




## P R E F A C E .

1883 1. THE words, from the commencement of each verse and half-verse up to the accented syllable, are called the Recitation.

2. The accented syllable indicates the beginning of an imaginary bar of time before the melody of the chant. The music of the chant commences with the accented syllable in strict time (*a tempo*), the upright strokes corresponding to the bars.

3. If there is no syllable after that which is accented, the accented syllable must be held for one whole bar, as in (1) : if other syllables follow the one accented, the imaginary bar will have to be divided into parts of a semibreve, as in (2), or as experience will show to be most natural.\*

(1) *Recit. a tempo. mediation.* (2)

4. The accented syllable is not always an emphatic one, nor is it ever to be marked with an exaggerated accent. The object of it is to secure greater smoothness in chanting, so that there may be no break between the recitation and mediation. The recitation should be sung, as nearly as may be, at the same rate as the rest; and the words should be enunciated with such accent and emphasis as a reverent reader would adopt—care being taken to avoid both a tedious drawl and irreverent speed. It is of the utmost importance that no break or pause should occur between the recitation and the accented syllable.

5. An asterisk (\*) is a direction to take breath. All commas (more especially those near the end of the recitation), should be marked, as in good reading, by a slight pause.

6. *F* signifies *Full*, that is, to be sung by both sides of the choir; *f* signifies *forte*, loud; *p*, *piano*, soft; *mf*, *mezzoforte*, moderately loud; *2nd part*, directs the choir to repeat the second half of a double chant at the verse to which it is prefixed.

The *Te Deum Laudamus* has been arranged to two chants; but may be sung throughout to one chant, if desired.

\* Fuller directions for Chanting are contained in the "CATHEDRAL PSALTER," a copy of which every Choir Master is strongly recommended to obtain. It can be had from Messrs. Rowse and Hutchison, Toronto.

## DIRECTIONS FOR THE USE OF THE FOLLOWING CANTICLES.

---

The following Chants consist of the Intonation, the Reciting-notes, the Mediation, and the Cadence. In this book the Intonation is set for the first verse, and for the Gloria, in each Canticle.

When a syllable is printed in *italics*, two or more notes are to be sung to that syllable.

A slight stress is to be laid on accented syllables.

The point placed between the words or syllables in the mediation and cadence is to attach the syllables to their proper notes.

In the 2nd, 6th, and 8th tones the last note of the mediation is not used when a monosyllable ends the first half of the verse ; but there are exceptions to this rule, as in the first verse of the Easter Anthem.

In the *Te Deum* the verses marked A must be sung to the ending A ; and those marked B to the ending B. The verses marked *Full* should be sung in harmony.

The organist should play over the chant, and then touch the first note of the intonation. The first half of the first verse should then be distinctly chanted by the Priest alone, or by the Precentor, without accompaniment. The second half of the verse should be sung *Full*, with the organ ; the remainder of the Canticle being sung antiphonally ; those on the Decani (north) side taking all the *even* verses, and those on the Cantoris (south) side all the *odd* ones, except when marked *Full*.

The movement should be brisk, but without hurry. Time must be allowed for the points, and for the distinct enunciation of the words.

The chants may be sung in harmony, if desired. It is an effective method when those on the *Decani* side sing in unison, and those on the *Cantoris* side sing in harmony.

Care should be taken to observe the accented notes of the chant.
