Port au Prince, Hayti, May 16.—There was further disturbance here last night. At about 10 p.m. a mob attacked the palace, but the rioters were fired on by the Presidential guard and eventually dispersed. Some of the attacking party were killed or wounded. The revolutionists in the north had rejected the overtures made to them with the object of settling civil war. They took this action after raising a loan of \$50,000 guaranteed by the coast receipts of Cape Haytien and Gonaves, the two ports in their hands. The northern army, consequently, will soon begin its march on Port au Prince.

is, perhaps, a more thorough military education than the Victoria Cross, for it is awarded for conduct and skill in action, rather than for the headlong valour which is now somewhat discouraged. The award is an increasing need for the order were first issued from the War Office on Nov. 6, 1886. Foreign officers associated in the naval and military operations of the British forces are eligible to be honorary members; and the order ranks next to the Order of the Indian Empire. In the earlier phases of the action he aided the Corn wallis, under Lieut. Col. Mansel, to reinforce the point in the firing line where he happened to be by causing the fire of the British to be directed upon the enemy's ranks. He was severely wounded. The other officers who were near each other. Of these, two—Lieut. Col. Aldworth, Major Brown and the Adjutant of the same regiment—met death; and the other two—Lieut. Mason and Lieut. Moneypenny—subsequently died of their wounds. Lieut. Mason was a most desperate combatant, and that at which the losses were the heaviest. He was killed by a bullet in the chest, which struck him in the right breast, and he fell with the last of the officers to fall and the furthest forward.

SCHOOL TEACHING AS A SIDE ISSUE

That greatest and most successful of educationists, the late Dr. Arnold of Rugby is quoted as including among the qualifications essential to the due performance of a master's duties "that the teacher should enter upon his work not as a side issue, but as a substantial and most important duty."

These are undoubtedly words of wisdom, the truth of which is not only recognized to-day, there can be no doubt that the greatest weakness of the Public school system in Ontario is discovered in the fact that a large percentage of our pedagogs do enter upon their work "as a side issue." They use the school teaching profession as a stepping stone to something else—as a means of putting themselves thru for one or the other of the professions, and they do not do their school work in a perfunctory and inefficient manner to the end that the rising generation suffers a lack of proper training.

The reason for this is that our teachers are not properly paid, and the only remedy would be to increase the standard of enrollment in the profession. But, perhaps, in so vast an organization as the Ontario Public school system this was difficult. The extra expenditure entailed would be too heavy to be popular with the masses.

THE HARM OF OVER EATING.

The human race suffers more from it than from under feeding. This is the dictum of the doctors. Most people eat too much. Just as many human beings starve because of a superabundance of food, as from an insufficient supply of it. Whenever the stomach is so overladen that it cannot assimilate the material with which it is taxed, actual starvation of the body results. Men and women of sedentary habits are the worst sufferers in the way of over eating, for their systems do not require anything like as much nutriment as do those of people of active habits or manual pursuits.

Regularity of meals with about five hours between each, is requisite to good digestion. Another rule necessary of observance is that all severe mental and physical activities should be avoided for at least one hour after eating. The blood and nervous system should be allowed, without hindrance, to assist the digestive apparatus in its work.

It is said that 80 per cent. of human physical ills are traceable to the stomach, and for the sake of health and comfort attention to these remarks will prove worth while.

ENGLAND AND CANADA.

"Canada has viewed the Morgan ship-pling trust rather complacently. Its attitude has been something of a wonder to the Mother Country. But it has reason for its complacency. English financiers are, as indicated, beginning to think of doing what they can to develop the resources of the colony for purposes of self-defence. They talk now of creating Canadian lines which shall handle the products of Canada, of Canadian shipping ports and of steamship lines which shall carry these products from those ports to others across the Atlantic. This will please the Canadians very much, for they have an idea that they have been somewhat ignored and neglected in the past."—Buffalo Express.

There is perhaps something in what our American contemporary says. English capital has been slow to recognize the possibilities of investment in this country. We venture to say that if English capital which has hitherto turned its attention to the United States and other foreign countries would engage in the development of our pulp and timber forests, our iron and nickel mines, our fisheries and our agricultural resources, much financial and other benefit would accrue to Britain herself and the empire at large. Herefore American capital has led the way in Canada, and it is high time that British capital should follow.

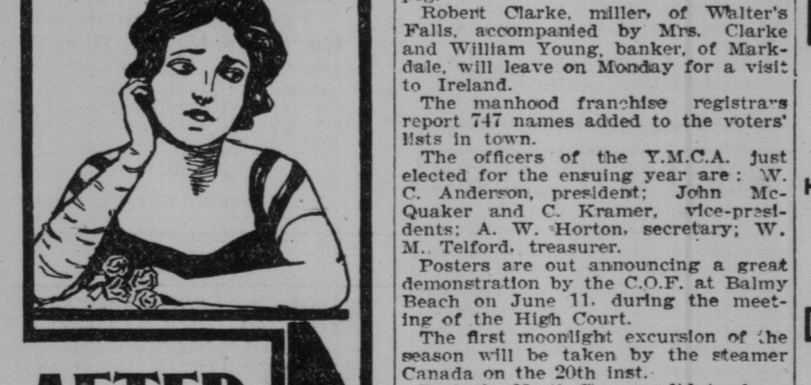

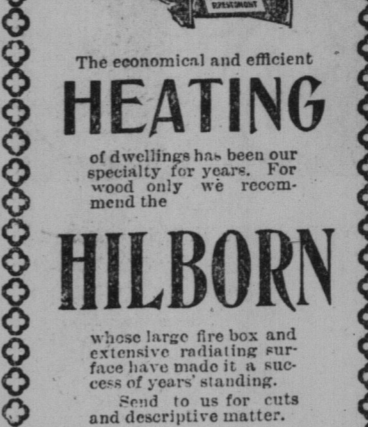

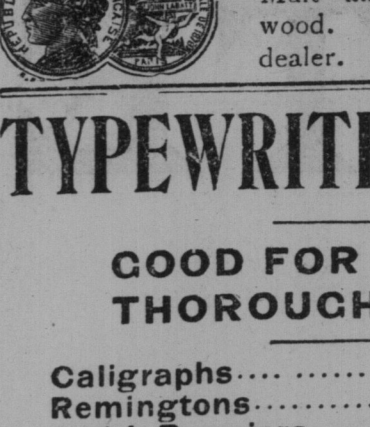
