Elongation—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth.

Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

Mail Letters. — From one place in Canada to another, and between Canada and the United States, 3c. per half oz., between Canada and Newfoundland, and between Canada and Great Britain, 5c. per half oz.

Insufficiently paid letters to Canada, on which the first half ounce rated postage is fully prepaid, are forwarded charged with double the deficient postage. Insufficiently paid letters for or from the United States, on which a single

rate of postage or more has been paid, are charged with the deficient postage on delivery.

Book Post. - From one place in Canada to another*; from Canada to the United States, and from Canada to Newfoundland,* 1c. per 4 oz.; from Canada to Great Britain, 1c. per 2 oz.

Parcels must be plainly marked "By Parcel Post."

Legal and Commercial Papers. — Legal and Commercial papers, poster for places in Canada generally, are subject to letter rate unless sent by pare post; except deeds and insurance policies, which are allowed to go by Bool Post. Postage rates on Legal and Commercia' Papers, addressed to Post Union countries, are as follows, viz.: to countries where the letter rate is cents per \(\frac{1}{2} \) oz., the rate of legal and commercial papers is 5 cents for the fin 10 oz., and one cent for each additional 2 oz. or fraction; or to countries when the letter rate is 10 cents per ½ oz., the rate is 5 cents for the first 4 oz. and cents for each additional 2 oz. or fraction.

Patterns and Samples. — Patterns and samples of merchandize not en ceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one of per 4 ounces weight, properly labelled, and put up in such a manner as admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, being actually trade patterns or samples, are not admissible as such.

Re-Directed Letters.

TO ANY PLACE IN CANADA, THE UNITED STATES, AND POSTAL UNION COUNTRIES.

Re-Directed Letters to places within the Dominion or U.S. will be forwarded without any additional charge if returned promptly to the Office.

Letters sent to or received from a Country of the Postal Union, and afterwards re-directed to any place in Canada, or to a Country in the Postal Union, will be forwarded even if taken out of the Office and re-addressed; but if re-addressed to a place where there is a higher rate of postage, the difference of postage will be chargeable.

Newspapers and Periodicals.

Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Places in Canada, Newfoundland, or the United States.

Printed and published in Canada, and posted from the office of publication or News Agency to actual Subscribers or News Agents in Canada, the United States, and Newfoundland, resident elsewhere than at the place of publication, are free. Such newspapers and periodicals must be issued not less frequently than once per month.

Newspapers posted for City Delivery will not be delivered by Letter Carriers unless pre-paid by 1c. stamp.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Places in Canada, Newfoundland, and United States.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those specified above, the postage rate will be one cent per 4 ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals published not less frequently than once a month and weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp one half cent each. Newspapers for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 1c. for each 2 oz.

Newspapers and Periodicals, published in the United Kingdom, and brought by mail to Canadian Booksellers or News Agents, may be re-mailed by such Booksellers or News Agents, free of Postage.

Matter which Cannot be Forwarded Through the Post.

Any Explosive Substance, glass, liquid, or other matter likely to entail risk or injury to the ordinary contents of the mail, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Spectacles and eye-glasses, if securely put in cases not likely to allow the contents to escape if broken in course of conveyance, may be sent by Post within the Dominion on prepayment of parcel post rates.

Registered Letters. — Letters intended to be registered, when addressed to places in CANADA, must be prepaid by stamp, 2 cents each; to the United States, 5 cents each, in addition to the postage rate. For NEWFOUNDLAND, Registered Letters, 2 cents, other articles 5 cents, in addition to the postage.

All letters for Registration should be posted 30 minutes before the hour of closing Mails.

No letter will be accepted at this office for Registration addressed either to initials or what may appear a fictitious name, and any such Registered Letters received from another office, or deposited in the Letter Box for Registration, will be at once sent to the Dead Letter Office for disposal.

Preserve and request correspondents to preserve envelopes of mis-sent or delayed letters.

Business men should be careful to authorize but a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence

Have a letter box on your office door.

A letter once posted becomes the property of the person to whom it is all dressed, and must be forwarded according to its direction. On no application. however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer, or to any other person.

Letters addressed to mere initials, or fictitious names, will not be delivered

unless addressed in care of a resident, or to some box in the Post Office.

Letters containing Gold or Silver Money, Jewels or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries except the United States.

All apples packed in Canada for sale by the barrel shall be packed in good and strong barrels of seasoned wood made as nearly cylindrical as may be: the staves of such barrels shall be twenty-seven inches in length from Croe to Croe, with heads from sixteen and one-half to seventeen inches in diameter; and such barrels shall be sufficiently hooped with a lining hoop within the chines, the whole well secured by nails.

2. Every person who offers or exposes apples for sale by the barrel, otherrise than in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this section, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five cents, for each barrel of apples so offered or

exposed for sale.



HACKNEY CARRIAGES-Rates of Fare.

The prices or rates of fare to be taken and recovered by and paid to the owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed Hackney Carriage shall be as follows, that is to say: for conveying one passenger from any public stand to any other part of the City, or from any one part of the City to any other part thereof, the sum of thirty cents, and for every additional passenger of the same household, each twenty cents; other passengers, not of the same household, each thirty cents. When detained at any place by any passenger, there shall be an additional fare of fifty cents every half hour deention. When agreement for hire is made by the hour, the fare shall be the um of one dollar for each hour, and in that proportion for each division by he quarter of the hour. In case any driver shall be required to cross the erry of the harbour to or from Carleton, he shall in addition to the above fare eceive twenty cents additional rate for one passenger, or more than one of the ame household; but if not of the same household, then twenty cents such dditional fare for each passenger; and also in addition to the fare, he shall eceive the ferriage charges for himself, his carriage and horses, both going nd returning. Every owner, driver or person having charge of any Hackney Carriage shall, when requested so to do, carry with each passenger one trunk and also an additional valise, carpet-bag, portmanteau, bundle, basket, or ther article used in travelling, without charge or compensation therefor; and or every additional trunk or other article more than hereinbefore provided, shall be entitled to demand and receive the sum of five cents.

Cartage Districts.

First District—To comprise all that part of the City lying between and within the North side of Union Street, the East side of Prince William Street, and the South side of Duke Street.

Becond District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the First District, which lies between and within the East side of Mill Street, at the City line, North side of Pond Street, East side of Peel Street, North side of Corleton Street, East side of Coburg and Charlotte Streets, and South side of Corleton Street.

Third District — To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Second District that lies between the City line on the North, the East side of Dorcheter Street, North side of Hazen Street, East side of Garden Street, Northerly side of Paddock Street, Easterly side of Waterloo Street, East side of Sydney Street, and South side of Saint James Street.

Fourth District — To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Third District that lies between and within the City line on the North, to the Westward of a line at right angles to the said City line; and which strikes the intersection of the Easterly line of Coburg with the Northerly line of Hazen Street. The Easterly side of Coburg Street, Northerly line of Cliff Street, Westerly side of Waterloo Street, Northerly side of Richmond Street, Easterly side of Brussels Etreet, Easterly side of Carmarthen Street, and Southerly side of Main St.

District — To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Fourth that lies between and within the City line on the North, the Southerly line of the General Public Hospital Grounds, the Northerly side of Jordan's (so called), lying between Waterloo and Brussels Sts., Easterly side of Brusels Street, Northerly side of Clarence Street, Easterly side of St. Patrick Easterly side of Wentworth Street, and Southerly side of Main Street.

At one minute before one o'clock it will be hoisted its full length; and at one o'clock, mean time, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time should then show 5h 24m 15s, and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. As the above how of one o'clock when the Ball drops, represents 5h 24m 15s at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John should compare their Chronometer by the time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbour rates. Latitute 45° 16′ 42″ North. Longitude in time 4h 24m 15s West of Greenwich.
