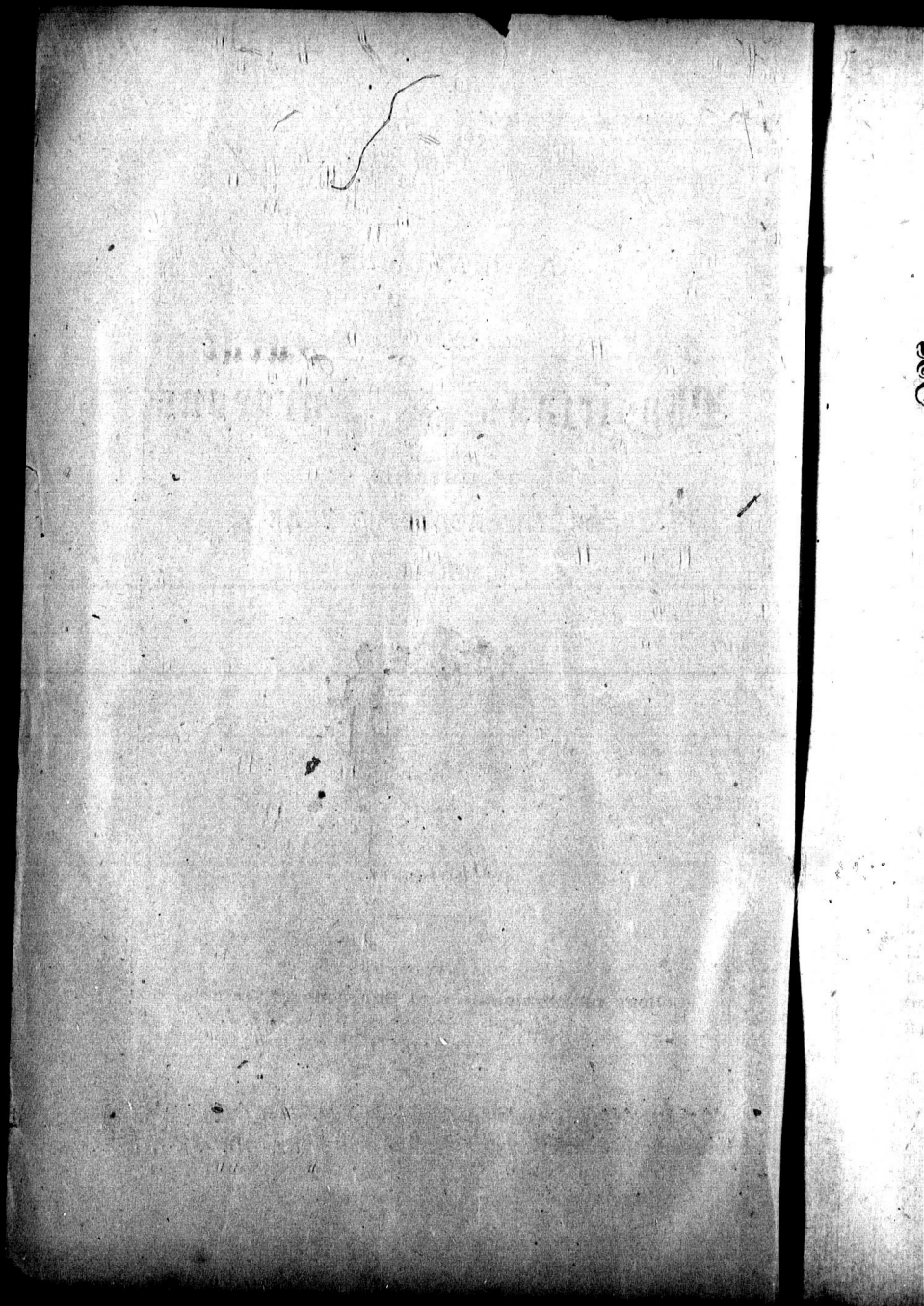

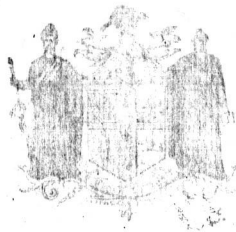

## College of Physicians & Surgeons of Ontario.

*Announcement for the Academic Year  
1890-91.*

"THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF ONTARIO," is the name adopted by the Medical Profession of the Province of Ontario in its corporate capacity. As every legally qualified Medical Practitioner in the Province is a member of this College, it is not an institution for the teaching of Medicine.

The Medical Profession of Ontario was first incorporated under this name by an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in 1866. This Act was subsequently repealed by the Legislature of Ontario in 1869, and now the affairs of the Profession in this Province are regulated by an Act passed in 1874, (37 Vict. cap. 30) commonly known as the "Ontario Medical Act," and further amended in year 1887.

By this Act, the "COUNCIL OF THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF ONTARIO," is empowered and directed to enact by-laws for the regulation of all matters connected with Medical Education; for the admission and enrolment of Students of Medicine; for determining from time to time the Curriculum of the studies to be pursued by them, and to appoint a Board of Examiners before whom all must pass a satisfactory Examination before they can be enrolled as members of the College, and thus be legally qualified to practice their profession in the Province of Ontario.

The Council, moreover, has power and authority conferred upon it by this Act to fix the terms upon which practitioners of medicine, duly qualified in other Countries, may be admitted as members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, this being the only mode in which they can become legally entitled to practice their profession in this Province.

For the information and guidance of Students of Medicine, the Profession and the public generally, the Council, in conformity with the Ontario Medical Act, hereby promulgates for the year 1890-91 the REGULATIONS which herein follow, repealing all others heretofore in force.

## REGULATIONS.

## Section I.

## MATRICULATION.

1. Every one desirous of being registered as a Matriculated Medical Student in the Register of this College, except as hereinafter provided, on and after 1st July, 1888, must present to the registrar the official certificate of having passed the Second Class Non-Professional Examination—as prescribed for Form II, of the High School course of study—embracing the following subjects:—

whereupon he shall be entitled to be so registered upon the payment of twenty dollars, and giving proof of his identity.

2. Graduates in Arts, or Students having Matriculated in Arts in any University in her Majesty's Dominions, are not required to pass this examination, but may register their names with the Registrar of the College upon giving satisfactory evidence of their identity and certificate of qualifications, and upon paying the fee of twenty dollars.

3. Every Medical Student after Matriculating shall be registered in the manner prescribed by the Council, and this will be held to be the preliminary to his Medical studies, which will not be considered to begin until after the date of such registration.

## Section II.

## MEDICAL CURRICULUM.

1. Every Student must spend a period of four years in actual Professional studies, except as hereinafter provided; and the prescribed period of studies shall include four Winter Seasons of six months each, and one Summer season of ten weeks, attended AFTER being registered as

a Medical Student in the Register of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario,—“But any change in the curriculum of studies fixed by the Council shall not come into effect until one year after such change is made.”

2. Graduates in Arts of any College or University recognized by the Council will only be required to pass three years after graduating in attendance upon Medical Lectures, before being admitted to their Final Examination. No tickets for Lectures will henceforward be accepted by the Council unless it is endorsed thereon that the pupil had attended said lectures regularly.

3. Applications for every Professional Examination must be made to the Registrar of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, for the Spring Examination by the first Tuesday in April before such Examination, and for the Fall Examination by the 10th day of September, 1890. No application will be received unless accompanied by the necessary tickets and certificates, and by the Treasurer's receipt showing that the fees have been paid.

2. Each “Six Month's Course” shall consist of not less than One Hundred Lectures, and each “Three Month's Course” of not less than Fifty Lectures.

5. Every Student must attend the undermentioned courses of Lectures in a University, College or School of Medicine approved of by the Council, viz ;

Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, have passed all the Examinations hereinafter prescribed; and must have attained the full age of twenty-one years.

12. Graduates in Arts who have attended one course of lectures on Botany and Practical Chemistry, and two courses on Theoretical Chemistry, and who have already passed an Examination on these subjects in any of the recognized Colleges, will not be required to undergo a second Examination on the same, provided they produce tickets for the courses of Lectures stated, and a Certificate of having passed an Examination on these subjects.

13. Graduates in Medicine from recognised Colleges outside the Dominion of Canada, who desire to qualify themselves for registration, must pass the Matriculation Examination recognised by the Council; and must attend one or more full Winter Courses of Lectures in one of the Ontario Medical Schools, so as to complete fully the Curriculum required by the Council, and shall pass before the Examiners appointed by the Council all the Examinations hereinafter prescribed. \*This does not apply to Homoeopathic Students.

14. That British Licentiates on producing certificates of passing a Matriculation Examination equivalent to that of the Medical Council of Ontario, paying all fees and passing the Final Examination they be registered.

### Section III

#### EXAMINATIONS.

1. The Professional Examinations are divided into two parts: a "Primary" and a "Final."
2. The Primary Examination shall be undergone after the second Winter Session, and the Final after the fourth Winter Session.
3. The following branches shall be embraced in the Primary Examination:
  - a. DESCRIPTIVE ANATOMY.
  - b. PHYSIOLOGY AND HISTOLOGY.
  - c. CHEMISTRY, (Theoretical and Practical).
  - d. TOXICOLOGY.
  - e. MATERIA MEDICA AND PHARMACY.
4. Each Candidate for the Primary Examination will be required to present, with his Lecture Tickets, a Certificate of having undergone an

\*See Med. Act, Section XVII, Sub-Sec. 2, 3, 4, which provides fully for Homoeopathic Candidates, that they shall matriculate, and also spend the full period of study required by the Council, etc.

Examination at the School he has attended at the close of his first Winter Session, on the Primary Branches. (Such Examination shall not, however, in anyway affect the Primary Examination of the Council.) Also a Certificate of ability to make and mount Microscopic Specimens. Each Candidate for Final Examination must present a Certificate of attendance at six post-mortem Examinations, and a Certificate of ability to draw up a Report of a Post Mortem Examination; also a Certificate of having reported satisfactorily on Six Cases of Clinical Medicine, and Six Cases of Clinical Surgery.

5. The following branches shall be embraced in the Final Examination:

- a. MEDICAL AND SURGICAL ANATOMY.
- b. PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE AND THERAPEUTICS.
- c. GENERAL PATHOLOGY.
- d. SURGERY, other than Operative.
- e. SURGERY, Operative.
- f. MIDWIFERY (other than Operative) PUERPERAL AND INFANTILE DISEASES.
- g. MIDWIFERY, Operative.
- h. MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE AND SANITARY SCIENCE.

6. The Primary Examination shall be "written" and "Oral." The Final Examination shall be "written" and "Oral" and Clinical in Medicine and Surgery.

7. Any Candidate who passes creditably in three or more branches but fails in the others, shall receive credit for the subjects so passed, and be compelled to pass in the other branches *only*, at a subsequent Examination.

8. Candidates who intend to be examined by the Homœopathic Examiner in the special subjects, shall signify their intention to the Registrar previous to the commencement of the Examination, in order that he may provide means of preventing their identification by the other Students, or by the Examiners.

9. In the event of any Candidate signifying his intention to the Registrar to be examined and registered as a Homœopathic Practitioner, due notice of such must be submitted to the Registrar, so that the Examination may be conducted by the parties appointed for that purpose; but prior to the acceptance of such notice from the Candidate, the usual fees must be paid. In the event of any Candidates presenting themselves for such Examinations, due notice must be given by the Registrar to the special Examiner.

#### Section IV. FEES.

1. The following scale of fees have been established by the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario:

These fees are to be paid to the Treasurer of the College before each Examination.

 23rd DAY OF JULY, 1870 ..... \$ 10.00  
 e. REGISTRATION OF PERSONS DULY QUALIFIED AFTER  
 23rd DAY OF JULY, 1870 ..... 25.00  
 f. REGISTRATION OF ADDITIONAL DEGREES OR TITLES... 2.00

This fee is only payable when the additional titles are registered at different times, but any number of such titles as are allowed to be registered, may be put on record at the first registration, for the registration fee.

- g. DIPLOMA OF MEMBERSHIP OF THE COLLEGE ..... 5.00

This Diploma is granted free of charge to all those Members of the College who attain their membership by passing the Examinations of the College. All other members may obtain it on application to the Registrar, and paying the above named fee. . . 5.00

- h. ANNUAL CONTRIBUTION FROM MEMBERS OF THE COLLEGE FOR THE YEAR 1890, PAYABLE TO THE REGISTRAR ..... 1.00

This fee is payable by every member of the College on the First day of January in each year. The attention of Members whose annual contributions are in arrear is particularly called to this, as the provisions of Sections XXVII of the "Ontario Medical Act" will henceforth be strictly enforced.

Fees after 1st July 1889:

- a. REGISTRATION OF MATRICULATION ..... 20 00  
 b. PRIMARY EXAMINATION ..... 30.00  
 c. FINAL EXAMINATION, including registration ..... 50.00

This is not to affect any Student who is registered as a Matriculate prior to 1st July, 1889.

2. All fees, must be paid in lawful money of Canada, to the Treasurer of the College.
3. No candidate will be admitted to any Examination until the fee for such Examination is paid in full.
4. Candidates who have failed in any Professional Examination shall pay a fee of Ten dollars, for each subsequent Examination.

**Section V.**

**EXAMINATIONS.**

*Rules for the guidance of the Board of Examiners.*

1. No teacher in any School of Medicine in Ontario can hold the position of Examiner upon the subject upon which he lectures or upon which he may have lectured within one year prior to the date of the Examination.
2. Any Examiner, Member of the Medical Council, or registered Practitioner may be present at any of the Examinations, and there must invariably be not less than two members of the Board present at every Examination.
3. At the end of each Written Examination upon any Subject, the answers to the Question are to be handed to the Registrar, who will open the envelopes, in which they are hereinafter directed to be closed, and to each set of papers affix a number by which the author will be known to the Examiners during the Examination. The Registrar will then deliver the papers to the Member of the Board of Examiners appointed by the Council to examine upon the Subject.
4. The papers, when delivered to the Member of the Board of Examiner appointed by the Council to examine upon the Subject, are to be by him examined, and the relative value of answers marked by means of numbers, in a Schedule which will be furnished to him by the Registrar, ranging for the Final Subjects, as follows:

5. The value awarded by the individual Examiners to the answers of Candidates are not to be subject to revision, except by an appeal by the Candidate to the Council.

6. The Examiners shall return the Schedules to the Registrar, with values inserted, at least three days before a final decision of the Board. From these values a general Schedule is to be made by the Registrar, and no change of value can be made after such individual Schedules have been returned to the Registrar. The General Schedule is to be examined as to its correctness by the whole Board, and the results announced by the Chairman of the Board.

7. Papers on the Homoeopathic subjects are to be finally submitted to the Examiner approved of for that purpose by the representatives of that system in the Council.

8. All Oral Examinations are henceforth to be as Clinical, Demonstrative and Practical as possible, and the Candidate shall be known to the Examiner by Number only.

9. That it be an instruction to the Examiners in the questions in their respective subjects, to confine themselves to the text books in ordinary use (see page 12 of this announcement) also that in referring to diseases or operations of any kind, the names of such diseases or operations most commonly in use should be employed.

10. That it be an instruction to the Examiners that they in no case

report a candidate as having passed an Examination, when on any subject he makes less than the minimum of marks set by the Council for a pass on that subject; but in any case where they may think there are special reasons for granting a License to such Candidate, they shall report the same to the Council for its action.

*Rules for Candidates when in the Examination Hall.*

11. Each Candidate shall receive from the Registrar a Programme containing a list of subjects upon which the Candidate is to be examined, and it will admit him to the Examination Hall during the progress of the Examinations upon such subject, but at no other time.

12. Candidates must write the answers to the questions given by the Examiners, legibly and neatly upon one side only of each page of a book, which will be furnished to each Candidate, and the number given with each question is to be put at the head of the answer to it, in such a manner as to have the first page facing outward to the view; they are then to be folded once, and enclosed in an envelope on the outside of which each Candidate is to write his name. The packet is then to be handed to the Registrar, or some one deputed by him. Neither signature, number, nor sign, by which the writer could be recognized by the Examiner, is to be written or marked upon any portion of the book to be enclosed in the Envelope.

13. The questions of the Examiners in the Homeopathic subjects will be handed in writing, at the beginning of the General Examination on the same subject, by the Registrar, to such candidates as have given him notice in accordance with Section III, sub-sec. 8, 9. They shall write the answers to these questions in the same Hall with the other Candidates, and hand their papers, when finished, to the Registrar in the same manner as provided for the other Candidates, to be by him given for Examination to the Homeopathic Members of the Board of Examiners appointed to examine on that Subject.

14. If any abbreviations are used in answering the Questions, Candidates must be careful that they are such as are generally understood, or which cannot be mistaken.

15. No candidate will be allowed to leave the Hall after the Questions are given out, until his answers have been handed in.

16. No Candidate will be allowed in the Hall during the hours of Examination, except those who are actually undergoing Examination.

17. Any Candidate who may have brought any book or reference paper to the Hall, must deposit it with the Examiner before the Examination begins.

18. Candidates must not communicate with each other while the Examinations are going on either by writing, signs, words, or in any manner whatever.

19. Candidates must at all times bear themselves towards the Examiners with the utmost deference and respect; and they will not be permitted in any manner to manifest approbation or disapprobation of any Member of the Board of Examiners, during the progress of the Examination.

20. Candidates must not only conduct themselves with decorum while any Examination is going on, but they will be held strictly responsible for any impropriety of conduct during the whole progress, both of the Written and of the Oral Examinations.

21. Any infraction of the above rules will lead to the exclusion of the Candidate who is guilty of it from the remainder of the Examination; and he will not receive credit for any Examination papers which he may have handed to the Registrar previous to his being detected in such misconduct.

22. And be debarred from further privileges at the discretion of the Council.

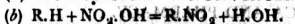

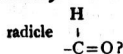

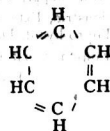

IN JUNE, 1890.

TUESDAY, JUNE 10TH, 1890.

The Medical Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario met this day, Tuesday, the 10th of June, 1890, at 2 p.m., in accordance with the By-laws of the Council. The Registrar called the Council to order, read over the names of the members and called upon the Council to elect a Pre-ident.

Moved by Dr. Orr, seconded by Dr. Campbell, that Dr. V. H. Moore, of Brockville, be President of this Council for the ensuing year.

Resolved that Dr. Day cast the ballot for President

Dr. V. H. Moore was then declared elected unanimously.

Dr. Moore took the President's chair and thanked the Council for the honor conferred upon him, and requested the Council to elect officers.

Moved by Dr. Bray, seconded by Dr. Bergin, that Dr. Williams be Vice-President of the Council for the ensuing year.—Carried.

Dr. Bray cast the ballot as directed by the Council.

Moved by Dr. Ruttan, seconded by Dr. Rosebrugh, that Dr. R. A. Pyne be Registrar for the ensuing year.—Carried.

Moved in amendment by Dr. Harris, seconded by Dr. Rogers, that Dr. R. A. Pyne be elected Registrar and Treasurer.

Withdrawn by permission of the Council.

Moved by Dr. Bergin, seconded by Dr. Bray, that Dr. W. T. Aikins be re-elected Treasurer.—Carried.

Moved by Dr. Russell, seconded by Dr. Rosebrugh, that B. B. Osler, Q.C., be solicitor for this Council for the ensuing year.

Moved in amendment by Dr. Henry, seconded by Dr. Orr, that Dalton McCarthy be solicitor for the Council for the next year.

Moved in amendment to the amendment by Dr. Campbell, seconded by Dr. Logan, that the election of solicitor be deferred for the present.—Carried.

Moved by Dr. Bray, seconded by Dr. Russell, that the following gentlemen be a Committee to strike the Standing Committees for the Council for the ensuing year, namely:—Doctors Day, Logan, Bergin, Philip, Fowler, Geikie, Russell, Campbell, Orr and the mover.—Carried.

Moved by Dr. Bergin, seconded by Dr. Fenwick, that the following do form a Committee on Credentials to whom shall be referred the cases of protested elections, said Committee to investigate and report without delay, namely:—Doctors Day, Philip, Bray, Williams, the mover and seconder.—Carried.

On motion the Council adjourned to meet again in 30 minutes to receive report of Committee to strike the Standing Committees, etc.

In pursuance of motion for adjournment the Council met at 3.30 p.m. President in the chair called the Council to order, and requested the Committee to strike the Standing Committees to report.

Dr. Bergin, Chairman of the Committee, presented the report as follows:—The Committee appointed to strike Standing Committees beg leave to report and recommend (for composition of the committees see page 7 of Annual Announcement) and that the President and the Vice-President be ex-officio members of all committees except the Committee on Discipline, and the Chairman of any Committee is ex-officio a member of any sub-committee thereof.

We find Dr. Fenwick elected for the Western University; Dr. Fowler, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons, Kingston; Dr. Geikie, Trinity Medical College, Toronto; Sir James Grant, University of Ottawa. The reports of the Board of Examiners with reference to the fall and spring examinations were presented to your committee, by which we find at the fall examination 53 candidates presented themselves for the Final, of whom 36 passed; for the Primary 73 presented themselves of whom 24 passed.

«82 candidates presented themselves at the Final in the Spring, of these 125 passed; 208 candidates presented themselves for the Primary at the Spring examination, of these 106 passed.

No. 5.—The cases of George S. McGhie and R. G. Feek were reported, they having, while undergoing examination, violated rule 17. Your committee recommend that they be not permitted to come up again for examination until April 1892, and that then they be required to pay the full fees.

Third.—The committee appointed under the said Section shall be known as the Committee on Discipline.

Fourth.—Dr. Day, of Trenton, Dr. Bray, of Chatham, Dr. Logan, of Ottawa, are hereby appointed the committee for the purposes of said section for the ensuing year.

Your Education committee hereby submit their second report as follows :

1. The committee recommends that in answer to a communication of F. Martin, he be notified that he is required to attend four sessions, one of which may be taken in New York, together with a summer session.
2. In reference to motion of Dr. Bray to decrease the number of didactic lectures given at the medical colleges, the Committee recommends that the subject be not taken up at the present meeting of the Medical Council.
3. A communication was read from Dr. Cranston with reference to the summer session. The committee recommends that the resolution passed some years ago making it necessary to give students one year's notice of change in curriculum be placed in the Annual Announcement.
4. E. P. Gordon applies for a re-reading of his paper on Medical and Surgical Anatomy, and we recommend his request be granted.
5. Your committee recommend that Doctors Fowler, Geikie and the President be a sub-committee to re-read the various papers.
6. With reference to the Calendar, the committee recommend that all the verbal changes required to be made in the Calendar be left to the Registrar.
7. The following changes and additions were recommended to be made in the Calendar. (a) On page 9, add after the words "Medical Act in second paragraph "and further amended in the year 1887." (b) Page 12, clause 9, 10 and 11 the word "also" be substituted for the word "he" and that in clause 11 on the fourth line the word "he" be struck out. (c) That clause 7 on page 125 of the announcement, be transferred to page 13 and become clause 14 of that page. (d) That the first five lines of clause 4 on page 13 be struck out. (e) That there be added to clause, to be No. 22 on page 18, the words, "and to be debarred from further privileges at the discretion of the Council." (f) That the Registrar instruct the examiner on Chemistry to make his examination to bear as much as possible on medical chemistry. (g) And your committee recommend after receiving the report of the sub committee to whom was committed the re-reading of the various papers, that no change be made except in the case of Nos. 371 and 373. Whom the committee recommend to be passed, one in Sanitary Science and

the other in Operative Surgery. (1) The committee recommend that the following constitute the Board of Examiners. For composition of the Board, see page 6 of Announcement.

The communication referred to your committee with reference to a permit said to have been granted to one Meerkhim by the solicitor of the Council allowing of his practising in the Province for four months, has been carefully investigated, and after hearing the solicitor, B. B. Osler, Esq., Q. C. before the committee, and his explanation in regard to the said permit alleged to have been given, your committee must say that the document in their judgement is not a permit in any sense, but an undertaking suspend prosecution for the period of four months contingent upon the party paying certain costs, which he did, leaving the country, and in the meantime taking no new patients (see document attached to report.) We are further of the opinion that that solicitor acted in the best interests of the Council and the Profession.

We recommend that the Registrar, Dr. R. A. Pyne receive a salary of \$1800 per annum.

We recommend that a competent collector be employed by the council for the purpose of collecting the outstanding annual assessments, and and that he be allowed a commission of 20 per cent; that he be required to make monthly returns to the Registrar and to give security in the sum of \$500, and that the Registrar be empowered to exercise his own discretion as to what cases he shall hand into the solicitor for collection.

All the accounts shall be returnable to the Registrar after they have been in the hands of the collector three months.

In consideration of the arduous and valuable services rendered to this Council by Dr. H. H. Wright, as chairman for the Building and Grounds Committee, and the careful supervision he has shown in the construction of this building, we feel that it would be a proper and graceful act upon the part of the Council to mark the appreciation of his services in some tangible manner.

We recommend that the members of special committees be paid the same remuneration as is allowed to members in attendance upon meetings of the Medical Council.

Your committee have fully considered the communication of Dr. A. A. Macdonald, Vice President of the Ontario Library Association, in which it is intimated that the Council had promised the Association the use of the Library Rooms at a nominal rental of \$1.00 per year, and that to depart from this would be a breach of faith on the part of the Council. On examining the minutes of the Council, and reports of the committees, the earliest record of the transaction is in the report of the Finance Committee, dated 17th June, 1887, which reads as follows:

"In accordance with instructions from the Council, we met the committee of the Ontario Medical Library Association, to consider the establishment of a Medical Library in the City of Toronto, and we recommend the Council to set apart a room in the College Building at a

nominal rental, to be properly equipped with shelving for library, provided our Registrar have charge of the same."

We next find reference to it on the 13th of June, 1889, when a deputation, consisting of Doctors McPhedran, Powell, and Wishart, addressed the Council, in which they made application for increased accommodation. This was followed by a resolution in the following words:—

"Moved by Dr. Burns, seconded by Dr. Philip, that the subject of increased accommodation for the Library Association be referred to the Building Committee to report at this Council session on Saturday, June 5th, 1889. Your Committee reported as follows:—Your Committee having had referred to them the question of increased accommodation for the Ontario Medical Library Association, beg to report that the said increased accommodation asked for by the said Association be granted on paying a reasonable rental to be determined by this Council."

On adoption of this report, the Council passed the following resolution:—

"Moved by Dr. Burns, seconded by Dr. Orr, that the Property Committee be permitted to grant the use of two rooms at an annual rental of not less than \$100, to the said Ontario Library Association."

Your Committee therefore find that the Ontario Medical Library Association have no reason to believe that the Council is breaking faith, as this is not borne out by the facts. Your Committee would advise under the circumstances of giving the option of returning to the one room originally allowed at a nominal rental, and that the nominal rental be now fixed at \$1.00 per year; or if retaining the two rooms that they be required to pay the sum of \$100, as per resolution of the Council, bearing date June 15th, 1889

We would recommend that the treasurer be empowered to keep the bank accounts of the Council at any chartered bank in good standing as he may see fit.

As to the fees referred to by the Council when dealing with the application of British Licentiates in 1889, to all not registered as matriculates, the increased fees are to be paid namely, \$100, including registration, primary and final

The Registrar is so directed.

Dear Sirs,—As the writer yesterday informed you by telephone the President will not sign an order staying the prosecutions. Upon payment however of the amount agreed upon for costs, and the defendant undertaking to leave Ontario within four months and not thereafter to practice in Ontario directly or indirectly, and further that he will while he remains in Ontario, confine himself strictly to cases already in his charge, we undertake on behalf of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, that no further proceedings will be taken by them upon the present convictions, and that they will not instruct any proceedings upon any cases already in charge of the defendant during said period of four months.

It will be remembered, however, that under the act, any one may prosecute, and no protection is intended to be given to the defendant; we simply agree that the Council, upon the terms stated, will drop the pending prosecutions, and will not instruct any prosecutions for four months with reference to any case now in charge of the defendant.

The Treasurer desires to draw attention to the fact that when the Council met a year ago, it was not indebted to the bank at all. That during the past year not only has nothing been paid on account of the mortgage indebtedness of the College, but various sums have from time to time as required been borrowed from the bank, and the Council is to day indebted to it in the sum of \$4,300. There are, he is informed, some \$700 of outstanding accounts against the College, which with the expense of the present meeting say \$2,250, (if it be as great as it was last year) makes a total of \$7,250, an indebtedness which will have to be carried until the fees for the Spring Examination are received.

The Fall Examinations will not assist in paying this, inasmuch as the expense of holding them is within a few dollars of the amount of fees received from them; nor will the receipts from rents do so but to a very limited extent, inasmuch as for the past year the building only produced \$571 above the cost of maintaining it. Your Treasurer ventures to suggest, therefore, the desirability of the Council not entering into any arrangements involving expenditure, until the Finance Committee has had an opportunity of investigating its financial affairs carefully. He would also suggest that the strictest economy should be practised with a view to wiping out this indebtedness.

The report of the Property committee respectfully sheweth that your

committee have concluded their contract with the Hale Elevator Co. satisfactorily; that the elevator now does its service efficiently, noislessly and without needless jar or annoyance to tenants; that the accounts of receipt and expenditure properly belonging to the building as distinct and separate to those pertaining to the Council have been kept distinctly apart in a book so arranged as to show the separate items of expenditure and receipts, which book is herewith submitted.

That the receipts from rental of offices to date is annually \$3888.91; occasional from renting Examination Hall, \$150; total \$4038.91. The annual expenditure is \$3317.46, leaving a balance of 721.45.

The City of Toronto has refunded on water rates, \$155.75 and the item of repairs is augmented by incidental expense of last December due to a wind storm \$290.05, which if deducted from the general expenditure leaves the actual amount as chargeable \$2861.66.

That at the last annual meeting of the Council on an appeal of the Ontario Medical Library Association for a reduction of rent a resolution was adopted instructing your committee to lease to that Association certain apartments for not less than \$100 annually.

After due deliberation and careful consideration of the whole matter, your committee fixed the rental at \$150 annually, as being a reasonable compromise between any consideration due the Ontario Medical Library Association in their laudable efforts and the expenditure of over \$800 at their expense and on the plans and specifications provided and submitted by them for the special fittings, shelvings, etc. and the actual rental value of the room as well as heating and other conveniences; your committee further submit that it was well known by the Association that a substantial rental would be demanded, and that the Association are not now in a position to plead that they have been taken by surprise. All of which is respectfully submitted.

On motion the report was received, and on motion adopted.

Dr. Day moved the council into committee of the whole on the report of the Discipline Committee on the case of Benjamin Heaton Lemon, Dr. Luton in the chair.

Report of communications from Dr. B. H. Lemon were read as follows:

In the matter of the Act respecting the profession of medicine and surgery, being Chapter 148, Revised Statutes of Ontario, and of the application to erase the name of Benjamin Heaton Lemon, from the Register as a member and registered medical practitioner of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

*To the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario:*

Your Committee appointed to enquire into the facts of the above matter beg leave to report as follows: Your committee duly met after notice to the said B. H. Lemon, who was notified of the application to erase his name, and also of the subject matter of the enquiry, and served

with a copy of the charges upon which the application was based, which notice is dated 13th June, 1889. The said Benjamin Heaton Lemon appeared personally and by counsel on Thursday, the 17th of October, 1889, and Friday the 18th October, 1889, when witnesses were examined on both sides, and the evidence upon the charges taken, a copy of which charges and the evidences thereon accompanies this report.

Your committee find as a fact that the said Benjamin Heaton Lemon has been guilty of disgraceful conduct in a professional respect, as charged in the application and complaint, by advertising, by laying on of hands and magnetic healing, and other advertising as in the newspapers referred to in the charges, and made the subject matter of the enquiry, and produced in evidence, that your committee find the following charges not proven: (a) Said Lemon obtained his license for Quebec under false representations. (b) That the said Lemon represented himself as being connected with certain institutions in the United States where he has never been known. (c) That he endeavored to obtain patients through offers of a premium to the party furnishing them.

business in Thorold as a merchant, would be clouded socially, as well as commercially, and my two little sons, eight and ten years, subjected to many injurious things. My wife now in very delicate health, has been heartbroken since the investigation of October last. Mr. W. Cassels retired from my case after the first day, I presume because I declined to have him try to make my peace by promising to quit this advertising. He advised it indirectly I may say; but then I couldn't accede to it, but rather than be erased, I will promise not to do it, and keep my word sacredly. Mr. Cassels having retired, I was left practically defenceless, my brother's health being unusually poor at that time, besides being incapable of a contest with a man of your ability. Having spoken myself thus to you, I do not think it would be necessary to appear personally or by counsel. I have written in like manner to the President of the Medical Council, also to the Chairman of the Discipline Committee, and the member for the Erie and Niagara Division, Dr. Philip, of Brantford. I, therefore, throw myself on the consideration of the distinguished body, trusting they will not treat me as a felon by depriving me of my license to practice, and practically of the means of supporting myself and family. Being upwards of 60 years old, I could not do much at farming, which I had thought of trying, and this would be my only choice, or else exile to begin life anew in the United States.

Your committee duly met after notice of the charges in the subject matter of the enquiry to be conducted had been given to the said Washington, who appeared personally and by counsel, on Thursday the 17th October, 1889, and Saturday the 19th October, 1889, when witnesses were examined, both in the support of the petition, and on behalf of said Washington ; and after hearing the evidence, which herewith accompanies this report, your committee arrived at the following conclusions : (a) As to the facts, that your committee find that the said Washington has been extensively advertising in newspapers published in the cities of Ottawa and Kingston as in the charge laid. (b) Your committee further find that the said Washington has been guilty of disgraceful conduct, in a professional respect, in his dealings with one Cochrane, of Kingston, to whom he gave a receipt in the following words : " This is to certify that Thomas Cochrane, of Kingston, is to be treated till cured for Catarrhal Bronchitis for the sum of \$25, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged. (Signed) Washington " Although the said Cochrane was to the knowledge of the said Washington in the last stages of consumption and beyond hope of cure.

Your committee further find that the said Washington has been guilty of disgraceful conduct in a professional respect, in his dealings with one Noble of Kingston, to whom he gave a receipt in the following words : " Received from Thomas Henry Noble, corner Block and Alfred streets, \$25 in full for Catarrhal Bronchitis treatment till cured. The second charge your committee find that the said Washington does advertise by handbills and causes them to be distributed in the public streets.

As the third charge your committee find that the said Washington has been guilty of disgraceful conduct in a professional respect, in publishing broadcast the symptoms of a disease, namely catarrh, and that such advertisements are detrimental to the public, as charged. Dear Sir.—In pursuance of our conversations of yesterday and prior conversations, and after consultation with Dr. Washington, I beg to submit through you, to the Committee on Discipline, and to the Medical Council, the following propositions on behalf of Dr. Washington.

First,—Dr. Washington admits that advertisements such as those referred to in the charges against him are contrary to the code of ethics laid down by the Medical Association, and are unprofessional.

Second—Dr. Washington considers that an advertisement such as the following, would be sufficient for the purposes of his practice, that is to say: "Nelson Washington, M. D, etc. Specialist, will attend at . . . . . on the . . . . . day of . . . . . for consultation in and treatment of . . . . . diseases." In the event of the Medical Council deeming this letter satisfactory and not pursuing the charges against him, if he carries out the terms of this letter, Dr. Washington promises to confine himself in his future practice to the code of ethics now established, or as may be established, by the Ontario Medical Association.

This letter is without prejudice to matters now pending.

sions of the peace for the County of Kent, of a misdemeanor tried at the Town of Chatham, County of Kent, on the 13th of June, 1889, the particulars of which are as follows :

Moved by Dr. Philip, seconded by Dr. Johnson, that the Council appoint B. B. Osler, Esq., Q. C. solicitor for the Council for the ensuing year. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Harris, seconded by Dr. Orr, that when prosecuting Counsel is needed other than what is consistent with the duties of B. B. Osler, Esq., Q. C., Counsel in chief to this Council be supplied, James S. Fullerton be and is hereby appointed prosecuting Counsel without salary other than the necessary fees in the case in which he is employed. By permission of the Council withdrawn.

Dr. Bergin moved in amendment, seconded by Dr. Geikie, that Mr. Fowler be appointed. By permission of the Council withdrawn.

Moved by Dr. Henry, seconded by Dr. Orr, that the Discipline Committee be allowed the privilege of employing a solicitor whenever required. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Day, seconded by Dr. Rosebrugh, that the President and Vice President and Dr. Henderson be the executive committee for the ensuing year. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Bergin, seconded by Dr. Logan, that Dr. H. H. Wright be Warden of the Council buildings, and custodian of the Council property, and that the Property committee be an advisory board. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Harris, seconded by Dr. Day, that the by-law for fixing the salary of the Registrar be now read a second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole for that purpose. Carried.

Dr. Orr in the chair.

The committee rose. The President resumed the chair. Dr. Orr presented the report of the committee of the whole on the by-law, as follows: Adopted without amendment.

By-law No. 47 for fixing the salary of the Registrar. Whereas power hath been granted to the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario to make by-laws, be it therefore, and it is hereby enacted, that the salary of the Registrar be fixed at \$1800 per annum, to be paid monthly or quarterly.

Moved by Dr. Henry, seconded by Dr. Orr, in amendment that Dr. Oldright be appointed to the position of Examiner on Chemistry and Toxicology for this College in place of Dr. Acheson. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Harris, seconded by Dr. Johnson, that the printing of the annual Announcement and Rules and Regulations, By-laws, &c., be left in the hands of the chairman of the Printing Committee and the Registrar. Carried.

Moved by Dr. Rogers, seconded by Dr. Campbell, that this Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario hereby declares that section 19 of the Ontario Medical Act should be amended by the Legislative Assembly of this Province, by leaving out in said section the words "or any student having matriculated" thus making the said section to read as follows: "Any graduate in arts in any university in Her Majesty's Dominions shall not be required to pass the Preliminary Examination," and this Council further prays that the Honorable Minister of Education of this Province will cause the said amendment to become law at the next meeting of the Legislature.

On motion referred to the Legislation committee. Carried.

Council adjourned to meet again at 2 o'clock, p. m. on Saturday, 14th June.

## AFTERNOON SESSION.

SATURDAY, JUNE 14th, 1890.

Medical Council met at 2 o'clock in accordance with motion for adjournment.

President in the chair. Registrar called the roll All present excepting Sir James Grant, Doctors Bray, Campbell, Henry, Logan, Luton, MacArthur and Rosebrugh.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

On motion Council adjourned to meet at 3.15 p. m.

Council met at 3 15 p.m., in accordance with adjournment.

Dr. Bergin presented and read the report of the Credential committee, which on motion was referred to a committee of the whole. Dr. Philip in the chair.

On motion committee rose, President resumed the chair.

Dr. Philip presented the report of the committee of the whole on the Credential committee report. On motion received, and on motion adopted without amendment as follows :

In the case of protest by Dr. Sloan against the return of Dr. MacArthur as representative for the Malahide and Tecumseh Division, we beg to report :

First.—That they have examined the return of the returning officer, the instructions to that officer by the Registrar, the circular of the Registrar to the members as to the voting papers, and the written protest of Dr. Sloan. The petitioner with his Counsel and the Respondent appeared before the committee and were heard ; that then at the request of the committee they retired.

After examination of the documents, and consideration of the statements made by the parties to the contestation, it was resolved, that inasmuch as the contestation would almost to a certainty, involve a long investigation and be attended with a large amount of costs to the parties interested, it was suggested to the parties interested to come to an amicable arrangement. The parties were again summoned before the committee and the suggestion of the arrangement made to them. This arrangement was agreed to. Dr. Sloan withdrew his protest and Dr. MacArthur handed in his resignation. Dr. Sloan's withdrawal of protest, and Dr. MacArthur's resignation to be subject to the approval of the Council.



Your committee, therefore, recommend that the seat for the said Malahide and Tecumseh Division be declared vacant, and the Registrar be directed to take the necessary steps for a new election for said Division in accordance with the Statute and the by-laws of this Council.

In the matter of the contested election in the Burlington and Home Division, your Committee beg to report that they examined the returning officer, Dr. Shaw, and Dr. Olmstead, and find no irregularities as charged against the returning officer; we made a scrutiny of the ballots and rejected eight not being in compliance with the by-law governing the election. We find further that the ballots rejected by the returning officer on the day of the election were properly rejected. We find further that there were cast of legal ballots for Dr. Russell 52, for Dr. Miller 42, we find, therefore, that Dr. Russell is elected by a majority of ten.

The contested election in re the Bathurst and Rideau Division, we beg leave to report that we have examined the contestant, the Plaintiff, Dr. Cranston, through his Counsel, and the Defendant, Dr. Rogers, personally; we have also make a careful scrutiny of the ballots, and as the result, declare Dr. Rogers duly elected as representative of the Bathurst and Rideau Division.
