



The Canadian High Commission in Singapore, Commercial Section, commissioned SRI International to prepare this sectoral analysis overview. This report is designed to help Canadian organizations meet their initial information needs regarding participation in this sector in Singapore. The information presented is believed to be accurate and from public sources SRI believes to be reliable. Readers are urged to verify pertinent information before committing resources.

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BACKGROUND

DIRECTIONAL EMPHASIS OF SECTOR

In order to maintain Singapore's stability and growth, the government has identified a need for a "total defense" policy. This policy compasses 5 separate components, each under the responsibility of a Ministry:

Psychological Defense - Ministry of Communications and Information

Social Defense
 Economic Defense
 Ministry of Community Development
 Ministry of Trade and Industry

Civil Defense
 Ministry of Home Affairs

Military Defense
 Ministry of Defense (MINDEF)

Psychological defense involves the strengthening of the people's commitment to the country, while social defense seeks to increase the people's ability to live harmoniously as a community. Economic defense ensures that basic daily necessities are available even during an emergency, while civil defense aims to equip the populaton with the ability to respond in a trained and organized manner in times of emergencies. Finally, military defense involves the maintenance of efficient warfare capabilities by the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF).

AN OVERVIEW OF THE SINGAPORE ARMED FORCES

The SAF began building its forces in 1965 (with independence). It started with the formation of the First Battalion and the Singapore Infantry Regiment. Today, SAF is composed of 50,000 in personnel and 660,000 in available manpower.

The SAF is composed of 3 major services - the army, the airforce, and the navy.

The army - Singapore's largest service with a strength of 45,000 soldiers organized into one divisional headquarters staff, one armored brigade, three infantry brigades, one artillery brigade, six artillery battalions, one commando battlion (one of the best in the region), six engineer battalions and three signal battalions. Army reserves total an additional 150,000 troops organized into 18 reserve battalions, nine artillery battalions, six engineering battalions, two signal battalions and one commando battalion.

It is also equipped with Infantry weapons such as SAR-80 assault rifles, AR-15 (M-16) rifles, Ultimax 100 light machine guns, 81mm mortars, Armburst anti-tank weapon, and others. Most of this equipment and complementary ammunition is manufactured by subsidaries of MINDEF. Equipment used by the armoured regiment includes the French built AMX-13 light tank and the American-made M113 Armoured Personnel carrier. Equipment used by the Singapore artillery battalions includes 120mm and 160mm mortars as well as the locally built 15mm FH 88.

The airforce (of 6,000 personnel) is equipped with more than 100 aircraft including F5E/F Tiger II which serves as an interceptor. Other aircraft include A4S Skyhawks, Hawker F-74S fighters, F16s, C-130 Hercules and Skyvans, and helicopters like Bell UH-1B's, UH-1Hs and AS 332M Super Pumas. For ground-based air defense surface-to-air missile systems like the Bloodhound MarkII, Improved-Hawks, Rapier, RBS-70 and E2C Hawkeyes are utilized.

The navy is composed of 4,500 personnel deployed on board ships and at shore establishments. it has a fleet of 32 ships organized into 6 squadrons. These include 6 missile gun boats, 6 patrol craft, 12 coastal patrol craft, 5 landing tanks, 2 minesweepers, and 1 training ship.

AN OVERVIEW OF THE SINGAPORE ARMED FORCES


The missile gun boats are armed with harpoon and gabriel anti-aircraft guns, as well as 57mm and 40mm Bofors anti-surface and anti-aircraft guns. The navy is also planning to acquire another squadron of 6 Missile Corvettes armed with harpoon anti-ship missiles, a 76mm Oto-Melara Super Rapid Gun and anti-submarine torpedoes.


In order to enhance training, shore-based simulators and trainers are used extensively.

Paramilitary forces include 7,500 policemen, gurkha guard units and approximately 30,000 people's defense force personnel.

CURRENT SITUATION - DEMAND FOR DEFENSE EQUIPMENT

Government expenditure on defense is estimated to be 6% of gross domestic product (GDP). Between 1980 - 1988, the market for defense equipment grew from 1.5 billion to 2.9 billion.





The market for defense equipment is divided into 3 categories - equipment replacement, training equipment, and new technologically advanced equipment.

The replacement market is one that is difficult to penetrate despite the market being open to technological improvements and upgrades. Difficulties arise from replacements/upgrades having to be compatible with existing equipment. Furthermore, price is a major consideration in this market.

In contrast, there is a large potential for foreign suppliers of training equipment. Because of the limited geographic size of Singapore, maintenance (e.g. technician training) and tactical systems (e.g. computer aided instruction systems and aircraft simulators) are used extensively. There is also an on-going move from simple technical training to the more advanced tactical systems.

The market for new and advanced equipment, like that of training equipment offers a large potential for foreign suppliers. However, this area is very competitive and involves a substantial amount of R&D and capital investment by the supplier.

DETERMINATION OF EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Ministry of Defense (MINDEF) is the organization responsible for national defense and security. Its functions include:

- The development and maintenance of an effective and operationally ready armed forces.
- The promotion of defense consciousness among the population.
- · The management of certain government-owned companies.

For the purpose of determining its equipment requirements, MINDEF is divided into 3 major groupings - the users, the specifiers, and the executors.

The users are composed of 3 sub-groups, the land, air and navy. Each sub-group has its own logistics, intelligence, planning, operations and training units. In order to determine the current and future equipment requirements of the group, the planning and intelligence units work together with the logistics and operations groups. Each user group then submits its requirements to the Defense Materials Organization (DMO) and the Defense Science Organization (DSO) which are known as the specifiers.

DETERMINATION OF EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

The DMO is the systems engineering, design development integration and project management authority for all defense systems and equipment in the SAF. Its functions include systems acquisition, upgrading of existing equipment and interfacing new upgraded projects with historical equipment. DMO is also responsible for establishing policies and guidelines for the support and maintenance of defense materials.

The DSO provides scientific support and evaluation of particular types of high technology equipment requests by DMO. The DSO's main function is to perform defense research and development. This organization includes a team of engineers, scientists, software professionals.

Depending on the type of equipment requested DMO, or both DMO and DSO, may be involved in analyzing the user's equipment requirements and translating these into actual technical specifications. The requirement/specifications are then given to the Defense Purchasing Department (DPO).

DPO is also in charge of formulating the appropriate tender documents and inviting suppliers and manufacturers to submit their tenders for the equipment and services required. Offers received are evaluated by a committee composed of members from DPO, DMO, DSO, and the respective service planning and logistics units. Once a particular proposal is accepted, DPO begins to finalize the terms of the contract.

Tenders are either open public tenders which are published in the newspaper (e.g. local newspaper each Friday) or closed tenders. For closed tenders only pre-qualified suppliers are approached by MINDEF and asked to bid.

MINDEF usually has a 2 year purchasing plan based on a 5 year rolling plan of its equipment requirements. Long term plans include 10 year projections which are continually updated. The purchasing plans are usually completed in March. Knowledge of these plans is limited to a few SAF personnel.

PROCESS OF SUPPLYING DEFENSE EQUIPMENT TO MINDEF

A supplier of defense equipment may approach MINDEF directly with products or services or may go through intermediaries (e.g. MINDEF companies or private licensed agents).

DIRECT APPROACH

It is a policy of MINDEF to deal directly with suppliers. Foreign suppliers can approach MINDEF with their company briefs giving details of the company's product/service range, capability, financial status and the contact persons. The person to contact is the Assistant Director of Purchasing, Defense Procurement Division. MINDEF has a prepared booklet entitled "Doing Business with the Ministry of Defense, Singapore" which elaborates its procedures on the purchase of material and services with the potential suppliers in mind.

Because of the large number of suppliers, if economically feasible, the possibility of conducting trials using the equipment should be indicated. This may improve supplier "recall" when future demand for the equipment arises.

PROCESS OF SUPPLYING

INTERMEDIARY APPROACH

Several foreign companies have opted to go through a third party because of they are not familiar with procedures and persons to contact. Another advantage of going through a local agent is that it facilitates coordination with local contractors/suppliers in the case of projects costing S\$10m or more, as these require 30% local sourcing.

Companies that opt to go through intermediaries may approach MINDEF-linked companies which include Unicorn International Pte Ltd, The International Marketing Division of the Singapore Technical and Industrial Corporation or the Marketing Division of the Singapore Aircraft Industries. These companies are usually familiar with MINDEF's plans and future equipment requirements.

They may also go through private intermediaries which include local agents cleared to do business in defense products.

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COMPETITOR ANALYSIS

KEY PARTICIPANTS IN THE DEFENSE INDUSTRY

The Singapore defense industry is primarily a government run body. Almost all defense industries are under the control of the MINDEF controlled umbrella group, and the Singapore Technologies Group (which includes more than 40 companies organized into 4 business sectors: industrial, ordnance, aerospace and marine).

The ordnance-based companies of the Chartered Industries of Singapore produce equipment both for the local market and for export. The range of products include small arm weapons, anti-tank weapons, ammunition for small arms, machine guns and aircraft, mortar bombs, explosives, military electronics, communication equipment and others. All products are made to international standards such as US and NATO Military Standards.

Major suppliers of imported defense equipment are the USA, UK and Germany. Some US companies include United Technologies, AAR Technical Service and EMGO Overseas which supply aircrafts and engines, rotables for aircraft, and ordnance products respectively. All these companies go through local intermediaries. Similarly, UK firms such as Irvine Industries (parachutes and components) and Painx-Wessex Schermuly (ammunition) go through local agents.

Canadian suppliers that have been successful in tapping the Singapore defense market include Bristol Aerospace, CAE of Montreal, Spar Aerospace, Marconi, Fathom Oceanology, Sperry, Henotex and others.

FUTURE TRENDS AND MARKET OPPORTUNITIES

The market for defense equipment is expected to remain at about 6% of GNP. Although this percentage figure is not expected to change, the actual dollar value of defense product purchases is expected to rise over the next several years.

This, therefore, offers market opportunities for suppliers of defense equipment and services. The major growth areas are:

- Training equipment.
- New and more technologically advanced equipment.

With MINDEF's plans to establish its own company for spare parts, supply of spare parts will no longer be listed as open tenders.

The Singapore government encourages foreign manaufacturers to set up joint ventures for the production of high technology defense products. As Canadian manufacturers have unique technological know-how on certain defense products such as air-to-ground missiles, radar equipment and others, they may consider setting up manufacturing and servicing operations to service the region.

Initially, however, Canadian companies may choose to establish presence and a track record either by going directly to MINDEF or by approaching licensed MINDEF companies or private agents.
