FIRST TO ASK, LAST TO JOIN

THE NEWFOUNDLAND POSITION REGARDING UNION

The Delegates Banqueted—Hon. Mr. Boardman Deals With the Whole Question of Federation and Endeavored to Reconcile Sir Mackenzie Bowell's Desire to see Confederation Completed.

Ottawa, April 9.—The citizens' banquet to the visiting delegates from Newfoundland in the Russell House to-night was one of the most brilliant social gatherings ever held at the Capital. About 150 guests sat down under the presidency of Mayor Borthwick. Among the guests present, in addition to Messrs. Boardman, Morris, Emerson and Horwood, from Newfoundland, were the Governor-General, Sir Mackenzie Bowell, Sir A. P. Caron, Messrs. Haggart, R. N. Scott, Curran, Curran, and West, Judge Mackay and others. The dining-room had been magnificently decorated with flags, bunting and shields, and a fresh bouquet of flowers was placed on the table. The banquet was a very successful one, and was attended with interest and enthusiasm.

In reply to the toast of his health, which was proposed by the chair, Lord Aberdeen said that the occasion on which they were gathered was highly commendable. As neighbors and fellow-countrymen, he might use the term, it was proper that they should give the delegates a hearty welcome to the city. In consideration, he said that no doubt very soon a satisfactory solution would be arrived at. That was about all that he could say in regard to the subject, which was still under consideration. It was proposed that the delegates be entertained by the city, and that the Government should be invited to send a delegation to Newfoundland.

Gibraltar of the St. Lawrence.
Sir James Grant, in proposing the toast of "Our Gibraltar," said that Newfoundland occupied the same position in the mouth of the St. Lawrence as Gibraltar did in the Mediterranean, and therefore the importance of its becoming part of Canada was apparent. He spoke of the value of the Newfoundland fisheries, and added that there was no time when Canada was looking forward to a union with Newfoundland. He said that the Government was absolutely necessary for the maintenance of power and prestige in the empire, and that Newfoundland was one of the links which connected the chain between England and India.

Hon. Robert Borden, in reply, said that it was not the first time that he had been the recipient of the hospitality of the hands of the people of Canada. He referred to the time when he met Sir John Thompson and other Canadian delegates at Halifax in 1892, and afterwards touched upon the geography of Canada, and the fact that the Government intended increasing the excise tax on whisky, which led to a rush to release a large quantity of spirits from bond.

TIRED OF HAVING THE BLUES

MERCHANTS SAY TRADE IS DIMINISHING AND RESERVE BANK IS WAG.

A Series of Interviews With Prominent Merchants in All Branches of Trade Reveals the Fact That Business is Looking Up—Rock Bottom Prices, Economy and Caution Have Had a Good Effect.

In the Easter trade rejuvenescence of things in general the merchants look forward to the restoration of trade. A World reporter made the rounds of the business districts yesterday and found a general hopeful tone existing. Almost without exception they look forward to a larger and healthier spring trade than had been expected in the past. The general reasons on which they base their prophecies are the facts that prices have got down to rock-bottom and appreciation must follow, and that the rigid economy and caution which have been practiced have put things on a healthy basis.

In the Grocery Trade.
Col. Davidson of the firm of Davidson & Hay said that the outlook is much more hopeful than it was a year ago. Our business during the last three months has been a great increase upon the trade for the same period of 1894. Payments are coming in very well and we participate in the increase. The only thing that is worrying us is the fact that the roads are opened up. At the present time they are impassable out in the country and the business is suffering for want of goods. In the city trade seems good also, and the merchants are overstocked and sagging off, but they are not so worried as they were a year ago. They have now stocks of proper dimensions, and are selling at firm prices. The fact that the roads are opened up is a good effect. I fancy that people have got tired of the blues, and are going to shake them.

FORGED U.S. POSTAGE STAMPS

HAMILTON THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE COUNTERFEITERS.

Millions of Letters Carried in the American Mails Stamped With Bogus Two-Cent Stamps—The Factory Said to Be Located in a Novelty Company's Premises in Hamilton.

Chicago, April 9.—A package of counterfeit stamps, which was mailed yesterday by Government officials, and addressed to Nathan Hoffman, a cigar dealer in the rotunda of the Chamber of Commerce. They were shipped by express from Buffalo to the Canadian Novelty Company, of Hamilton, Ontario. When a messenger brought the package Mr. Hoffman examined it, and finding the stamps were counterfeit refused to receive them. He then telephoned the U.S. Marshal at Buffalo, and reported the matter. Four packages similar to the one here reported were delivered by the express to the same address. They were addressed, paying for them without raising any objections.

Mr. Hoffman, who is maintaining his innocent connection with the scheme, "I dispose of about \$100 worth of stamps daily of evildoers being the tenants of the Chamber of Commerce. They buy the stamps from wholesale dealers and firms who are in the business. They get a small discount. I saw an advertisement in the Chicago newspaper a week ago last Sunday, reading: 'I will buy 100,000 stamps which we cannot use here. Will send by express on Friday next for examination, for \$100. Canadian Novelty and Supply Co., Hamilton, Ont.'"

"I answered the advertisement, writing that I would take all the stamps they had at that figure. In reply I received a letter saying they could not let me have more than \$300 worth a month. They added that they were making the first shipment Friday via Buffalo so as to save the expense of sending the stamps across the line. An express messenger brought the packages yesterday. On examining the stamps I found the color light and I suspected they were counterfeit. I told the messenger that I need not be afraid, as he had delivered for me a large quantity within an hour and had received pay without hesitation. As the Hamilton office was notified, the stamps could be supplied each month. I knew then the stamps were counterfeit and I obtained possession of the packages."

Captain Porter of the Packet Service has 25,700 of the bogus stamps in his possession, the packages delivered to the other four Chicagoans having been secured. Captain Porter is in possession of the names of the other counterfeiters, as all are innocent of wrongdoing. All are being sent to the U.S. Marshal at Buffalo and in Canada were notified. It is believed the counterfeiters will result in the escape of the gang.
