## Articles of the Calendar

—AND—

### Astronomical Notices for the Year 1899

ON the left hand page of each month are given the rising and setting of the Sun, and the length of the day, also the data required for Solar observations, namely,—the Equation of Time (that is the difference between variable Sun Time and uniform Clock Time, to be added or subtracted according as one is behind or ahead of the other). also the Sun's Declination, at the instant of Mean Noon, Greenwich Time, and the Sun's apparent semi-diameter to the nearest tenth of a second. With these exceptions all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time at Charlottetown,—Latitude 46° 13' 55" N., Longitude 63° 7' 33" W.; giving 4h. 12m. 29.5sec. difference slow on Greenwich time.

The Meridian Altitude of the Sun (or Moon) for any day of the year by applying the Declination to the co-Latitude of the place, adding the Declination if North, subtracting if South.

For example,—To find the Mer. Alt. of the Sun at Charlottetown on the longest and shortest day of the year:

From the Sun's apparent semi-diameter, the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (that is the Sun's apparent semi-diameter as seen from the Sun's distance) may be found dividing by 107.44 the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the Earth. Thus we find for July, when the Sun's distance is greatest,  $15' 45'' \div 3 = 9'.45.3 = 8''.791$ . Also, on Dec. 31, when the sun is nearest the Semi-diameter  $16' 17''.5$  gives  $9''.077$  for Parallax.

On the right hand page for each month are given the Phases of the Moon, with its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown, to the nearest full minute of local mean time.

To assist in weather forecasts are added the Moon's Perigee and Apogee, the time of crossing the Equator and of reaching its greatest North and South Declination, these periods being found to be accompanied by atmospheric changes, more or less marked as they agree with the Moon's changes and Perigee. When two or more of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours, it is indicated by \*\* or \*\*\* accordingly.

## ECLIPSES.

During the year 1899 there will be three Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

(I.) A Partial Eclipse of the Sun January 11, 1899, mean time of conjunction 11h. 9m. 0.4sec. The central line of the Moon's shadow passes from the east of China, Corea, Japan to Alaska.

(II.) A Partial Eclipse, June 7th, visible from Spain, across Europe, Russia, Asia, Greenland and Siberia.

(III.) An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, December 2, only partially visible at the south-west portion of Australia and Van-dieman's Land. The central line, or the Moon's shadow passes the Antarctic Pole.

Apparent motion alternately direct and retrograde between the dates when he will be stationary to the east or west of the Sun, namely, January 11, West; March 24, East; May 9, West; July 21, East; Sep. 4, West  $18^{\circ}$ ; Nov. 16, East  $27^{\circ}$ ; Dec. 25, West; in conjunction with the Sun, 27th February; Superior, April 11; Inferior, June 14; Superior, Aug. 18; Inferior, Sep. 30; Superior, Dec. 5.

VENUS. Commencing as a morning Star, with direct motion through the year, he from apparent distance from the Sun being  $45^{\circ} 46''$  to the West; in superior conjunction, Sep. 15; afterwards reappears as an evening Star till the end of the year; commencing succession in conjunction with Mercury, Oct. 9; Jupiter, Oct. 29; Mars, Nov. 14; Saturn, Nov. 27; Mercury, 25. Succession commencing in conjunction with Mercury, Oct. 9; Jupiter, Oct. 29; Mercury, Nov. 14; Mars, Dec. 16; Saturn, Nov. 27.

MARS. Jan. 18, in opposition to the Sun, an evening star apparent motion, direct throughout the year.

JUPITER. Motion direct till stationary; Feb. 23, retrograde, June 27, direct to end of year; in opposition, April 25; in conjunction to the Sun, Nov. 12; coming in conjunction successively with Mars. Oct. 11; Mercury, Oct. 25; Venus, Oct. 29.

SATURN. Motion direct, April 2; retrograde, Aug. 21; direct till end of year; in conjunction with the Sun, Dec. 17; in conjunction to the Sun on the horizon; opposition, June 11.

NEPTUNE. An evening Star throughout the year, coming in conjunction with all the planets during the month of November and December.



3. If a storm arises from the east on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

## THE QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

**THE QUEEN.**—Victoria, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, May 24, 1819; succeeded to the throne June 20, 1837, on the death of her uncle King William IV.; was crowned June 28, 1838; and married Feb. 10, 1840, to his late Royal Highness Prince Albert, PRINCE CONSORT, who was born August 25, 1819, and died December 14, 1861. Her Majesty is the only child of his late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are—

Her Imperial Majesty Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL, Empress of Germany, born Nov. 21, 1840, and married Jan. 25, 1858, to Frederick, Crown Prince of Prussia, afterwards (March to June, 1888) second German Emperor, who died June 15, 1888, and has issue four sons, the eldest William, the present German Emperor, and four daughters.

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, PRINCE OF WALES, born Nov. 9, 1841; married March 10, 1863, Alexandra of Denmark (Princess of Wales), born December 1, 1844, and has issue, *Albert Victor*, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, born Jan. 8, 1854, died Jan. 14, 1892; George Frederick Ernest Albert, Duke of York, born June 3, 1855, married July 6, 1893, to Princess Victoria Mary (May) of Teck, and has issue a son Edward A. C. G. A. P. D., born June 23, 1894, the third in direct line of succession to the throne, Albert F. A. G., born Dec. 14, 1895, and Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary, born April 25, 1897; Louisa Victoria Alexandra Dagmar, born Feb. 20, 1867, married July 27, 1889, to Alexander, Duke of Fife; Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; Maude Charlotte Mary Victoria, born Nov. 26, 1869, married July 22, 1896, to Prince Charles, second son of Crown Prince of Denmark; and *Alexander*, born April 6, died April 7, 1871.

Her Royal Highness *Alice Maud Mary*, born April 25, 1843, married July 1, 1862, to Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse (afterwards Louis IV., Grand Duke of Hesse), and died, December 14, 1878; having had issue two sons, one the present Grand Duke of Hesse, and one accidentally killed, also five daughters, one of whom married Nov. 26, 1894, the Czar of Russia, Nicholas II.

His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844, succeeded his uncle, the elder brother of Prince Albert, as Duke of Saxe-Cobourg-Gotha, Aug. 23, 1893, married Her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, Jan. 23, 1874, and has issue two sons and three daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married to H. R. H. Prince Frederick Christian Charles Augustus of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5, 1866, and has issue three sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louise Caroline Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married March 21, 1871, to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll.

His Royal Highness Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught, born May 1, 1850; married March 13, 1879, to Princess Louise Margaret, daughter of the late Prince Frederick Charles of Prussia, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness *Leopold George Duncan Albert*, Duke of Albany, born April 7, 1853; married April 27, 1882, to Princess Helen of Waldeck, and died March 28, 1884, having had issue one son, now Duke of Albany, and one daughter.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice Mary Victoria Feodora, born April 14, 1857; married July 23, 1885, to Prince Henry of Battenburg, who died Jan. 20, 1896, and has issue three sons and one daughter.
