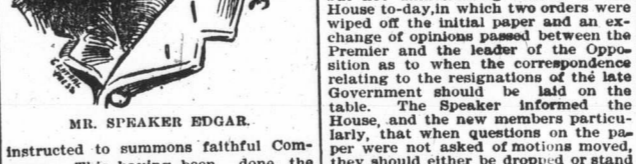

### AN IMMENSE CROWD

Witnessed the Opening of Parliament Thursday.  
The Weather was Beautiful and Parliament Bill was Thoroughly Discussed in the House—Speech from the Throne—Business of the First Day was Only Routine.

Ottawa, Aug. 23.—The first session of the eighth Parliament of Canada will be formally opened to-morrow, the preliminary business of electing a Speaker having been attended to today.

The Senate adjourned during the recess, when Sir Henry Strachan entered the chair in his capacity as Deputy Governor, and black rod was

Instructed to summons faithful Commons. This having been done, the Commons were duly informed that his Excellency did not see fit to declare the reasons for summoning Parliament to be held at Ottawa. He informed the faithful Commons that he would not be present at the opening of Parliament, but that the members of the Commons should either be dropped or stand at the request of the House.

On a motion to adjourn, Mr. Laurier stated with regard to the correspondence between the late Prime Minister and the Governor-General, which Sir Charles Tupper had asked for yesterday, the Government had the honor to inform that the correspondence should be brought down as soon as the address.

Dr. Bourne put the motion to the House and declared Mr. Edgar duly elected Speaker.

The new Speaker was thereupon escorted to the dais by Mr. Laurier and Sir Richard Cartwright. He was placed on a chair of state, and the ceremony was completed.

The new Speaker, standing on the second step of the dais, conveyed to the House the most important message from the high honor done him by electing him as Speaker. He said that it was his duty to endeavor to discharge his office with the greatest care and fidelity, and to be guided by the example of his predecessors.

Havana, Aug. 23.—Colonel Albergotti reports that after an engagement which lasted five hours his command captured a rebel fortified camp located near Aguacate, Province of Matanzas. The rebels lost nine killed and 28 wounded.

ALMOST ACROSS THE ATLANTIC IN THEIR ROWBOAT, THE FOX.

The Darling Fish of Two Norwegian Ballerons - They are Spoken Of Slightly to Have, France.

A dispatch from the signal station on the Scilly Islands stated on August 11 that the rowboat Fox passed there at 11 o'clock in the morning.

"We'll meet you all in Havre or in heaven," were the parting words of George Harbo when on June 6, the little double-pointed cork boat, containing Miss Harbo and her brother, started out from the boatman's basin at the Battery, New York.

None who heard Harbo's parting shout and noted the broad grin on his face believed either of the two Norwegian sailors would reach Havre.

"Never before had a transatlantic trip been attempted in a rowboat," it was small wonder that Samuelson's sister, Lena, a pretty girl of twenty, stood on the pier watching her hands in an agony of grief for the two little boats.

Harbo, who is twenty-seven years old, had repeatedly declared that he would accomplish the trip in sixty days by rowing a boat.

He has had many very thrilling experiences during his life in aerial navigation. In 1889, while making an ascension at Millard, Michigan, he was hanged against the steeple of the Episcopal church, corner Main and Market streets.

Harbo and Samuelson have followed the sea almost from boyhood, and are practical navigators as well as seamen. The boat in which they have made the perilous passage was a simple one, but was a boat of five feet and drew exactly eight inches of water.

Fair weather has prevailed since the little craft left New York and not a single mishap apparently has overtaken the two intrepid balloonists.

The men, who were still in good health, were apparently in good health. No mishap of any kind had befallen the boat. Captain Clausen gave the men a fresh supply of water and told them their bearings and then sailed away on his course.

On reaching Havre they expect to exhibit their boat and reap a rich harvest. They will also go to various other European resorts for the same purpose.

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BALLOON ASCENSION. When Others Fail.

On the Second and Third Days of Unionville Fair. SEPT. 17 AND 18

Aeronaut Leo Stevens, whose reputation as a balloonist is known in all parts of the world, and who made the successful ascension at the diamond in Bellefonte on Wednesday, July 8, is a remarkable young man in many ways.

There was a space sixty feet square roped off to keep the crowd back and prevent accidents. Some time was taken to inflate the large silken structure, and at the set time, 5:15 p. m., the balloon was filled to its utmost capacity and aeronaut Leo Stevens was ready for his dangerous trip to the clouds.

The large balloon was swaying violently, as if anxious to leave, and suddenly the black clouds came up and rain began to fall. Remarks were heard on all sides that he would not go up. But the aeronaut was determined not to disappoint the crowd, and yelled to his assistants to let go, and in an instant he was rising above the hosannas on his way to the regions above, climbing higher and higher until he looked like a mere speck.

Leo Stevens was born in Cleveland, Ohio, on the 27th of Sept., 1871. He stands 5 feet 5 1/2 inches and balances the scales at 143 lbs. He commenced ballooning when he was but 11 years of age. His first ascension was made at Beyerly's Park in his native city, in 1882.
