

The action of the board of control in blocking the proposed, extensive improvements at Ward's Island has not met with the general approbation of the aldermen, and it is asserted that the clause in the lease to be granted the hotel company, prohibiting the sale of liquor on the property, will be struck out by the council and the question of a license left with the board of license commissioners. The vote against

license commissioners. The vote against the proposed prohibition it is prophesied will be greater than was that against the reduction of licenses in January, when only ten members could be secured to favor the restriction.

Dr. Noble, who was paired in favon of license reduction with Ald. Stewart, will not support the board of control on this deal. He said yesterday: "It think the board of control is wrons. If there are any licenses to be granted in this city they should be given to the large hotels, such as the King Edward and the one proposed for Ward's. The undestrable features that are connected with low dives would not come from such a place, for a large hotel could not tolerate rowdyism. Then this is a large enterprise and should be incouraged by the city."

Ald. Harrison says he will support the action of the board. He lived over at Ward's Island a portion of the summer, and said there were many visitors there who would look with disfavor on the granting of a liquor license. He did not think very highly of the hotel scheme, anyway.

The license commissioners could not grant more than the number of licenses authorized by council, and an hotel at Ward's would certainly be an improvement on many of the

The Fanlan's Point saloon, which has a license for beer and wine only, paid yearly less than \$150 for the privilege, and it was only during the months of July and August that the returns were substantial enough to really show pro-July and August that the returns were substantial enough to really show profit. This particular business gained its privilege under section 21 of the Ontarlo Liquor Act, which sets forth that in addition to the regularly prescribed number of city licenses, a single license for six months would be issued in a locality largely resorted to in summer by visitors."

Richard Lee, the assignee, stated that in June, 1904, he made an examination of Hill's books. There was a deficit then of \$31,000. The books, owing to a page missing from the bill book, were not in a condition to make a proper

Mr. Drayton read extracts from the report of Hill's examination in St. Thomas. At that time, Hill admitted, he knew there was a deficit, but he had continued business, thinking it would be best for his creditors. He had hoped to pay everybody in the end.

After luncheon Mr. Reid changed his mind and explained that the \$2700 was merely an overdraft of his private account, and was charged up as usual. His partners were also






