The Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the Boys' Home was held in the Home, in George Street, on Tuesday, February 28th, 1893.

His Honor the Lieut. Governor presided and Rev. Principal MacLaren opened the meeting with prayer.

The Chairman then asked the Rev. W. G. Wallace to read the Secretary's Report.

## THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

### BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

The Managers of the Boys' Home have much pleasure in presenting to the public a report of their work for the past year, and desire again to thank the many friends of the Institution, for the kindly interest and generous support given by them to the Boys' Home.

The Managers can now review the work of the past year with a feeling of thankfulness, believing that they have been enabled to afford relief to many little waifs who would otherwise have suffered from the ills of poverty and neglect, innocent victims too often of the faults and misfortunes of others. The continued scarcity of work, or perhaps more plainly speaking "the hard times" still causes much distress among the poorer classes, and in consequence the Home has been filled to its utmost capacity throughout the year; and, sad to say, many little ones under the required age have had to be admitted. The want of a nursery is still seriously felt, as the care of at least twenty "wee boys" really infants, increases the cares and duties of the Matron and her assistants.

The Managers are thankful to report that the general health of the inmates has been good throughout the year, with the exception of an outbreak of measles just before Christmas, when twenty boys were taken ill in one day. All made good recovery except one, a delicate little fellow who died after three days' illness.

dence, on the 1st of January, 1892, was one hundred and sixty-four; of these fourteen were sent to situations in the country; fifty-one were removed by parents or friends, and one died, leaving ninety-eight in the Home on the 31st December, 1892.

At the present time there are forty-nine boys of various ages serving their time with farmers, and seven have completed their terms of apprenticeship during the past year. Some have withdrawn the amount they have earned, saved for them by the Managers; others have left all or part at interest in the Savings Bank, among which are:—

The sum of seven hundred and seventy-six dollars has been paid to boys during the year in full and on account upon the expiration of their terms, and the sum of two thousand six hundred and fifty-five dollars and sixty-one cents is still at the credit of boys serving their various terms. One lad, David A., having a fancy for a trade, is to commence business shortly as a tinsmith, in Orangeville. His brother George has also served his term, but is remaining with the farmer and going to school until spring, as he says:—"I can hire for as much for eight months in the spring as for twelve months now." He also says "I am a Presbyterian, a Tory and a loyal Orangeman."

The Managers find the plan of writing to the boys in a friendly way very satisfactory, as it causes the boys to look upon their "special correspondent" as a personal friend. Some of the letters are interesting as well as amusing, as the lads very soon assumed an air of proprietor-

ship, enumerating the number of horses, cows, pigs, ducks, geese, etc., "we have," very often in the first letter after their arrival, for instance :—

"MY DEAR FRIENDS,—We have two pigs, forty hens, twenty-six sheep, sixteen cows, three "calfs," three horses. The horse's name is Nero ; the second, the biggest, is Polly ; and the smallest is Prince. And all the people who I live with are kind to me, and we have a dog, its name is Watch. I like to play with him. I go to Sunday school and church on Sunday, and I get Sunday school papers, and I like to read them. We are going to have a picnic on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. I will close my letter. Your loving friend,

WILLIE W."

Another boy, Charley T., writes :—

"I like my place very much, and I think they like me, but think I am very small for the age given, so if you will please say I am ten I will have longer to stay, as I like Mr. and Mrs. B., and I like the baby."

Another writes :—

"I do like this place. I am getting along all right, for I know you had bother with me when I was there. I hope you will tell my mother when she comes I am getting along all right. I hope she does let me stay here. I do love to stay here. The farmer is very kind to me. I am going to a picnic with my farmer, Friday. All the farmers are going, so he is going to take me with him for the afternoon. I am going to write to my mother when you write back—that is all." Later the same boy writes :—"I am very thankful for the nice book you sent me. I have been going to school. All that I do every day is, I put down hay for the cows and sometimes feed the cows, when I am not at school. There is a little baby here, and he likes me very much, and he is glad to see me when I come home



from school. I like to live here very much. There is only a little boy that lives here and myself.

Your loving friend,

HARRY H."

"DEAR MISS S.:—

I am very sorry that I didn't write to you any sooner. I hope that you are all well. I am getting along out here well with Mr. Brien. I hope that Miss McKay is well and all the boys. I hope that the boys are enjoying their Christmas dinner. I must tell that our Sunday school is going to have a Christmas tree on the 5th of January. I was glad to receive a letter from you, and I hope the boys will write to me, and perhaps I can write them one. Ask Miss McKay to read this to the boys if she has any time. Tell all the dear ladies how I am spending Christmas. I hope that Mr. MacDonald is well, and tell him to write a letter and send me a Christmas present. Wishing you all a merry Christmas and a happy New Year. Tell Miss Blight to write, and I would be very glad to receive a letter from you all.

I hope that you will receive this letter, and I hope that all will send to me a Christmas present. I must tell you that there is a man that lives near us, who was speaking to me in the springtime, who would like to have a boy. His name is Mr. B. Gahuns. I must close my letter.

To the many friends who, during the past year, have, at various times, thoughtfully provided excursions on the lake, trips, treats, picnics, etc. To the various butchers, bakers and grocers who have been good enough to contribute in kind. To Messrs. Slight, Tidy, Skinner and Cottrell, florists, for plants, seeds, etc., for the boys' garden; and also to Mr. E. B. Osler in again generously giving each boy a new ten cent piece at Christmas.

The older boys, under the careful teaching of Miss Blight and her assistant Miss Kerr, show pleasing progress in the day-school.

A most cordial invitation is again extended to all desiring to visit the institution. The managers feel assured that such visits must surely result in increasing the interest and sympathy in the work there carried on for the poor outcast boys of the city.

#### MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

In looking over my first report of the Boy's Home, presented in 1860, I gave an account of the physical condition of the boys on their admission and the means used to prevent disease, as well as the result of my experience of the work in the Home during its first year: I pointed out the importance to the health of the boys of providing them with nourishing food, comfortable surroundings and suitable exercise. During the many years, that have since passed, these essentials, I am pleased to say, have been carefully kept in view, and the results have been very satisfactory.

I observe that during the year the number of boys in the Home has been about the average, viz. 100. In common with the experience of former years, measles and disease of the respiratory track have prevailed, and I have to report the loss of one of our number through measles complicated with double pneumonia. Another boy received a fracture of the arm, but he made a good recovery.

It is most gratifying to know that the troublesome scalp disease, which at one time prevailed in the Institution, has entirely disappeared.

The main building is well drained and heated, and its surroundings are in good sanitary condition. That part known as the infirmary we were unable to use this winter without buying a furnace, which, of course, would involve a considerable expense. It was found that the conveyance of the heat from the Main Building to the Infirmary was not a success.

The subject of admission of children younger than those who are now eligible according to the rule of the Home has been discussed by its friends. The minimum age of entrance is five years; the admission of children younger than that would of course necessitate additional assistance and a greater outlay of money than is at present expended. If, however, it is decided to receive them the present Infirmary building might be utilized provided it was properly heated, and a cottage or small building erected on the grounds to be used for an Hospital or Infirmary.

There were two kinds of instruction which we were not able to impart during the past year in consequence of not having sufficient money on hand to do so, viz., the drill exercise and musical instruction. I trust that somebody will be generous enough to supply a sufficient sum of money to enable us to employ proper instructors for these two very important matters. The physical development of the boys depends very considerably upon proper exercise, and the effects of music, admittedly, is most beneficial in imparting a good sentiment amongst those who take it up.

I would also suggest that the building be lighted by gas instead of, as at present, by coal oil, which is most dangerous, as we all have reason to know.

I cannot conclude this report without thanking my colleagues, Dr. W. P. Caven and Dr. J. D. Thorburn for the

## OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

*Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.*

The institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

"Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOY'S HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctors's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness, of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has

been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
