

THE PACIFIC HOTEL DISASTER

From the St. Louis Evening News, 25th. Almost every citizen of St. Louis has, no doubt, had a strong suspicion that the Pacific Hotel disaster was the result of a most diabolical, intentional, and circumstantial plot being developed which would result in the destruction of the hotel, and the death of the proprietor, and the loss of the lives of the guests.

It appears that Mr. Dwyer, one of the architects who was supposed to have lost his life by the fire, and whose remains were discovered in the ruins, referred to by the above article, in a room adjoining the Pacific Hotel, and in the conversation with him, Taylor stated that he had \$5000 in his room at that time.

Dr. W. W. Strader, the landlord of the hotel, was the proprietor of the hotel, and it is now ascertained that he had not a dollar of interest in it, but that it belonged to persons with whom the Doctor was at feud. He has also, therefore, been arrested on the charge of conspiracy to murder Taylor.
