TWENTIETH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM,
OR
FEMALE HOUSE OF REFUGE.

Another year has passed, and we are entering on the twenty-first year of our existence as a Charitable Institution—an Institution, we can confidently affirm, which has been much blessed by God to the reclaiming of many from the paths of sin and from a depth of degradation which only those who take a deep interest in the class for whose benefit the charity exists, can have any idea of. To our blessed Father be all the praise.

Our last Report was issued in May last instead of January, on account of our wishing to be able to inform our friends and the public that we had taken possession of our new Home, consequently this Report will only contain the record of nine months.

During that time 37 have been admitted to the Home, 17 have been sent to service, 18 left of their own accord, 2 were dismissed, 3 sent to the Hospital, 1 died, and there are now in the Home 33—making, when added to those remaining in the Institution at the date of last Report, a total of 74.

Of those sent to service some are doing well, others have again fallen into evil ways, and some have returned to us begging "to be taken in once more," and this we have done almost invariably. This is a feature in our work which some think, and indeed do not hesitate to pronounce as, wrong—as acting as an inducement to sin; but those of us who are most earnestly engaged in the work of reclamation, look on it in a very different light, for we are glad to find that their sinful life has no longer such powerful attractions for them; that though temptation has come,—as it will be sure to come to each one,—and they have yielded, yet the remembrance of the teachings at the Home, the quiet and peace and comfort there, operate so on their hearts—not yet wholly seared—that they cannot endure the life,—even though it has its freedom and excitement, and at times positive enjoyment,—for any long period, but back they come, and in many cases will even agree to remain *eighteen* months instead of *twelve*, the usual period, rather than not be taken in. Is not this a proof, if it is needed, that we are right in forgiving "until seventy

times seven," if necessary? What is there—what can there be—other than a desire for reformation, that would induce any woman *voluntarily* to give up her freedom and consent to remain in an Institution for twelve or eighteen months, where they are kept busily at work, never allowed to go out beyond the grounds of the Home, nor to receive visits from their friends (unless their parents, and then in presence of the Matron), and not to taste any stimulants? True it is they are made comfortable, in the sense of having sufficient nourishing food and a clean warm home; but that we think would not,—apart from the desire for reformation,—account for their voluntary return to spend another twelve months. But the transition from the life they are in the habit of leading outside is very great, and we do not wonder that many of these poor creatures, in the first months of their term, find it impossible to bear the restraint, and hence the large number we have to record as "leaving of their own accord." The two dismissed were ungovernable, and in both cases had violently assaulted others. The one death was very sudden and wholly unexpected, and we are sorry we cannot say, we had hope in her death.

We continue to receive pleasant accounts from many who years ago were inmates of the Home. Some married and comfortably settled; others happy in the family circle; others still in service. Of one, her mistress says: "she is still doing very well, I would not exchange her for any other servant I know," This one is the last of a family of three (mother and two daughters), all of whom have been in the Home. The mother never relapsed into her sinful life (she left the Refuge in 1866), and has continued a faithful servant ever since, most of the time in places of trust. This last daughter fell often, indeed we almost despaired of ever persuading her to remain the usual term of twelve months, yet the above is the testimony of one who has had her in her own home for some months, and who previously knew her in the house of a friend. Is not this encouraging?

Many ask—Do you really think the Institution does good? Do you reclaim many? We answer fearlessly, but truthfully: The Institution does good. We do not boast of reclaiming many. Still we thank our Father in Heaven that the catalogue of names of those whom we know to have been reformed through its means during these twenty years is not a short one; and though we did no more than keep the 30 or 40 (who each year come to us voluntarily), out of the jail or off the street, and away themselves from the temptations to their besetting sin, or of leading others into it, we do a good work, and bless God that such a Home exists, where any one tired of her evil courses and with even the first *feeble* desires to reform, can find a refuge.

Our friends, and the public generally, have hitherto supported us liberally, and we give them our hearty thanks, but at the same time would wish them to derive their highest satisfaction from the thought that they are helping on a good work—one which is evidently blessed by Him who came into this world to save the lost.

Our Matron, Mrs. Aitken, continues to merit our warmest approbation. Her kindness of heart and sincere sympathy with those under her charge, added to her firmness of purpose and unaffected piety, have a powerful influence over the inmates, not only in the Home, but after they have left it.

The amount received for work done, consisting of washing, plain sewing, knitting, quilting, &c., is, for the nine months, \$652.20. This, of course, is in addition to all the labour necessary to keep such a large building clean and in order, along with the cooking, washing, and sewing for from 35 to 40 individuals, each woman when leaving for service getting two suits of clothes.

The debt on the new building is still heavy, viz. \$4,000. We look to Him whose are the silver and the gold to send us the wherewithal to meet it. The building is a large one—some might say too large—and we have not yet, on account of the expense, been able to make that use of it in some of its parts which we propose to do; but in the early summer, if not before, we hope to make such arrangements as will enable us to accomplish, with God's blessing, a larger amount of good.

Our City is prospering, and increasing in material wealth; its sins and sorrows are, it is sad to record, increasing too. Help us, dear friends, with some of the wealth God is giving you, to extend the usefulness of the Home.

Allusion was made in our last Report to the loss, from age and failing strength, of our kind and most efficient medical adviser Dr. Robinson, who had acted in that capacity for many years. Since then Dr. Geikie has most kindly supplied his place, and to him we tender our sincere thanks.

To those Christian gentlemen also, who so faithfully attend to the religious services, both on the Sabbath and week days, we are sincerely grateful. They reap their reward in the consciousness of working for Christ, in thus trying to win souls to Him.

To all friends, old and new, we say, God bless and prosper you throughout the year on which we have entered, and give you largely of His favour, which is better than life.
