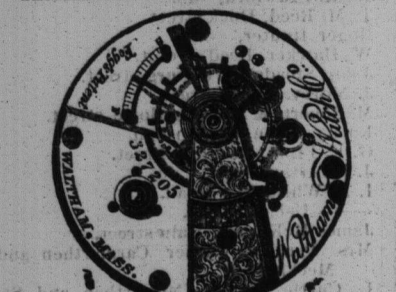

Canadian, British and Foreign.

LONDON, April 22.
Consols 94 1/4. Weather unsettled.
Lord Northbrook, Viceroy of India, has
issued a proclamation deposing Gulkarwar
of Baroda, declaring him and his issue
precluded from all the rights appertaining
to the sovereignty of the country,
and compelling the Gulkwar's family to
select a place for his retirement in British
India.

The Viceroy says this measure is based
independent of the recent trial of the
Gulkwar, upon his notorious misconduct,
gross misgovernment and incapacity.
Furthermore, the restoration of the
Gulkwar would be detrimental to the
interests of Baroda.

The Viceroy will select a member of the
Gulkwar's family to reign.
Great crowds gathered around Parli-
ament House and an extra force of police
are on duty. The excitement is caused
by a motion of Dr. Kenney's coming up
in the House of Commons regarding the
Tichborne verdict.

LONDON, April 24.
433 NATS TO 1 YEA.
Dr. Kenney's long promised motion for
a commission to investigate the circum-
stances attending the Tichborne trial
was made in the Commons last night,
and rejected, 433 to 1. The defender
of Arthur Orton made a powerful speech,
in which he impugned the motives of the
Lord Chief Justice. The motion was
opposed by the present and past Attorney
Generals, Disraeli, and Bright, and
supported by Whalley.

AMSTERDAM NEWS.
The Police authorities of Posen have
notified all the Ursuline Sisters in that
district, who are not natives of Germany,
that they must leave the country within
two months.

NEW YORK, April 24.
Gold closed yesterday at 115 1/2.
A FEARFUL ACCIDENT
is reported from New Orleans. Steam-
ships John Kyle, Exporter, and Charles
Bodman took fire yesterday afternoon at
the foot of Poydras street, and burned.
Many lives are said to have been lost.
The loss of property amounts to \$180,000.

OTHER DISASTERS.

The Toronto West election trial has
ended. Neither personal bribery nor
bribery by agents has been proved
against the respondent.

tant General being first Canadian who
has ever filled that office.

A Serious Charge.
The schooner Cordelia, Capt. B. R.
Charlton, laden with liquors, from the
United States consigned to a port in
Nova Scotia, was wrecked near Sheburne
about a year ago, and a claim was made
on the Halifax Marine Assurance Asso-
ciation for the amount of the cargo. Re-
quiries were made for the insurance Com-
pany and it was found that the liquors had
been secretly landed at some place on the Nova
Scotia coast, the vessel having been de-
signedly wrecked. It was afterwards as-
certained that an attempt had been made
to smuggle them back to the United
States, which attempt led to the
discovery of the fraud. There being
every evidence of the Captain's guilt,
search was made for him. It was found
that he and the crew had disappeared
soon after the Cordelia was wrecked.
He was afterwards traced to Bermuda,
when it was found he was in charge of the
scho. Ella, which vessel cleared from there
for Alms, A. C., and reached the latter
place this week. Mr. Jas. G. Jordan, of this
city, who had been watching matters for
the Assurance Co., and had put himself
in communication with Mr. R. G. Talbot
of Alms, was notified of the arrival, and
at once sought the aid of the Chief of
Police. Wednesday morning the Chief
sent policemen on the train to
Sussex, expecting to meet Capt. Charlton
on the cars. Mr. Jordan and Captain
Bisling accompanied him to identify the
man, but they were disappointed, as
Charlton had missed the train by being
too late for the ferry at Hopewell. Briggs
proceeded to Dorchester, and Messrs.
Jordan and Bisling returned to St. John.
Detective Taylor had been sent to Dor-
chester from Halifax, and yesterday
afternoon he and Briggs arrested Charlton
and had him lodged in Jail. He will
be taken from Dorchester to Halifax.

Property at Auction.
Mr. Haughton sold a mortgaged prop-
erty in Kings County by auction to-day,
the sum realized being \$398.

Wagon Looking After.
A dangerous place is reported at the
railway crossing near Daniel Lafferty's
house at the Haymarket. The other
night a woman ran through the trap
made by loose planks and was consider-
ably injured.

A sensation was caused in Cooper's
alley yesterday afternoon by the dis-
charge of a revolver from the window
of some house. An elderly legal gentleman
was passing at the time thought an
attempt would be made on his life, and
for some time was considerably excited
at the event.

Baptisms to-morrow.
The revival in the Free Baptist Church,
Waterloo street, is assuming large pro-
portions. Meetings are being held every
evening and at such the Vestry has
been so crowded this week that many
were unable to obtain admission. A
large number of candidates are expected
for baptism to-morrow, which will prob-
ably take place at the Straight Shore
at 7 a. m.

Indignation in Portland.
There is considerable talk and much in-
dignation by some of the residents of
Main street. It is said that at a com-
mune meeting last night an effort was
made to have something done to prevent
the work going on as proposed—that is,
the street widened to 60 feet, but it was
finally decided to proceed. The feeling
of many of the residents is that the
work should be done so as to give the
regular width of 66 feet, or left alone
together. The Sheriff has received in-
structions to summon a jury to assess
the land damages and the work will prob-
ably proceed.
