production likely, viz., in spruce. During the long season on the limits, a greater amount of spruce than usual was cut. If this is all taken out a slump in prices would not be unlooked for. White and red pine, on the contrary, promise an advance in price, if change there must be. The foreign and local de-mand, small during the winter season, must necessarily strengthen as soon as building operations become general. Compared with the same period a year before, the past winter's business in hardwoods was emall The fallway men and dealers, m fact all report a falling off in general shipments, but an improvement is imminent.

As mentioned before, there has scarcely been any change in manufactured lines. No. 1 lath are scarce, quoted at \$2.50 to \$3.00 per M, with No. 2 at \$1.50 to \$2.00. Pine mill culls are quoted at \$11.50 to \$12.50, with box culls at \$12.50 to \$14.50. Other lines of pine are unchanged.

The Hull Lumber Company will operate both the Ritchie mill at Aylmer and the Mason mill in Hintonburg during the coming summer. The former mill has been enlarged and refitted. New machinery has also been placed in the Mason mill. These improvements will provide for a larger output.

Last summer it was reported that a large saw null would be erected at Deschenes, replacing the Conroy mill destroyed by fire in 1899. Mr. J. B. Fraser, it was stated, had the affair in hand. It is just possible that the mill may not be erected owing to

The St. Anthony Lumber Company only cut about 75 per cent. of its usual supply on the limits at Whitney. No logs were cut by the Allan Gilmour Company at Canoe Lake. All the Ottawa firms carried on extensive operations, however. Gangs of men are being sent up to work on the drives, which will start early

J. R. Booth had a constant supply of logs for his mill all winter. These were brought by rail over the Parry Sound branch of the Canada Atlantic Railway from a spur line running to the l'mits. The mill was operated all winter. Part of the supply of logs was unloaded on the river ice ready for the saw.

Ex-Mayor Bingham has returned from the Gatineau district, where he was engaged superintending preparations for the Gatineau drive. He states it will be a large one this year. All the tributaries will carry large quantities of logs to the main drive.

The Hull Pulp Company, in which Hiram Robinson, H. K. Egan, W. C. Edwards and other lumbermen are interested, has commenced operations for the building of a large mill on the site of the Hull Lumber Company's mill. The ruins of the old mill are being cleared away and a cofferdam is being built. When the latter is completed the foundation work of the new mill will be started.

Work is well advanced on the third of the E.B. Eddy Co.'s paper mills. A large store room is also being erected near the Work will shortly be commenced mill. on the tub and pail and fibre ware factories. New offices are also to be crected on the site of the temporary ones east of Bridge Strect.

McLaren & McLaurin, the mill owners of Templeton, are crecting five piers in the Ottawa River in a line from the north side of Kettle Island to the shore at the mill.


