It gives us much pleasure to note the gift from Mr. Willson Howard, to St. Alban's, of five gallons of wine for sacramental purposes.

When the Chapel was built a retable was carved for it by Miss Pidcock, then a member of the congregation, but subsequently living in England. Since the Chapel has become more School than Chapel, it has been thought that this handsome piece of work hardly had the full use which the donor expected it would, and that it would be much more worthy of a place in the cheir than the one in use there. It has therefore been fitted to the altar in the choir.
