ELEVENTH SESSION.

Kingston, Tuesday, June 4th, 1872.

SERVICE IN THE CATHEDRAL.

Evensong was sung by the Rev. J. J. Bogert, M.A., Rector of Napanee.

The first Lesson was read by the Very Rev. the Dean. The second Lesson was read by the Ven. the Archdeacon.

The Sermon was preached by the Rev. T. Bedford Jones, LL.D., Incumbent of St. Alban's Church, Ottawa, from 2 Cor., vii, 1.

"Perfecting holiness in the fear of God."

The Offertory, amounting to \$16.85, was in aid of the Sustentation Fund.

June 5th, 1872.

There was a celebration of the Holy Communion in the Cathedral at 9 a.m.

The Synod assembled for the transaction of business in St. George's Hall, at 10 a.m.

The proceedings were opened with prayer by the Ven. the Archdeacon.

The Bishop appointed George May, F. McAnnany, and D. Collins as the Committee to examine the certificates of the Lay Delegates.

That the Missions be divided into the five following classes, which will receive a sum not exceeding the sum respectively specified in each class—Class No. 1, \$100; Class No. 2, \$150; Class No. 3, \$200; Class No. 4 \$250; Class No. 5, \$300.

That there be appointed by the Mission Board, at its first meeting, a standing sub-committee, consisting of three clergymen and three laymen, to be called the Classification Committee, which shall meet previous to the meeting of the Mission Board in the month of May, to classify the Missions for the ensuing year, and report thereon to the Mission Board.

Class 3. The salaries of whose Missionaries shall not be less than \$600 per annum.

Each Mission shall be required to pay its Missionary a reasonable portion of his salary; the Mission Board, if its funds permit, making good the balance.

In order to the efficient working of this Canon an official shall be appointed by the Bishop, whose duty it shall be to visit the different Missions, and after due enquiry and consultation with the different vestry meetings to classify each Mission, and to report to the Board what portion of the Missionary's salary each Mission ought to contribute.

That the Mission Board shall grant aid only in accordance with said report.

That the remuneration of said official be two dollars a day and expenses while thus actually engaged, to be paid by the Mission in which he is engaged; but in case any Mission should fail to pay, then by the Mission Board, which shall make it a charge against the Mission neglecting to pay, and no grant shall be made to such Mission until such debt be refunded with interest by said Mission.

That it shall be the duty of said official to visit any Mission when required by the Bishop to do so.—Lost.

The Archdeacon's motion was then put and carried.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD

June, 1872.

"It is God that giveth the increase," and your Board desire gratefully to acknowledge that the experience of the past year testifies that Almighty God, the giver of every good and of every perfect gitt, has been graciously pleased to grant a continued increase to the funds of the Mission Board. It was indeed most reasonable to expect that such would be the case. The cause is the cause of God, of Christ and of his holy Church, and He who has promised to be with His Church, even unto the end of the world, might well be expected to bless the exertions of his faithful people for the advancement of his holy cause. Moreover the general prosperity of our country, and especially of the farming community, might well justify the expectation that our people would appreciate God's goodness towards them and would gratefully testify it by contributing more cheerfully and liberally than heretofore to the funds of an organization, whose highest end and aim is to promote the creatures' good and the Creator's glory. And blessed be God, these, our most reasonable anticipations, have been abundantly confirmed. The work of the Lord is gradually advancing amongst us. The Reports of the several Conveners of Deputations testify that the Lord's arm is not shortened, but that He is still blessing the good work and causing it to prosper in his hands. These reports are generally of an encouraging character,

Lewin, the Convener, reports that at Napanee a large and successful meeting was held, and an interesting feature of the meeting was the presentation of the Sunday School collections for the Mission Fund, amounting to the large sum of \$21.30. Two successful meetings were held in the promising Mission of Tamworth, where the debt on the Church has, by the energy of the Missionary, the Rev. Mr. Nimmo, been reduced during the past year, from \$1,600 to \$900. Three large meetings held at Odessa, Murvale and Sydenham testified to the unflagging zeal of the Missionary, the Rev. A. O'Loughlin. An awakened zeal on behalf of Church Missions was apparent in the Mission of Barriefield and Birmingham. Though the meeting in the Cathedral Church of St. George, Kingston, was not as largely attended as might have been reasonably anticipated, still the collection was in excess of last year's to the amount of \$5.22. Fifteen stations in all were visited; 375 miles travelled, and \$209.46 collected at the meetings.

Deputation No. 2.—Rev. J. Carroll, Convener.

Deputation No. 2 consisted of the Rev. K. L. Jones, C. H. Mockridge, and myself. The Rev. K. L. Jones was, however, unable to go out with the Deputation.

Our earlier meetings, I regret to state, were not attended with that degree of success which we were led to expect from the published reports of previous meetings. The cause has been attributed to the short notice given to the parishes at the head of the list. On this account the meeting appointed for Christ Church, Belleville, the first of the series, was postponed, at the request of the Incumbent, and that at Trenton was not so well attended as formerly.

Meetings were held at the following parishes and stations: -Trenton, Consecon, St. Paul's Mission, Carrying Place, Union School House, Gerron Gore, Hillier, Wellington, Milford, Picton, Marysburgh, Adolphustown, Fredericksburgh, Amherst Island, Bath, St. James's, Kingston; Portsmouth, and Christ Church, Belleville.

The meetings with few exceptions were well attended. At Carrying Place, Gerrow Gore, Hillier, Fredericksburgh, and Bath, the attendance was very large. At Picton it did not come up to its usual numbers, owing to its being held on Saturday evening. At Trenton, Carrying Place, and Picton we had the valuable assistance of lay brethren. We held seventeen meetings, and addressed about 2,000 people.

The amount collected was \$213.67.

The amount collected at their various meetings was \$126.24, being an increase of \$12.55. A very interesting meeting was held at Mill Bridge or Jordan, on the Hastings Road, where the members of the Church heard with great satisfaction of the initiatory movements in the Synod of the Diocese for a Mission Institute or House, with such missionary agencies emanating from it as would in a great measure meet the spiritual destitution as regards Church privileges of those great free grant roads and their adjoining townships in the far northern parts of the Diocese. The success of some of the meetings was materially lessened by storms. The adjourned meeting at Thomasburg was well attended.

Deputation No. 4.

The Rev. J. J. Bogert, Convener of Deputation No. 4, reports that in conjunction with the Revs. J. K. McMorine and A. Fisher, he held Missionary Meetings at Balderson's, Lanark, Rokeby, St. Stephens, Perth, Pike Falls, Montague, Smith's Falls, South Elmsley, New Boyne, Portland, Newboro', Leeds Rear, Lansdown Rear, Delta and Frankville. With one or two exceptions the attendance was good, and the amount collected, \$204.84, was nearly 20 per cent in excess of that of last year.

Deputation No. 5.

In consequence of the illness of the Convener and other members of Deputation No. 5, the Rev. C. E. Cartwright was its sole representative. His report is of a very encouraging character, and he received very efficient help at various places from Rev. Messrs. White, Merritt, Beaven, Irwin, Auston, Mulvany, and McMorine. At Franktown they had a hearty service and good music, the increase of the collection was also about 25 per cent over that of the previous year. At Almonte it exceeded by 40 per cent the collection of the previous year, and the handsome Church was crowded. So also were the Churches at Innisville and Carleton Place. At Clayton, likewise, notwithstanding unfavorable weather, there was a large congregation. At the third line of Fitzroy the collection was nearly four times that of the preceding year. An attentive audience in the pretty Church at Fitzroy Harbor, and another at the 9th Concession of Fitzroy responded liberally to the appeals made to them. The Convener concludes his report by bearing testimony to the good effect produced by commencing Missionary Meetings with the Evening Service of the Church, placing them on their proper footing as a religious duty.

The Rev. Mr. Anderson states that at all the stations visited, much interest appeared to be taken in the mission work of the Church, and the offerings made were all in excess of former years, except at Ottawa. His Excellency Lord Lisgar, who presided, made his usual annual offering. But one Mission, that of Osgoode, contributed to the Sunday School Mission Fund. This special offering does not appear to meet with the approval of the Clergy generally. It is to be hoped, however, that as its main object is to teach our children to give and to take interest in the cause, the Synod will adopt some course to induce all the Sunday Schools in the Diocese to unite in this good work. The stations visited were 16, and the amount collected, \$361.03.

Deputation No. 7.

The Convener of No. 7, the Rev. Mr. Preston, was assisted by the Rev. Messrs. Burke and Loucks, who were everywhere warmly welcomed, and all appeared to manifest that interest in the good cause which is increasing year by year in this Diocese. A pleasing incident occurred in the Parish of Williamsburg, where an aged member of the Church (who has since entered into his rest), in a prophetic spirit, anticipating that he might never have another opportunity, sent a \$20 gold piece as an offering to the Missionary cause. Special mention is made in this report of the progress of the good work in the Mission of Hawkesbury, where the collection of \$28 was seven-fold that of the preceding year. The Convener takes the opportunity of alluding particularly to the subject of Sunday School offerings. At Prescott, Iroquois, Moulinette and Kemptville such offerings were made. At Iroquois the children formed a procession, and headed by one of their number carrying a banner and singing a suitable hymn, advanced and made their offering and then retired singing the concluding verses of the hymn. At Kemptville, which is favourably known as having taken the lead in this good work, Mr. Leslie, the able Superintendent of the School stood surrounded by his pupils, two of whom, representing the respective sexes, presented their offerings amounting to the large sum of \$32.50. At Moulinette and Osnabruck childrens' offerings were presented by children for this laudable object. The Convener also mentions as an example worthy of imitation that at Cornwall and at Kemptville the Deputation was ably assisted by effective speeches from Lay Brethren, Judge Jarvis and Dr. Pringle at the former, and Mr. Leslie at the latter place, having delivered eloquent and appropriate addresses. The total amount collected by this Deputation was \$393.59. Deputation No. 8.

Maitland also deserves notice for its having twice doubled its collections of previous years. In 1870 the collection was \$10; in 1871 it was \$21; and in 1872. it gave \$41, being the most liberal offering, taking means and members into account, of any received by the Deputation. The Sunday School children of Merrickville, North Augusta, Maitland, Gananoque, and St. Paul's, Kingston, had held the Sunday School Mission Fund, would that we could say Missionary, in remembrance, and their united offerings amounted to \$60.75. Great stress in these Parishes was laid upon the necessity of doing something immediately with the funds on hand in order to ensure a continuance of the interest taken by the children in this good work.

Deputation No. 9.

The concluding Report is from the Rev. G. W. White, who states that he and the Rev. Mr. Cooke commenced their work at Arnprior and ended it at Pembroke. The total of their collections was \$69.59, a small advance upon last year. He considers, however, that the chief value of the Deputation work in the County of Renfrew consists in the opportunity of impressing upon the minds of the people the duty of giving, and in the information obtained for the more effective working of the Missionary portion of this Diocese. He urges most strongly the employment of a Travelling Missionary. He emphatically enforces the duty of greater Missionary exertions in that remote field, where, in consequence of railroad enterprise the County is being opened up, and the population greatly increasing. Now is the time for the Church to occupy the field lest there be a repetition of the sad history of neglect and loss, which must ever sadden us as we think of what the condition of the Church is, and of what it might have been in many of our older Counties. A Travelling Missionary should also visit the lumber shanties in the winter and give occasional services to the scattered settlements springing up on the Government Roads.

In the opinion of the Board the foregoing Reports may well justify it in thanking God for the past, and in hoping well for the future. Only let the members of the Church discharge their duty faithfully and with earnest prayer for the 1 ivine blessing, and we may not doubt but that God will be graciously pleased to grant the increase.

A sub-Committee of the Board, consisting of the Archdeacon, the Rev. Jas. A. Preston and Rev. G. W. White. W. B. Simpson, F. McAnnany, and S. Keefer were appointed to consider the question and to report to the Board, which they accordingly did, and their Report having been approved by the Board, it is now submitted as a part of this Report.

CLASSIFICATION OF MISSIONS.

The sub-Committee on the Classification of Missions beg leave to submit to the Board the following Report:-

The Classification in many respects has been made with reference to the fact that, even if adopted, it would not come into practical effect until confirmed by the Synod of 1873.

In connection with this subject it is proposed to submit to Synod a resolution for the appointment of a Classification Committee who shall continue from time to time to revise the lists just reported, as may be deemed advisable.

The Board desire again to draw attention to the small stipends of the Missionaries of the Board. The stipends which might have been deemed in some degree adequate twenty years ago, are now utterly inadequate to the respectable maintenance of a Clergyman. It may be safely stated that owing to the altered circumstances of the country, and the increased expenses of living, the sum of \$800 now is scarcely equal to the \$600 of 20 years ago; and certainly our congregations generally are far better able to pay \$800 now than they were 20 years ago to pay \$600. The Board would again, therefore, strongly reiterate the recommendation of last year's Report, that the salaries of the Missionaries should in no case be less than \$800. The Sunday School Mission Fund now amounts to \$594.01, and the Board would enlarge upon this subject but for the knowledge that it will by other means be brought prominently before the Synod during its present Session. A separate account has been opened for this fund.

But little alteration has occurred in the position of the Sustentation Fund since the last Report. It has, however, gradually increased by the

accumulation of interest until it now amounts to \$23,144.15; the annual interest of which, say \$1,388, at an average of 6 per cent, will tend to swell the amount. It is to be hoped also that so important a fund will occasionally at least receive bequests from the more wealthy members of our communion.

Thirty-six parishes had not up to April 1st made their returns to the Secretary. There is, however, some allowance to be made, as the fiscal year closes earlier than formerly, of which many of the parishes may not have been aware.

It is, however, greatly to be regretted that any negligence in this respect should occur, as it prevents the Board from making a full and complete return of the state of the Mission Fund.

On a comparison of the Audited Report, appended hereto, with that presented at the last Synod, it will be seen that the returns for sales exhibit a falling off. This is, in part, accounted for by the fact above mentioned, and also by the circumstance that during the previous year two Synods had been held, on which occasions a large amount of sales takes place.

At the same time your Committee regret that the Clergy and other members of the Church in the Diocese do not, more largely, avail themselves of the opportunities afforded by the Depository for the purchasing of books both for their own and for their parochial and Sunday School Libraries. An increased busines would enable the Committee entrusted with the management of the Institution to hold in hand an enlarged stock

Your Committee feel justified in pledging their successors in office to endeavour that the Books held in the Depository for sale shall be offered at the same prices at which they may be obtained elsewhere.

A step towards establishing Branch Depositories has been taken by issuing to the clergy at a considerable discount for cash, certain kinds of stock likely to find a ready sale; and they feel that this plan, if entered upon more fully, would be of much service, especially in the more remote portions of the Diocese.

Your Committee deem it their duty to inform the Synod that, under the powers conferred upon them by the Church, they have increased the percentage allowance on sales made to the manager from 10 to $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. As the usefulness of sound and wholesome literature is widely recognized in the present day, your Committee would venture to hope that the members of the Church in this Diocese will, more largely than before, bestow their patronage on an institution which stands in immediate connection with the organization of their Diocese.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSION HOUSES AND INCREASE OF THE MINISTRY.

The Committee appointed by the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario at its 10th Session, and to which were referred the resolutions of the Revs. W. Bleasdell, and K. L. Jones, on the establishment of Mission Houses and the increase of the Ministry, beg leave to report that it is highly desirable that a Mission House or Mission Houses should be established in this Diocese with the following objects:-

1st. To supply the ministrations of the Church in those parts of the Diocese where they are most needed.

2. To be a school for the practical training of young men for the ministry.

They think that a farm of at least 100 acres would be required, on which, if there were not suitable buildings, such might be erected as they were needed.

They would recommend that the Mission House be placed in charge of a Priest; and for his assistants—Priests, Deacons, and Lay Readers.

The Priest in charge would direct all matters in connection with the Mission House; superintend the studies, and assign the work of the young men placed under him; and establish and maintain the supervision of congregations within the bounds of the Mission.

They would recommend that young men should serve at the Mission House not less than three years, and there should be—

1st. Students, to be Lay Readers, receiving board and tuition.

2nd. Students, Deacons, receiving board, clothing, and tuition.

3r. Priests, Associates, receiving board and stipend.

The farm in connection with the Mission House would require an experienced farmer, whose wife could be housekeeper for the Mission House; and the Students should render such assistance on the farm as the Priest in charge should assign them.

The amount required for farm and buildings might be raised by special subscription, aided by grants from the Venerable S. P. C. K., S. P. G. and other Societies.

The Mission House would depend for support upon-

1st. The produce of the farm.

2nd. Grant from Mission Board.

3rd. Offerings of congregations within the Mission.

4th. Offerings from Churchmen within the Diocese and elsewhere.

INCREASE OF THE MINISTRY.

With regard to the increase of the Ministry your Committee think that the establishment of Mission Houses would greatly add to the supply of parochial Clergy—in men whose labours in the Mission Fields of the Diocese had given them much necessary experience; and the great success which the "Society for the Increase of the Ministry" in the United States has met, affords ground for expecting that a similar one in Canada would, with God's blessing, be successful likewise. The objects of such a Society would be to secure candidates for Holy Orders, and to provide

Your Committee venture to suggest that a Society formed with these objects might have an Annual Sermon preached, circulate tracts, etc., explanatory of its objects; and be greatly helped by the Clergy seeking out Lay-helpers who might become candidates for Holy Orders, &c.

The funds might be derived from subscriptions, donations, offerings, and bequests, and proceeds of an offertory after Annual Sermon (perhaps on Thanksgiving Day.)

Your Committee feel, however, that so important a matter needs more time than they have been able to devote to it, and would therefore simply beg of the Synod the approval of the principle of the formation of a Society for the increase of the Ministry; and that this part of the Report be then referred back to the Committee for further steps to that end.

REPORT COMMITTEE TOWHOMREFERRED THE MEMORIAL FROM HAWKES-BURY, NAPANEE, AND AMHERST ISLAND.

They recommend that the prayer of the Memorial of the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Hawkesbury, be granted, and that liberty be given them to sell the present parsonage lot, and apply the proceeds towards the erection of a parsonage house in the more suitable locality nearer the Church, and it is recommended that the Lord Bishop do execute to the purchaser of the present parsonage land the necessary deed.

With respect to the Memorial from the Rector of Napanee, your Committee recommend that, upon the transfer of the parsonage plot in the Memorial mentioned to the Incorporated Synod, the Incorporated Synod do sell and convey the said land, and, under the direction of the Rector of Napanee and the Churchwardens, apply the proceeds of the sale to the same purpose as under the original Trust, and that His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese do, on behalf of this Synod, execute the necessary deeds to the purchaser.

That as to the Memorial of the Incumbent and Churchwardens of St. James' Church, Amherst Island, the Bishop be authorized to lease the land in question on such terms as may be approved of by the Executive Committee.

The Assessment and Widows' and Orphans' Fund accounts were, at the above date, overdrawn—the former to the extent of \$562.10, the latter to the extent of \$292.10.

We found that the various fund balances in the bank books agreed with those in the books of the Treasurer and Clerical Secretary with the exception of the Rectory Lands' and Mission Funds.

The Bank balance of the Rectory Lands' Fund exceeds that in the Secretary's books by \$233.19, the amount of a cheque which has been issued by the Secretary, but had not been presented at the Bank.

The Bank balance of the Mission Fund exceeds that in the Secretary's books by the sum of \$100, owing to the fact that two cheques for \$50 each had not been presented at the Bank for payment when the account was balanced, and for a similar reason the Bank balance of the Divinity Students' Fund exceeds the Secretary's balance by the amount of an outstanding cheque for \$33.33.

We have examined the Clerical Secretary's books of account, and on this occasion have dispensed with the assistance usually given by a skilled

accountant. The payments were all regularly vouched by cheques, and in other respects the accounts seem to be correct.

There are two points, however, to which we feel it our duty to invite the attention of the Synod, they are these:—

The system of acknowledging the receipt of moneys so as to provide a proper check, is not satisfactory.

The system of Book-keeping imposed upon the Clerical Secretary is unnecessarily complicated, and instead of checking errors is calculated to produce them. We allude more particularly to the system of journalizing which is unnecessary in keeping the Synod accounts, composed, as they are, exclusively of cash transactions. The managers of the two leading banks in the city informed us that the banks have adopted a simple system which is quite sufficient even for the complicated transactions of such institutions, and has been found much superior to the old-fashioned system.

In justice to the Clerical Secretary we must say that he is not responsible for the introduction of the present cumbrous mode of book-keeping.

We hope that these important points will, during the present session of Synod, receive serious consideration.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

The Treasurer begs to submit the following statements:-



REPORT OF THE CLERGY TRUST COMMITTEE.

The anticipations of the last year's Report, with regard to an increased surplus of income above expenditure, have been in a great degree realized, and the Board is now enabled to state, with some degree of certainty, that the next annual Report will show not only that there will be the necessary surplus of \$1,000 before a distribution of surplus can take place, but that there will be on the 30th of April next an additional surplus of \$750, so that in all probability the Committee will be enabled to recommend, at the Committee Meeting in September next, that the senior claimant should be placed upon the list as a recipient of \$400 per annum according to the Canon for the distribution of the surplus. Moreover, as the Debentures of the City of Hamilton and Town of St. Thomas will increase their annual income by the sum of \$585 from the 1st of April, 1874, there is no reason apparent to your Board why, at that date, if not before, two more clergymen should not be placed upon the list.

Since the last Annual Report a number of investments have been made, as the Treasurer's Report will show, so that we are no longer obliged to record, as was done last year, that the sum of \$14,000 was only yielding 4 per cent on deposit notes. The Secretary's Report to your Chairman shows that \$4,000 only remains to be invested.

REPORT ON THE SALE OF RECTORY LANDS.

The Clerical Secretary begs to submit the following Annual Report on the sale of the Rectory Lands in the Diocese of Ontario.

Since the last Report submitted to the Synod, the following lands have been sold:—

1. RECTORY OF KINGSTON.

Several parcels of land belonging to this Rectory have been sold, and have realized the sum of \$13,000. Of this amount, the sum of \$5,149.49 has been secured by mortgages on the property bearing interest at 7 per cent; the balance has been invested in County Debentures yielding 6 per cent interest.

2. RECTORY OF AUGUSTA.

Application was made for permission to sell the lands belonging to this Rectory. The lands were accordingly valued, and offered to the tenants at the valuation, with whom a sale was at once effected. This Rectory comprises 450 acres, which have been sold for the sum of \$9,750. The amount thus realized has been secured by mortgages on the lands, covering a principal of \$6,946.08, and bearing 7 per cent interest. The balance has been invested in County Debentures and Deposit Receipt, Bank of Montreal.

3. RECTORY OF PICTON.

Application was made to sell the lands belonging to this Rectory. A valuation has taken place, and the Rectory found to contain about 400 acres, valued at \$5,159. No sale has yet been made of these lands.

4. RECTORY OF BATH.

The lands belonging to this Rectory, comprising 482 acres, have been valued at \$13,878. Of the lands thus valued, 310 acres have been sold to the tenants realizing the sum of \$9,128. Of this amount, \$4,904.47 has been secured by mortgages on the property; the balance has been invested in County Debentures and Deposit Receipt.

5. RECTORY OF ADOLPHUSTOWN AND FREDERICKSBURGH.

The Rectory Lands Committee having given consent to the sale of the lands belonging to this Rectory, a valuation was made, and sale of the lands to the tenants has been effected. This Rectory comprises 393 acres, the sale of which has realized the sum of \$10,889.50. Of this amount,

7. RECTORY OF RICHMOND.

The whole of the lands belonging to this Rectory, 400 acres, have been disposed of, realizing the sum of \$6,399.86. Of this, the sum of \$4,572.97 has been secured by mortgages; the balance invested in County Debentures, Dominion Stock, and Deposit Receipt.

8. RECTORY OF CORNWALL.

The whole of the lands belonging to this Rectory, valued at \$4,250, have been sold. Of the amount thus realized, \$1,557 has been secured by mortgages on the property, the balance invested in Sterling Debentures, Dominion Stock and County Debentures.

9. RECTORY OF PERTH.

The lands belonging to this Rectory, comprising about 200 acres, have been valued at the sum of \$6,300. Only a portion of the lands have, as yet, been sold, to the extent of \$1,974. The amount thus realized has been invested in the usual class of securities.

10. RECTORY OF KEMPTVILLE.

The lands belonging to this Rectory, comprising about \$500 acres, were valued at \$11.350. The sales of land effected to the present have realized the sum of \$6,379.98. Of this, the sum of \$5,304.16 has been secured by mortgages on the land sold; the balance has been invested in Dominion Stock and County Debenture.
