Thanksgiving Assembly.
The fourth of the annual series of hops under the auspices of the Maple Leaf Club was held on Thursday last and is deserving of more than a passing notice. These assemblies have for years attracted attention, and members of the club always look forward with keen interest to the time when they may be fortunate enough to obtain an invitation to one of these exclusive gatherings. Those held before were good, but last Thursday's season and the unanimous opinion of the guests was that it was entitled to take the entire confectionery.

The gathering was conducted so far as invitations were concerned much like the gathering at a prize fight. Scarcely was the time and place strictly enjoined on the lucky few who got a bid for that some of the great unwashed should force their unwelcome presence on the festive gathering.
