And from thence continued, by several Prorogations, to the Twenty-sixth Day of October, 1775; being the Second Session of the Fourteenth Parliament of Great Britain.

## C A P. XXXVII.

An Act for allowing the Exportation of certain Quantities of Wheat, and other Articles, to His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America, and to the Island of Saint Helena, and to the other Settlements belonging to the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, and of Biscuit and Pease to Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Bay Chaleur, and Labrador; and for indemnifying all Perfons with respect to advising or carrying into Execution His Majesty's Orders of Council already made for allowing the Exportation of Wheat, and other Articles.

HERCAS by an Act of Parliament, Preamble. made in the Thirteenth Bear of his Actigo.iii. Majetty's Reign, (intituled, An Act to regulate the Importation and Exportation of Corn), whenever the Pices of certain Species of British Corn or Grain

erceed the Pices therein limited, the Exportation thereof from this Kingdom is prohibited under certain Penalties in the faid Ait mentioned, except in particular Cases allowed by that and several subsequent Acts of Parliament: And whereas certain Quantities of Wheat, Heal, Flour, Bread, and Biscuit, which were allowed to II T 2

be exported to the British Sugar Colonies in America, for the Sustenance and Use of the Inhabitants of the said Colonies, and certain Duantities of Biscuit and Peasc ellowed to be exported to the Illand of Newfoundland, for the Beneut of the British Kishery there, by Two several Aus of Parliament, made in the Fourteents Year of the Reign of his present Wajesty, the One intituled. An Act to allow the Exportation of Corn, Grain, and other Articles, to His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America; and to extend the Provisions of an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, (intituled, An Ast to regulate the Importation and Exportation of Corn), allowing the Exportation of Wheat, Meal, Flour, Rye, Barley, or Malt, to the Islands of Guernfey and Jersey, to Bread, Biscuit, and Pease; and to allow the Exportation of all the faid Articles to the Island of Alderney; and the other intituled, An Act to allow the Exportation of a limited Quantity of Biscuit and Pease to the Island of Newfoundland, for the Benefit of the British Fishery there; have been rendered insufficient by the Intercuption which has been given to Trade, and the Troubles and Diffurbances which are fill subüsting in many of the Colonies in North America, and the Inhabitants of the faid Sugar Colonies, and the British Subjects carrying on the Kisherp at Newfoundland, and at other Parts in America, may be put under great Difficulties and Distress at this Time, without farther Supplies from this Ringdom: Way it therefore pleafe Pour Bajelly that it may be enaded; and be it enaded by the King's most Excellent Pajelly, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Loids Spiritual and Tempolal, and Commons. in this present Parliament attembled, and by the Au-Certain Quan- thosity of the same, That, from and after the passing of wheat, Bread, this At, it half and may be lawful to thip and export, to be exported from the Poets of London, Bristol, Liverpoole, and Glasfrom London, gow only, any Duantity of Wheat, Wheat Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Meal; that is to say, Mot erceed= ing in the Mhole, from the Port of London, Fifty thoufand Quarters; from the Port of Bristol, Twenty thous fand Duarters; from the Port of Liverpoole, Twenty thouland

To Labrador, One hundred and lifty Tons of Biscuit, and One hundred and fifty Quarters of Peace.

And whereas by an Ad, passed in the Thirteenth Bear of his present Wajesty's Reign, (intituled, An Act to regulate the Importation and Exportation of Corn) it was wheat, Flour, (among other Things) enacted, That nothing therein contained hould extend to prohibit the Exportation from the Port of London, to the Illand of Saint Helena, of

any Duantity of Wheat, Weal, Klour, Rpc. Barley, or Walt, not exceeding Five hundred Duarters in the Whole, for the Sultenance and Use of the Inhabitants thereof, under the Bestrictions and upon the Conditions therein mentioned: And whereas the said Quantity of Tive hundred Duarters of Wheat, Weal, Flour, Rve. Barley, or Walt, is not fufficient for the necessary Use and Consumption of the said Island of Saint Helena, and for the United East India Company's Settlements in the East Indies; be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That, from and after the passing of this Ad, it thall be lawful for the faid United Company to ervort annually from Great Buitain to the faid Mand of Saint Helena, Bencoolen, und to their Settlements in the East Indies, or any of them, any Duantity of Wheat, Wheat Weal, Mour, Ryc, Barkey, og Walt, not erceeding One thousand Duarters in the Mhole, under the Restrictions and upon the Terms and Conditions in the faid recited Act provided and contained, as respecting the Quantity of Wheat, and other Articles, thereby allowed to be exported to the said Island of Saint Helena; any Thing in the faid recited Aft contained to the contrary therest notwithstanding.

Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted by the faid Articles to be the Authority aforesaid, That the said Articles exported subject to the like Securias aforefaid, in purluance of this Ad, thall be subject to ties, &c. on Exportation, the like Securities at the respective Ports from whence as directed by they are exported, that the same hall not be landed or low in any Parts whatsoever other than the respective Wheres for which the same thall be entered and declared for Exportation, and in all other Respects not altered by this At than be liable to such and the like Rules, Bellrittions, and Begulations; and the Perlons aranting or making any falle Gertificate, or counterfeit. ing, eraling, or fallifying any Certificate, or knowingly publiching such Certificate so counterfeited, erased, or fallitied, thall be subjett to the ame Disabilities, Penalties, and Fosfeitures, as are respectively prescribed and directed by the faid recited Afts, made in the Fourteenth Pear of his Wajetty's Reign; which Penalties and Foz-

Clause for indemnifying all Perfons advising or exeenting certain Orders of Council for allowing Exportation of Biscuit, &c.

And whereas His Wajetty, by an Deder in Council. bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of June last, was pleased to order that a Duantity of Biscuit, not exceed= ing Due thousand Tons, should be allowed to be exported to Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Bay Chaleur, and Labrador, from the Date thereof, until the Twenty-fourth Day of July following, which Time was afterwards prolonged by His Wajelly's further Dider in Council, bearing Date the Cleventh Day of August last; and Dis Wajesty, by another Dider in Council, bearing Date the Tweisth Day of July last, was pleased to order that Two hundred Tons of Biscuit should be allowed to be exported to Newfoundland, from the Port of Liverpoole; and also that Fifty Tons of Biscuit, and One hundred Duarters of Peale, hould be allowed to be exported from the Post of Weymouth; and likewife Two hundied Quarters of Pease from the Port of Poole; which soid Deders could not be justified according to the strict forms of Law, and pet were so much for the Service of the Publick, and so necessary for the Safety and Dieservation of Dis Wajelty's Subjects in those Parts. that the same ought to be justified by Ak of Parliament; and all Persons advising, ading under, or in Phedience to the same indemnified; be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That all and every Person and Berfons who have or thall have afted or done any Thingsin advilling or executing the laid Deders of Council. or touching or concerning the fame, or relating thereto, thall be and are hereby laved harmless, discharaed, acquitted, released, and indemnissed in that Behalf, as well against the King's Pajetty, his heirs and Successors, as against all and every other Person and Persons; and all Suits and Proceedings for any Hanner of Thing difcharged by this present Ad, thall be utterly boid and of none Effect, to all Intents and Purpoles; any Law. Statute, or Usage, to the contrary netwithstanding.
