Consolidate Positions in Belgium--Germans Shelling British Positions at Neuve Chapelle

London, March 20.—Withdrawal of German troops from the Yser region in West Flanders to reinforce the lines near Neuve Chapelle in Northern

th West Flanders to reinforce the lines near Neuve Chapelle in Northern France, enables the Belgian troops to gain important success in Belgium and their new positions have now been all consolidated.

Before the attack King Albert went among his men, and inspired them to the highest pitch of fervor. Belgian artillery, reinforced with French guns, shelled the German batteries near Westende and Dixmude violently. A German battery planted in a churchyard near Dixmude was put out of commission. East of Steenstraate and south of Dixmude, the Germans delivered strong counter attacks, all of which were repulsed.

The German artillery stationed between the La Bassee Canal and Beaucamps in France is shelling Neuve Chapelle and Givenchy, where the British hold positions.

Severe artillery duels are in progress in the Aisne Valley and the Champagne district north of Arras and Perthes infantry fighting continues.

London, March 20—Relative inaction prevails along both battle-fronts in Europe, which again seem to have relapsed into the condition of siege warfare, which prevailed during the winter. Austrian reports by way of Berlin say that the Russian offensive movement in the Carpathians through the Lupkow Pass has resulted in failure but direct reports froom both Vienna and Petrograd agree that Austrians as well as Russians are making attacks and counter-attacks in the Carpathians without any decisive results.

The Germans still are bombarding Ossowetz without success, according to the Russians, who say they have destroyed the advanced trenches of their antagonists.

London, March 20.—The Times says that Germany, despite the cheerful statements of her financial experts as to the adequacy of her gold reserve, has apparently been compelled to open the strong fortress of Spandau, near Berlin. On Monday we started a series of competitions, and they have been running morning and afternoon every day.



How're you fixed for fishing, fellows?
The season for good off sport is approaching fast. Why don't you organize a fishing club, and enjoy a little real adventure with hook and line this spring?
Here are a dozen suggestions of handy things to have about your fishing camp. Some will be especially useful if you want to rough it for a night on the banks of a stream or lake; others you'll need if you're going to spend only an hour with hook and line, some miorning or evening.

The first (Fig 1) shows a minnow trap made from a fruit jar and a piece of fifth the screen Remove the jar cover and fit the screen funnel as shown. Cut the flat part of jar away and use the threaded part to hold the jap-over of the funnel in place.

The wire ball is useful to tie the jar to the dock and makes it easier to handle. Put some bread in the jar and sink it in about a foot of water. In an hour or so, you will have all the minows you can use all day.

Fig 2 pictures a bait box in which you can keep enough angleworms to last two weeks. A soap box filled with moist but not sticky wet clay, with a sod for a topper and a perforated cover over all will serve your purpose well. The box is buried in its own depth under the porch or in any shady place. Once in three days throw coffee portinsings to the angles and they will repay you by keeping fat and sleek. It is absolutely necessary to have clean, fresh, well-preserved bait for still fishing, and I know by experience that this box has no equal in helping you to accomplish this purpose.

Fig 3 shows the end of the cane pole which forms the handle of the landing net shown in Fig 5. The smalled sketches "A" and "B" show how the frame!


