THE PACIFIC HOTEL DISASTER.

From the St. Louis Evening News, No. 26.
Almost every citizen of St. Louis has, no doubt, had a strong suspicion that the Pacific Hotel disaster was the result of a most diabolical incendiarism, and circumstances are now being developed which tend to confirm that suspicion beyond the possibility of a doubt. Early in the event, one of the most zealous supporters of the theory of fire, Captain J. E. D. Cousins, has been conducting an examination into the cause which bids fair to be crowned with the most complete success. It appears that Mr. Bouney, one of the unfortunate passengers, supported by the North East wind and a hundred feet of timber, a hundred feet from the rim, retired to bed about six o'clock, in a room adjoining that usually occupied by a man named Charles L. Taylor, alias Sanders, and separated from it by a board partition, and reaching up to the roof by way to the ceiling. About 1 o'clock in the morning he awoke, and the watchman of the Pacific Hotel met Taylor in the street, and, in the conversation with him, Taylor spoke in favor of James Robinson and Thomas Robinson, bearing date the 20th day of September, A.D. 1856.
