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AN UNFUL STORY OF THE SEA.

SAVING CAPTAINS BY THE SEA. Bathurst, October 25.—Capt. Graves, former and Ludwig Lohr, seaman, survivors of the crew of the steamship Earnshaw tell a horrible story of the way they sustained life by cannibalizing for days. Later says: "The only food we had the first fifteen days in the boat was a flying fish and a few small birds divided among eleven men. The sixteenth day, William Davis, a seaman, caught me by the throat and made a dash at my head with a knife. He cut me on the right cheek, the scar from which still remains. He was told to kill me by August Plauge, a seaman. When Davis began to cut me some of my companions caught him, while others attacked him. He was then thrown overboard. No one saw him go down. We were starving."
