**Another Photographic Tri-
umph.**

For many years the astronomers of
the Paris Observatory have been
engaged in the work of preparing
complete charts of all stars to thir-
teenth magnitude embraced in the
zone of the ecliptic or sun's apparent
path. The work requires seventy-
two charts, of which fifty two—con-
taining 96,000 stars—have been com-
pleted, and four—having 15,000 stars
—are nearly finished. A great diffi-
culty is now encountered, the stars in
that part of the heavens where the
ecliptic crosses the Milky Way being
so numerous as to defy complete and
accurate representation by the ordi-
nary process of charting. A solution
of the difficulty, however, seems to have
been found in a resort to photography,
as preliminary photographic experi-
ments have proved very successful.
A special telescope is therefore being
constructed, with which it is antici-
pated that an observer will obtain in
an hour's time a chart of the stars, to
the twelfth magnitude at least, and
probably the thirtieth or fourteenth
of the same dimensions as one of
the published charts—a work which
would otherwise require many months
of assiduous labor. The success of
the undertaking will appear to be an
important step towards the fulfilment
of the recent prophecy that an essen-
tial part of the astronomical library of
the future will be a picture gallery
of photographs of the entire heavens.

How Fish are pread.

By a pre conceived notion of what
should be the geographical distribu-
tion of the fishes, and other animals
as well, "systematic" writers grave-
ly assert that never wanders either to
the eastward or westward. Perhaps
originally this was true of our
rivers, as the river itself determined
the range of specific variation that
has ultimately come about; but no
river could retain all the species that
originated in it. There are too many
possible ways by which fish can be
safely transported long distances for
us to assert that none of them have
operated in stocking a neighboring
stream with species not native and to
the manner born. There is undoubt-
ed evidence on record of whirlwinds
gathering up immense numbers of
minnow fish and landing them miles
away. These showers of fishes, frogs,
and even salamanders, are not un-
known, even if they are uncommon;
and strange would it be if all such
wind transported species should fall
upon dry ground, and never into the
water. Fertilized eggs, too, can like-
wise be blown a long distance over
low ranges of hills which some-
times separate river valleys, and so
give rise to a race of fishes that pre-
viously were unknown in the locality.
Eggs, too, might readily adhere to the
mad that often clings to the feet of
wading birds, and would thus be
carried away from that in which they
were deposited by the parent fish.
The present extensive system of
canals has also tended to mingle the
ichthyic faunas of our various river
systems. And when all these possi-
bilities, probable and actual conditions
are considered, it need excite no
wonder if in any one of our rivers or
its tributaries we now find occasional
individuals of unsuspected species.

Arctic Currents.

The discovery of so many relics of
the Jeannette, on the west coast of
Greenland is one of the most striking
evidences of the drift of the polar
waters which has yet come to light.
The Jeannette was abandoned north
of Siberia in a current of water flow-
ing from the east, and apparently part
of the great north-easterly Atlantic
drift from the tropics. How this drift
is afterwards distributed is uncertain.
Part of it, no doubt makes its way
past the American Arctic islands into
Davis' Straits, but the strength of the
berghering current from the circum-
polar sea into Baffin's Bay, and the
fact that the Jeannette crew making
their way on foot on the ice, found
that the northward movement of the
ice was as great as their own south-
ward movement, would indicate the
probability that the Jeannette relics
were carried across the pole and thence
southward into Baffin's Bay. A cask,
and a piece of tent belonging to the
Jeannette were seen floating down
Davis' Strait on a piece of ice. That
these relics should have kept their
place on the cake of ice the whole
way, suggests that a water channel
comparatively unobstructed exists
across the breadth of the polar regions.
