In Which He Advocated a Political Union with the United States.  
HIS SIMPLE PLAN FOR RECONCILING ALL DIFFERENCES.  
By Giving up Everything to the Americans, Including Our Flag and Constitution  
(From the Globe, Dec. 14, 1887.)

There is one simple way by which the whole trouble over the fisheries and all the other troubles on this continent between Great Britain and the United States can be settled. We invite Mr. Chamberlain's attention to it as being simpler than reciprocity, restricted or unrestricted, that commercial union, than anything else that can be proposed, and that is by a political union of Canada and the United States. By union of this kind, all the troubles between the American and the British colony will become one to the immense benefit of the mother country, to the advantage of Canada, and to the satisfaction of the United States. The people will then have one common interest, and Great Britain will be strengthened where she is now weak. She is now weak because, as against the United States, Russia, France or any other power with a navy, she would have to defend these colonies in case of war. She would be strengthened on this continent by the fact that five millions of loyal Canadians would be her citizens, the United States and the people in all matters would give preference to the mother land over every other land but their own. Canadians to-day. What is there to keep these two people apart, quarrelling over the petty questions which they quarrel over, whether they shall fish on this side or the other of a three mile line, whether they shall charge each other two cents duty on iron cans, whether they shall be governed through a government of their own, or whether they shall be responsible to a parliament or directly to the people? They speak the same language, they have the same literature, they worship around the same altars, they are of the same race, they intermarry, live in each other's homes, visit each other at their homes, in their fraternal organizations, and are so near alike in every way that they cannot tell where they differ. Why are they apart? Whatever was the original cause, the reason for separation exists only as a sentiment to-day. Let any reasonable man soberly consider the question, and he will exist for a dividing line and he cannot answer it to his own satisfaction. To the Canadian fall of national aspiration and seeking to be a nation, there can be no dividing line. If he think of the matter at all he must reflect how foolish it is for generation after generation of Canadians to show their independence when they can at once, by removing the boundary line, enter into the full citizenship of an American. All that that opens before them is science, in law, in literature, in politics, in the work of religion, in the national greatness which appeals to the higher nature of man to fill up the measure of the best work he can do for mankind and for God.
