TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF
THE TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM,
OR
INDUSTRIAL HOUSE OF REFUGE.

In presenting the twenty-fourth annual report, we wish to place before the friends of the Home a simple, unvarnished statement of the year's work. Were there much more to discourage us, we would still begin another year's work with renewed energy.

It is impossible for those who love Christ sincerely to refrain from seeking to bring others under the transforming and purifying influence of His religion. The more degraded and sin-bound we find them, the more earnestly do we strive for this. They come to us, these wretched ones, asking for food, for shelter, for clothing, and we are glad God gives them these blessings through us; but we are not satisfied unless their hearts turn to Him, seeking for that which will satisfy the hunger of their souls, and shelter them from the tempest of sin. We must believe with our whole hearts that the Gospel is for these wretched ones who are tossed on the dark stream of sin, as well as for those whose paths lie beside the still waters; and that its truths can take possession of and purify even such dark sinful souls. There is too much practical scepticism on this point, and it takes the power from our work.

On the 1st of January, 1878, there were 35 inmates of the Home; 76 have been received since, making 111. Of these, 22 have gone to service, 27 left before their time expired, 7 sent to the Burnside Hospital, 2 to the General Hospital, 5 to their friends, 3 have died, 2 went to the Home of the Good Shepherd, 1 went to the Infants' Home, 2 sent out for insubordination; leaving 40 in the Home on the 1st of January, 1879.

We have heard from time to time from some of those who have been in the home in the past. One writes from her mother's home : " It is so good to be with mother, and to be doing right." One who had been in and out several times wrote twice to a long tried friend of this Home, expressing thanks to the ladies for " their kind and tender care." She also says : " If I could only put my sins out of my sight and begin a new life, I know the great and merciful God is able to take them all away." One of our girls whom we had learned to trust was called to Michigan to claim a thousand dollars left to her. We felt that with so much money she might be led astray. She stayed there all summer, keeping house for her brothers. Wishing the companionship of a friend in the Home, she sent money to pay her expenses to her. In the autumn she came back with her friend, bringing a valuable present to the new Matron. She gave her money to Mr. Alcorn for investment, and went to service. Her reasons for not remaining with her brothers were that they were trying to urge her into a mercenary marriage. To one of those who died in the Home the message came swiftly and suddenly, but we had reason to think she was prepared. One came in from the street and was in the Refuge only a few days when she died from the effect of exposure and dissipation. Such a case is its own awful commentary. One woman came to us several months ago asking to be taken in for a year. On being asked why she, a strong, active woman, capable of earning her own living, wished to come to the Refuge, she replied, " Its to get away from the drink. I tell you I'm a fool ; I can earn my ten dollars a month, and have always done so, but I drink it all up, and I came here to try to get off the drink." Her anger against herself was almost tragical in its fierceness. Rarely do we find those who blame the right person, as she did.

On the 1st of July we were obliged to part with Mrs. Aiken, who for ten years had so faithfully performed the duties of matron. Her departure was a great cause for regret to herself, as well as to the managers of the Home. Her place was filled by Mrs. Spence, who had for a short time held the position of Assistant Matron. Mrs. Spence undertook her duties with considerable diffidence, feeling it would be no easy task to take Mrs. Aiken's place. But, almost contrary to our expectations—for we felt we had some explosive material—everything seemed to move on as calmly and systematically as ever. And to those who have been

here every week, Mrs. Spence seems to have succeeded admirably in keeping harmony and order. The position of Assistant Matron was filled by Mrs. Rowe, of Port Hope, who came to us warmly recommended by her minister, Dr. O'Meara, and by several others who knew her well. She has charge of the sewing department, and her quiet, gentle deportment cannot fail to exert a beneficial influence upon those about her.

The laundry is efficiently managed at present. Mrs. Spence has one of the inmates in charge under her, who is untiring in her zeal. The aim of the managers has ever been to have the washing and sewing well done, not only for the sake of giving satisfaction to those who send work to be done, but also to train the inmates in habits of industry and neatness. It is lamentable how many girls who come to us can do nothing well, and seem to have received no training except in sin.

The Sabbath services, morning and evening, have been conducted by laymen; and we wish to again express our appreciation of their kindness and faithfulness. The managers thought it would be well to have a short afternoon service, conducted by ministers of different denominations, and have succeeded in finding eight ministers, living in the northern part of the city, who have kindly consented to take this service in turn. The singing has been taken in charge by a young lady, who makes this part of the service most enjoyable.

Notwithstanding the hard times, the managers acknowledge with thankfulness that owing to the continued support of the friends of the institution they have this year reduced the debt on the building \$1,100. There now remains a debt of only \$400.

Feeling that Dr. Geikie had been taxed too much in his attendance at the Home the Managers offered to release him, conveying to him their appreciation of his valuable services. Dr. Geikie expressed his undiminished interest in the Home, but owing to the pressure of other duties would be glad to resign his position. Dr. Britton kindly consented to take his place.

The inmates have earned during the year \$865.34.

The weight of this world's sin and misery rests heavily on all Christian hearts. When we see those who have been shown the right way deliberately choosing the way of temptation and sin, we catch the reflection, but ah! so faintly, of the dark shadow which swept over Christ's heart when He said, "Ye will not

come to me that ye might have life." In all departments of Christian work there are plenty of causes for discouragement, if we are seeking human approval, or human gratitude. If we think the proportion of those who really reform is small compared with the number of those we have under our care, let us remember that our Divine Lord and Example is touched with us in all our feeling of discouragement at human ingratitude and sin. He, the great Healer, with a deeper sadness than ever our hearts can know, had reason to say, "Were there not ten cleansed, but where are the nine?"
