A special Ordination Service was held at the Cathedral on Tuesday, 29th September, (S. Michael's and All Angels) when the Rev. Robert Barrington Nevitt was advanced to the priesthood.

It gives us much pleasure to note the gift from Mr. Willson Howard, to St. Alban's, of five gallons of wine for sacramental purposes.

When the Chapel was built a retable was carved for it by Miss Pidcock, then a member of the congregation, but subsequently living in England. Since the Chapel has become more School than Chapel, it has been thought that this handsome piece of work hardly had the full use which the donor expected it would, and that it would be much more worthy of a place in the choir than the one in use there. It has therefore been fitted to the altar in the choir. As this change seemed to give an opportunity for a somewhat larger use of flowers in the adornment of the altar, an additional pair of brass vases has been given, so that that may be done when desired.

THE SCHOOL.

The number of scholars in September 1902, was 73, which increased to 83 in June last. The number now is 57.

The growth of the School has made an increase in the staff necessary, and Mr. George Graham, Gold Medallist, London, Ont., Normal School, has been appointed an assistant master.
