The Committee on Communications, to whom the difficulties existing with Oak Division, No. 43, were referred, beg to submit the following for the consideration of the Grand Division:—

Whereas the brethren of Oak Division, No. 43, Kentville, and some brethren of other Divisions in the County of Kings, seem dissatisfied, from an unfortunate misunderstanding at the early establishment of our Order in this Province, and *Whereas*, as Brother P. S. White, the

accredited agent of the National Division, while in this Province made statements which led to a misapprehension of the Constitution of our Order—and as our brother White could not be charged with any intention to misstate the relations existing between the different branches of the Order of the Sons of Temperance, we cannot but conclude that Brother White either left his statements obscurely made, presuming upon the presence of information that did not exist, or, in the eagerness of the moment or novelty of the occasion, the brethren entirely mistook the meaning he intended to convey. And *whereas* the Grand Division feels desirous of rendering to every subordinate Division, and to every individual brother, any information and encouragement in the working of our noble cause, and desires to consider with brotherly affection and love, those grievances, to which any brothers may feel themselves subjected, and while we rejoice with those that rejoice, we would weep with those that weep. *And whereas*, as the Grand Division feels desirous of drawing more closely the ties that bind the brethren of Oak Division to our common interest, and good cause; and feels the utmost solicitude to relieve their minds from any grievance, that they may walk with us in Love, Purity and Fidelity: *It is therefore Resolved*, That this Grand Division most sincerely regrets the misunderstanding that has for some time existed in the Oak Division, and would now most affectionately invite such of its members as have felt themselves aggrieved, to wave entirely those considerations which have hitherto agitated them, and which cannot but impede our common cause, and for the sake of the all important interest of temperance, throw their affectionate zeal and united energy into one common interest.

It is further *Resolved* that the Grand Scribe be requested to seek through the proper channel, such explanations from Brother White as shall correct the misapprehension his statements have left, and communicate the same, when received, to the different subordinate Divisions.

Whereas, A resolution was passed by this Division at the session in July, 1849, authorising the G. W. P. to appoint a Deputy in each Sub. Division; therefore

Resolved, That said resolution be hereby repealed.

The following resolution, moved by Bro. Joseph W. Quinan, was passed.

Resolved, That it is the request of this Division, that every D. G. W. P. name a Deputy in each Division, for the quarter, for the purpose of admitting visiting brethren who may not have the pass word, and for granting dispensation for initiation.

The Committee appointed to suggest some modification in the Bye-Laws of Sub. Divisions, with reference to their financial affairs, beg leave to report the following resolutions, and recommend the adoption of the same to all Subordinate Divisions:—

1. *Resolved*, That no member of this Division shall receive more than ten weeks benefits in one year.

2. *Resolved*, That in the event of a brother being sick in a distant place, he shall only be entitled to receive the same rate of benefits as he would at home, and in no case for more than ten weeks.

3. *Resolved*, That no member of this Division, who allows his dues to remain unpaid for the space of four months, shall be eligible for benefits until six weeks after the same have been paid.

4. *Resolved*, That no member of this Division shall receive a benefit, until he has been sick one entire week.

Your Committee would farther suggest:—That the Grand Scribe be requested to communicate with the National Division, and make known to that D. the financial depression that exists, especially in the rural districts of this Province. That in consequence of this depression, a large number of young men are excluded from our excellent organization, and the extension of our cause is unfortunately limited; and that the Temperance cause may take a wider range, the N. D. be requested to allow the Sub. Divisions of this Province to reduce the minimum of the monthly dues to 12½ cents, and the minimum of the initiation fees to \$1 and 50 cents.

P. has power to enforce a due observation of the Constitution and Bye-Laws, and exact a compliance to the rules and usages of the Order as clearly laid down, and that his decision was correct regarding the fine, as according to Art. 7, Sec. 1, of the Constitution, it required a two-third vote of the Division to sustain the fine, and in consequence the casting vote of the W. A. in the chair, to sustain the fine, was unconstitutional. But your Committee would be remiss in their duty did they not strongly recommend to D. G. W. P's to refrain from what may have a tendency to appear as arbitrary measures, or not in accordance with the spirit as well as the rules of the Order.
