Sydney, N. S., Aug. 13—The steamer Monara, in ballast bound to Louisburg for a cargo of coal, stranded on a reef five miles east of Louisburg in a dense fog at six o'clock this morning. A wire-Warsaw, Aug. 18—Polish commissioners with authority to negotiate a preliminary treaty of peace, expect to leave this city early tomorrow morning to meet Russian Soviet delegates somewhere on the road between Warsaw and Brest-Litovsk, so the foreign office announced today. The meeting, it was said, will take place between five and six o'clock tomorrow evening.

Officials here are puzzled to know why the crew should be leaving the ship, as there is no sea or not even a strong breeze. It is thought probable the vessel backed off the reef and is sinking in deep water.

Warsaw, Aug. 13—Mlawa, an importand city on the Warsaw-Danzig railroad, about fifty miles northwest of this city, has been taken by the Russian Bolsheviki, according to reports in military circles here last night. Soviet forces are creeping along the Prussian frontier, and are gradually working their way westward toward the Vistula River.

This stream appears to be the immediate objective of the Bolsheviki offensive at present, as the Soviet armies are also making an effort to reach it just west of Warsaw from Ciechanow. The advance along the northern frontier has suggested to observers that the Bolsheviki plans is to strike the Vistula near Viooslavek and other points.

VENIZELOS IS NOT IN DANGER Bullet Lodged in Left Shoulder - Reported Record of

Assailants.

Paris, Aug. 13—Premier Veniselos of Greece, who was wounded here yester-gray, when fired upon by two young Greeks, spent a good night in hospital, and is in no danger. The bullet, which lodged in his left shoulder, was to be spritted through purely personal motives, according to a statement issued at the Greek legation.
