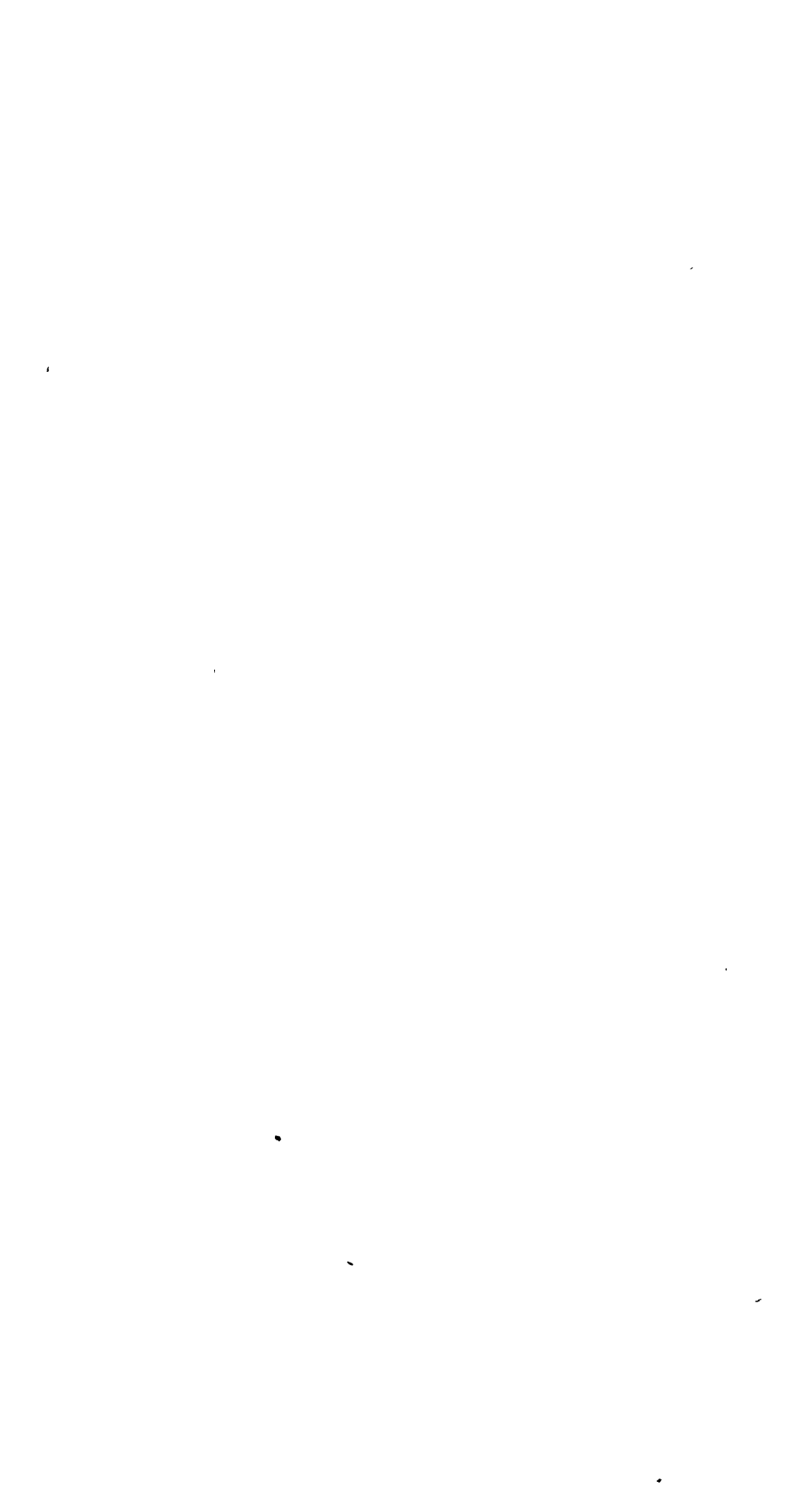


**LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL,**

*TUESDAY, 28th March, 1826.*
