THE ELECTRIC LIGHT IN TORONTO.

The chief structure in course of erection is a large frame shed, to be covered with corrugated iron. The greater part of this building will be taken up by the engine and dynamo rooms. The front of the building will be taken up by the engine and dynamo rooms. The front of the building will be utilized as workshop, office, storerooms, etc. A lofty platform will be erected overlooking the whole of the works. At the end of this large shed will be a 6-foot roadway separating the works from the boiler house. The latter will be of brick, 40 feet by 52 feet. The chimney, or smokestack, is of large size. It is 5 feet equare from bottom to top, and the height 110 feet. The whole is built on substantial piles, and was a somewhat costly undertaking, the piles for the wharfage going as far as the windmill line.

The new premises will be fitted with all the most improved appliances. The dynamo room, is 160 by 60 feet, and the motive power will consist of four Brown automatic cut-off engines of 150 horse-power each, and one 50 horse-power Armington & Sima. An independent condenser and sir pump, driven by a separate direct-acting engine, will be used, of sufficient capacity to take the exhaust from all the engines; and automatic relief valves will be provided, so that in the event of any mishap to the condensing apparatus there will be no storpage of the engines. But the point to notice is that all such seizures, when founded on actual offenses, enormously strengthen the Canadian side of the fishery dispute. The argument of our Government has all along been that the presence of our fishermen in Dominion waters for such purposes as procuring bait, buying supplies, and shipping or fanding men has nothing necessarily to do with fishing in the prohibited waters. The Canadians insist, on the contrary, upon their full treaty rights of exclusion, as they understand them, on the ground that the presence for trade purposes may be the cover for fishing, and that should American fishing vessels be allowed for trade purposes to go within the three-mile limit they would misuse this fiberty for taking mackerel, and when watched would pretend that they were not there for the purpose of fishing. It has been extremely important for our Government to show that this imputation upon the good faith of our fishermen is undeserved, and that at least this reason for Canada's inhospitable socion is unfounded. It need hardly be said that such incidents as the late seizures off Souris do not assist our Government in this contention.
