### MAYOR'S REPORT 1906.

TO THE RATEPAYERS OF THE TOWN OF WOLFVILLE. LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:-I herewith present for your consideration my annual report of the condition of town affairs for the civic year just ending. In order that the condition of the various departments may be seen and under-stood at a glance I have thought it best to give in as brief a form as possible a review of the work performed by the various committees, ending up with a general summary of the conditions as a whole.

FINANCE It is most gratifying to learn from the report of this committee, as well as the auditors' detailed statement, that the finances of the town are in such a satisfactory state. Com mencing on January 1st, 1905, with a small credit balance of \$74.79, we were enabled to give the ratepayers, for the year 1906, a tax rate of \$1.60 per \$100.00, and at the same time appropriate to each committee such sum as they asked for to carry on their work, and in many cases this sum was for to carry on their work, and in many cases this sum was liberal, more so than usual. On the 1st of January, 1907, we had cash on hand \$1490.12 and a further credit in good and collectable taxes of say \$2500.00. While this may seem a large credit balance, the explanation is simple and is in part due to three known causes, viz:—the payment into general account of \$615.00 from water construction (which sum had been borrowed by a former Council), the prompt payment of taxes by many ratepayers, which taken together would make our actual cash balance about \$600.00. At the time the estimates were made up the Council had no means of knowing that these conditions would prevail. I means of knowing that the constitution would, however, be remiss in my duty did I not call your attention to the very large sum in unpaid taxes, and while the town officials and the Council are to a certain extent reattention to the very large sum in uppair taxes, and wince the town officials and the Council are to a certain extent responsible, they having at their command all the power of the law to enforce prompt payment, and which power has only been exercised in a few aggravated cases in the past, a more general carrying out of the law in this respect will have to occur at an early date if the ratepayers are to be treated fairly, it is unfair that those who pay promptly should have to suffer for the short comings of the few and the town be obliged to pay interest on debit bank balances, even though the interest be but \$47.36 as it was this year. The real trouble, however, lies with the ratepayers themselves, who do not seem to realize the fact that the town requires ready money to carry on its affairs in a business-like manure. Taking the names of those who still owe taxes for 1906, 90 percent, of them could if they desired pay their taxes to-day, the other to per cent, who through no fault of their own find themselves unable at this time to liquidate their debts, will undoubtedly settle at an early date and thus avoid having expenses added to their tax bills. Too much credit cannot be given to the committee for the manner in which they have performed their ard tous duties as at every monthly meeting they have presented to the Council a detailed statement, showing the actual financial condition of the town at that date.

POLICE.

POLICE.

This committee reports that the rowdyism on our streets that has at times prevailed in the past, has to a large extent peen stopped. Offenders against the law have been promptly dealt with and where the evidence against them was clear they have been heavily fined. Our present police officer deserves credit for the manner in which he has promptly investigated all matters called to his attention and for the faithful performance of his duties: he has dealt promptly investigated all matters called to his attention and for the faithful performance of his duties; he has deal with the unruly element without fear or favor, and has stopped the liquor traffic that at one time was notorious. The committee recommend and suggest that the citizens in general aid them in their efforts for good order in the towr instead of finding fault, as is frequently the case when the committee in order to bring about a certain result take drast its measures.

After the appointment and organization of this committee they held many meetings for the purpose of deciding as to the best method of improving the streets. It was finally resolved to ask the Council for sufficient money to enable them to hire or purchase a stone crusher, with the object in riew of building a sample piece of road on Main St. were able to either hire or purchase a crusher, they were unable to obtain power to operate the same, hence the ex unable to obtain power to operate the same, hence the experiment had to be abandomed for the time being. It is, however, hoped that the incoming committee will carry on the work and lay a short piece of road for the consideration of the ratepayers. While absolutely no criticism is intended for the present or the past street committee, nevertheless it is a fact that cannot be denied, that it is an absolute waste of public money to endeavor to keep up our present streets with the material at hand, and the incoming Council should work along the lines of permanent streets. It is believed by the present Council that the work can be carried on without becoming a burden on the ratepayer. Owing to the fact that the Superintendent of Streets was engaged on water works extension, much of the work provided for on streets had to be neglected, nevertheless many repairs to streets and bridges were completed.

cf the reservoir was increased by about 2,000,000 gallons at much less cost and on an Improved plan to that consider ed by the Council in 1905. Replacements of water pipes on Main St. and Locust Ave. and the removal from above the apron and dam of the accumulation of years of leaves and other refuse, clean down to bed rock, was also supervised by this committee. It was estimated by the committee in 1905 that to raise the reservoir about 4 feet, lay 4 in pipes on a portion of Main St. and Locust Ave., and put in one or more new hydrants would cost about \$3000.00. This sum of money the ratepayers authorized the town to borrow. It therefore affords me much pleasure to be able to report that the entire work was completed at a cost much below that named. Four \$500.00 bonds were sold at par (which speaks well for the credit of the town), the necessary work performed, \$615.00 paid into general funds and we still have on hand two unsold \$500.00 bonds and \$256 13 to the credit of water construction account. At this point I would like to strongly impress upon the minds of the ratepayers that the Superintendent of Water, the Water Committee and the Council knew just exactly what they were going to do, how the work was to be carried on, just what they are doing to-day and their plans to rthe future in re. reservoir. They will welcome any legitimate suggestion that may be made and will speedily satisfy any ratepayer who will apply at the Town Office of the above facts as stated. I make these statements because certain lalse reports have been circulated by parties who have never attempted to make themselves acquainted with the plans of the authorities, but have freely criticised methods without knowing the ultimate result sought. Personally I made two official visits to the dam and water land of the town. On the first occasion I was accompanied by Councillors Hales and Fitch, together with the Superintendent and Town Clerk. POOR COMMITTER.

BOAD OF FIRE ESCAPES.

This Board examined all the buildings in the town coming under their charge, and found them strictly within the law as regar's proper means of escape in case of fire.

HEALTH OPPICER.

It is unnecessary for me to add to this report as it speaks for itself and we are certainly to be congratulated on having the sanitary conditions of the town in such a satisfactory state. I refer you to the full report of the Health Officer.

ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER PLANT.

One of the most important matters that came before the Council was brought to their attention by a committee from the Board of Trade who saked the Council to consider the question of purchasing and owning their own Electric Light and Power Plant. Having considered the matter carefully, it was decided to call a public meeting and ascertain the will of the ratepayers. This meeting was beld on November 38th and after the matter was thoroughly discussed a resolution was passed by a large majority authorizing the Council to apply to the Legislature in the proper manner. This committee is now working on the matter and have every reason to believe that the bill will become law at the next session of the Legislature.

To the ratepayers I likewise extend my thanks for the high honor they bestowed upon me, the confidence reposed in me in entrasting to my care the general supervision of their affairs, their willingness at all times to adjust in an amicable manner all differences that might arise between them and the officials of the town or myself, especially when I have been called upon in my official capacity to bring some law into force which I was sworn to carry out for the good of the mass and which was not always a pleasant duty.
