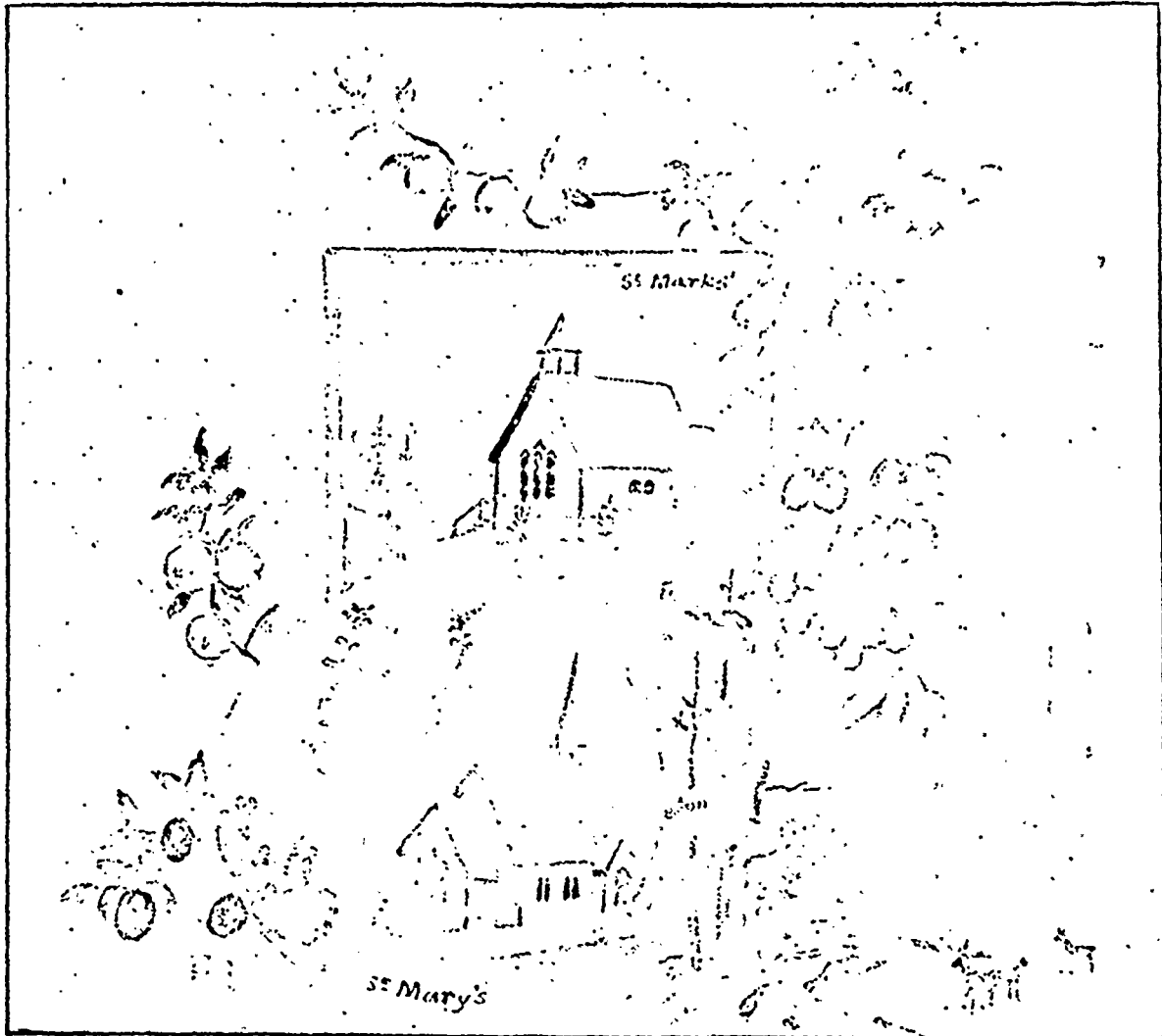

## CHURCH SERVICES:

**St. Mark's Church, Vancouver**—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3.30 p.m. On all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs—evening service 7.30 p.m. Choir practice, St. Mark's, every Saturday evening.

**North End School**—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

**Beaver Point School**—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

**St. Mary's Church, Fairford**—Morning service 10.30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. Evening service the first Sunday of the month 7.30 p.m.

**Home Sunday School**—Children prepare Sunday School lessons in their own homes. Bible questions are given in *Parish and Home*. Instruction and examinations at their homes every two months.

**Ladies' Church Guild**—Meets once a month.

An interesting address on sheep was given by Dr. Withycombe, vice-director of the Oregon Agricultural College, at a meeting of the Farmers' Institute at the public hall, Tuesday, the 22nd ult.

Weather Report for April, 1900.—Kuper Island: Mean temperature, 49.4; maximum (on the 30th), 82.1; minimum (on the 10th), 29.9; mean ratio of bright sunshine, .468; maximum (on the 20th), .885; days completely clouded, 3; frost on 8th, 9th, 10th and 17th; rainfall, 1.65 inches.

At a meeting held at the public hall on the 12th ult. the following committee was appointed to manage the telephone service on Salt Spring Island: J. P. Booth, M.P.P., president; P. Purvis, secretary; Joel Broadwell, treasurer; Frank Scott, A. L. Wilson, A. R. Bittancourt, Fred. Bittancourt, S. Conery, Jos. Nightingale, directors. Two tenders for keeping the wires, etc., in repair for the year were received, and Keith Wilson's being the lowest (\$68) was accepted. Each holder of a telephone is to subscribe \$5.00 per annum. Central to be paid \$3.00 per annum for each instrument operated. Messages from the Valley to be charged 25 cents each time.

Fruit trees of all descriptions have been loaded with blossoms, and are now developing the young fruit in great abundance.

Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Tolson and Mrs. C. W. Tolson and her two little children arrived home from England on the 5th ult.

Mrs. Walter, wife of Lieut. Walter, of H. M. S. *Egeria*, is spending the summer at Mrs. Morton's boarding house, Ganges Harbour.

Mr. Towler, of Mount Pleasant, Vancouver, offers four pair of thoroughbred fowls as prizes at the next agricultural show to be held on Salt Spring Island.

There were no special festivities on Salt Spring Island on the Queen's Birthday, the pleasure seekers being for the most part away to Victoria to join in the celebration there.

Mr. Borradaile has purchased Mrs. C. W. Tolson's property at Ganges Harbour, consisting of house and 160 acres of land. Mrs. Tolson, with her two children, has settled in at the old home with her parents.

The offertories for the year at St. Mark's Church were, for the clergyman, \$152.50; Mission Fund, \$37.30; widows and orphans, \$7.55; foreign missions, \$13.40.
