Dougall's V. O. Rye Goes to Montreal. An Unknown Browned in Lake

WHO WAS THIS MAN?

-Had the Appearance of a Hunter-

Evidence of Suicide.

Halifax Herald, June 15. One of the largest whisky transaci-tions ever operated by a distillery in this country has just been completed between the Eastern Trust Company, acting for the Bank of British North America, and Messra Lawrence A. Willson & Co., the large whne mer-chants of Montreal. The whisky pur-chased by this firm comprises the whole of McDougall's old rye whisky, vatted in oak barrels in the year 1880, and upon which heavy advances were obtained from the Bank of British North America.
