and there are now 10 houses in England, 42 branches in England and Scotland, and one branch in Canada (at Winnipeg) and groups of correspondents in Canada (at Montreal, Toronto, Saskatoon, and Vancouver), in New York and Philadelphia, Newfoundland, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, British West and East Africa, India, Ceylon, France, China, Japan, Mexico, Singapore, Gibraltar, Malta, and Jamaica.

It should be pointed out that TOC H is not an association of war veterans—it looks to the future; all young men over 18 years of age are eligible for membership. A description of a TOC H residential house shows in the full way the manner in which the movement functions. The house serves as a home for 20 or 30 men who are chosen for their diversity in occupation and income.

TOC H does not wish to compete with other social movements or clubs, but only desires to supplement them. It helps to find scout masters, workers in men's clubs and such like. Each branch has a "jobmaster," whose duties are to receive applications and find the workers in the branch. It is almost needless to say that women have been asked to help in the movement.

TOC H is a post-war social movement for young men with the two-fold aim of fellowship and service. It owes its name to Gilbert Talbot, a young man of great promise, who was killed at Hooge, near Ypres, in July, 1915.

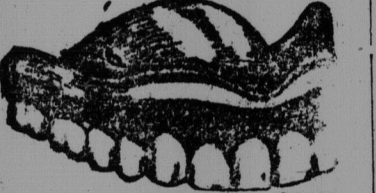
