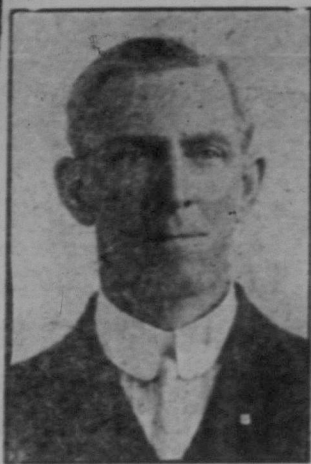

THERMOMETER DROPS TO 32 BELOW.

Regina Weather:

 Regina is shivering in the grip of the coldest spell yet experienced this winter. The lowest temperature was experienced Sunday morning when the mercury fell to 32 degrees below zero. A stiff wind during the day, however, had the effect of raising the temperature, and the middle of the afternoon the maximum of ten degrees below zero was reached. With sundown the mercury retracted its steps and at ten o'clock Monday night it was reported to be 24 below.
 The minimum of 32 degrees below zero was reported Sunday morning both from the Parliament buildings and from the R.N.W.M.P. barracks, it is believed to have been the coldest weather experienced in November in many years.

LITTLE UNEMPLOYMENT IN SASKATCHEWAN

Despite the advent of severe weather and the cessation of agricultural activities, there is comparatively little unemployment in Saskatchewan at present, according to figures submitted by the Saskatchewan bureau of labor for the week ending Saturday, Nov. 22.

During the week there were applications for employment from 1,270 men and women and of this number 859 found work, leaving a balance of approximately 400 unprovided for at the end of the week.

G.T.P. OFFICE BURNED TO GROUND

The Grand Trunk despatcher's office at the G.T.P. yards, North Regina, is a total loss as a result of a fire which occurred at the yards. The fire occurred outside the city limits, but the Regina fire department responded, and more than 1,200 feet of hose was laid. The loss has not been estimated.

PFEIFFER STRUCK FROM BARRISTERS' ROLL

The name of John Pfeiffer was struck from the barristers' roll of Saskatchewan by order of the judges of the Court of Appeal here. Action in the Pfeiffer case was taken about four months ago and at the last sittings of the Court of Appeals he was suspended. The Saskatchewan Bar association at this sitting of the court, asked for his name to be struck from the lists and the Court of Appeal has directed along this line.

BIG GOLD SHIPMENT

Guarded by a well armed military escort numbering a hundred, millions of dollars worth of gold bullion passed through Regina from the east to Japan last week. The valuable freight was carried in special cars by the C.P.R.

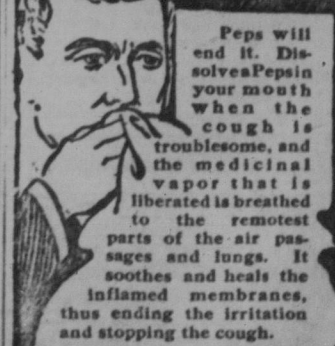
