Archbishop Francesco Pellegrino Stagni, the distinguished Catholic churchman and apostolic delegate to Canada and Newfoundland, was born at Budrio, Italy, fifty-five years ago today, April 2, 1859. From his early youth he was destined for the service of the church, and at fifteen he took the robe of a member of the Order to be continued to fit himself for a cleri-cal career, but he returned to Rome to' complete his theological education. After his ordination to the priesthood he was placed at the head of a popu-lous parish of the Service Pathers in London. His zeal and learning attracted the attention of the church authorities at Rome, and in 1893 he was recalled to the Eternal City to assume the post of professor of phil osophy at the Propaganda. A few years later the Servites of Mary chose him as their Superior General and in that capacity he accomplished much toward developing the order in looping the 1907 from the hand of Pope Pins X.
