





Parliamentary.

Quebec, March 28. On Thursday night after the report left, Mr. Allan MacNab asked the Ministry whether they intended to proceed during the present session with the bill to amend the law with respect to the solemnization of matrimony.

Mr. Rolph said it was not usual to ask such questions of the Government before the House, but he would answer and say it was the intention to proceed with it and make it as suitable to the country as possible.

On motion of Mr. Bagley, an address was voted for all documents in relation to the erection of the Court House at Montreal.

A message was received from the Legislative Council agreeing to the bill on the City of Toronto Water Works and Water Co., with amendments.

Hon. Mr. MacDonald introduced a bill to simplify the proceedings in the Courts of Queen's Bench and Courts of Common Pleas in Upper Canada.

A bill to explain "An Act to provide a remedy against absent defendants," and also a bill to amend the Companies and Partnership Act, 1869.

Hon. Mr. MacDonald was asked to the select committee on the petition of Messrs. Bryce, McMurich & Co. and others of Toronto.

Mr. Dabrot moved an address, assuring Her Majesty that no inconvenience, &c., was occasioned to the trade of the Province and to the shipping interest in general, from the expenses attending the proceedings in the Court of Vice Admiralty at Quebec, in the Province empowered to amend the same, and praying that Her Majesty will be pleased to adopt such measures as may be necessary for empowering the Government to pay the expenses of the said Court.

Mr. Christie of Quebec moved an amendment that a Committee of seven members be appointed to enquire whether any and what fees are paid to the Proctors or Barristers practicing in the Court of Vice Admiralty in and about the said Court.

On motion of Mr. Cameron, the debate was further adjourned till this day week.

The bill to incorporate the Bytown and Pembroke Railway Company was read a second time and referred to the standing committee on Railways.

The House then adjourned till Tuesday.

QUEBEC, March 28. The Toronto election committee have agreed to report against Mr. Boulton, considering that the property in Montreal, on which he qualified was not worth £300 sterling free from incumbrance.

QUEBEC, March 29. Mr. Brown moved the reception of the petition of a woman from the Parish of Malabar, complaining that the Cure of the parish had refused to marry her husband, and praying for an inquiry.

Mr. LaTerniere denied the allegation in the petition, and moved an amendment that it be read.

Mr. Brown said, he did not pretend to judge of the correctness of the allegations in the petition, but he thought to reject it was wrong, and invited the question of the right of petition. He hoped therefore, the House would allow the petition to be read. The woman had a right to be heard.

Mr. Caselin said, the motion should be received. The motion for reference would be the proper time to speak on its merits.

Dr. Ferris said the woman was insane, and allegations false. He colored Mr. Brown for resorting to such modes of attack on the Roman Catholic Clergy.

After some conversation, Dr. LaTerniere withdrew his opposition to the reception of the petition.

Mr. Stevenson introduced a bill to extend the act for the formation of Joint Stock Companies in Upper Canada, to the construction of piers, wharves and harbors.

The House concurred in the report of the Committee of the whole on the Ottawa and Grand Trunk Railroad Bill.

The St. Lawrence and the Huron Railroad Bill was read a third time and passed.

The Report of the Committee on the Toronto election petition was read in the House to the same effect as telegraphed yesterday.

The order of the day was read for further consideration of Mr. Drummond's motion, that the bill to define the rights of the Seigniors and Censitaires in Canada, and to facilitate the redemption thereof, should be read a second time. Mr. Sicotte is speaking against the proposition of the Seigniors as expressed by their counsel at the bar as report leaves.

QUEBEC, March 30. Last night, the amendments made by the Legislative Council to the Bill to amend the Charter of Toronto Glass and Water Works Company were agreed to.

The bill to incorporate the Bytown and Ottawa Railroad Company was considered in Committee.

The bill to authorize the City of Hamilton to negotiate a Loan of £250,000 to consolidate the city debt, and for other purposes, was read the second time.

The debate on the Seigneurial Tenure Bill continued to adjournment. No vote was taken. Messrs. Cartier, Sicotte, Levesque, Lacoste, and other French members spoke against pretensions of Seigniors.

To-night, Mr. Rose introduced a bill to increase the law costs under certain circumstances in Upper Canada, and for other purposes in connection with suits at law.

On motion of Mr. Mackenzie, certain papers relative to grants on Indian Lands at the Grand River were ordered.

Mr. Mackenzie moved for certain papers relative to Rifeau Canal. The motion was resisted by Government and withdrawn.

On motion of Mr. Sanborn, correspondence were ordered relative to Indian Settlement, in the Eastern Townships, and for compensation of injuries received from citizens of the State of New Hampshire.

Mr. Merritt moved for a select committee to consider an address to Her Majesty, in favor of permitting certain articles of Canadian produce in the markets of Great Britain free of duty.

After a discussion the motion was lost. Yeas 25; Nays 29.

Mr. Merritt moved that part of the message of the Governor General communicating the reply of the Imperial Government to the address of the Provincial Government, praying that medals, may be conferred upon the survivors of the Canadian Militia who were present at the various engagements during the late war with United States, which are not enumerated in the general order of 1st June, 1847, be read with a view to refer the same to the select committee. Motion withdrawn for a week at request of Government, and upon understanding that Government would take the matter into consideration.

A call of the Legislative Council for consideration of the Representation Bill is ordered for 4th May, and it is said the prorogation of the House will take place about the 15th May.

QUEBEC, March 31. Last night, after the report left, Mr. Morin presented return to an address of information relative to the Tross Pistoles and Miramichi Railroad. Also, return to an address for the copy of the third annual Report of the Directors of the Lunatic Asylum, Toronto.

On motion of Mr. Merritt, an address was voted for a copy of Contract entered into for furnishing Tug Boats between Prescott and Montreal. Also, for the surveys when obtained, of the channel between Prescott and Montreal. Also, another for a statement of monies received from the sales of all Public lands since the 20th May, 1849, under the provisions of the Act to raise an income of £100,000 out of the public lands of Canada for Common School education. Also, a return of one million of acres of land set apart for the purpose of creating a fund for the establishment and support of Common Schools and District Libraries.

THE CLERGY RESERVES BILL AND THE HOUSE OF LORDS. The majority of 83 fortunately disposes of the controversy on the Clergy Reserves Bill, so far as the House of Commons is concerned. There is no reason why the Committee on the measure should not bring up the Report within five minutes after the speaker has left the Chair; for the principle one adopted there are no details to furnish matter for dispute.

The decision of the questions now rests with the House of Lords; and there is good ground for confidence in the determination of that Assembly to disregard the appeals which have been so loudly made to the prejudice of its members, and to look exclusively to the dictates of justice and to the public good. Whatever doubt could have existed as to the final settlement of the controversy has been disposed of by the decision of Friday night.—Neither Lord Derby nor the Bishop of Exeter can seriously believe that it is possible for the Imperial Parliament to retain and invest dominion over the Clergy Reserves in a tolerable form, while it is deliberately renounced by the House of Commons. Sir John Pakington and an anonymous Italian Catholic were shocked by the declaration of a Bishop that he would do justice, whatever consequences might ensue.—To simplify matters, it will appear a still more startling proposition that injustice must be perpetrated although the Bill in the House of Lords must be prepared to persevere in maintaining their own nominal consistency with full knowledge of the inevitable consequences which will result. The Clergy Reserves will be confiscated if the Government measure is delayed beyond the present session; and the House of Commons will not assist in coercing the Canadians to obey a law which it has affirmed to be inexpedient and unjust.

Nor must any poor wretch be determined by religious prejudice, rather than by a due regard to political justice, suppose that the evils inflicted on the cause which he prizes will end with the destruction of existing endowments. "The remnant of property," said the Chancellor of the Exchequer, "when you take to preserve would be too desirous—then time to desist—pursued by the odium and hatred which you bring on the religious body whose champions you profess, and I do not, therefore, believe it is true that the decision of a political question, in whatever way it may be determined, can in no degree affect the real claims of the English Church to the attachments of those whom it may desire to bring or to retain within its pale. But the conditions are such, not always, highly advocated, nor it may be supposed, wholly disapproved, and when it is seen that, for the sake of a paltry third Part of the Clergy Reserves, the members of that Church are willing to set their countrymen in a deplorable and unchristian manner, no deep study of history or of human nature is required to show the inevitable prejudice which will be felt by the bulk of the community against a minority who have identified their pretension with all that is popular and unjust. There never was a case in which expediency and justice more entirely coincided; and no school of economists has yet recommended the use of wrong means to attain an undesirable end. Unfortunately, however, we cannot hope that the discussion in the House of Lords will be conducted with an exclusive regard to

the justice of the claims to be conceded or even to the interest of the Church.—Party objects and supposed personal propensities will bias the votes of Lord Derby and his immediate followers on the one hand, and of a considerable section of the episcopal bench on the other. Yet the Bishop of Exeter might well pause when he finds that his protest against the Ministerial Bill or echoed by the National Club, which has of course come forward on this occasion to contribute to the agitation in little quota of mischievous nonsense. The coalition of learned prelates with the sectarian brawlers of Exeter hall is in itself almost a sufficient proof that their common cause is untenable.

If the disposal of lands in every district or of the proceeds of their sale, is not a local question it is difficult to understand what affairs properly belong to the control of the provincial Legislatures. Even those opponents of the Bill who have asserted, on the authority of casual gossip, that public opinion in the Province is hostile to the present measure, virtually admit the right of the Canadian people to deal with matters which concern them selves alone. At the same time, Mr. Gladstone's censure is well deserved by those tyros in colonial matters who would grant constitutions to dependencies, and who yet refuse to recognize the resolutions of their representative bodies as the authoritative expression of the popular will. If the statements made with respect to colonial opinion are true, the wits which are expended in private will have their prospect in the Provincial Legislature.—Statesmen who have satisfied themselves that Canada has a right to administer its own internal affairs, will not feel themselves bound to give effect to the alleged or supposed wishes of a community who have the right and power, not merely of declaring their will, but of carrying them out in practice.—London Morning Chronicle.

ARRIVAL OF THE STEAMSHIP "NIAGARA." NEW YORK, March 31. The Steamship Niagara arrived at Halifax, last evening. She left Liverpool on the 19th inst.

ENGLAND. Parliamentary business very important. Lord John Russell stated in the House that the Mexican Government had reduced the duty on printed Calendars and papers, and measures thereto would soon be introduced.

J. W. Mills called the attention to the fact that the only winter route of the British to Canada is through the Territory of the United States, and asked if the government intended to facilitate by guarantee or otherwise the completion of the Quebec and Halifax Road.

Mr. Peel, for the Government, was unable to state.

Lord John Russell's subject of Austrian proceedings towards Sardinia, subject in consequence of the Milan inscription.—The Sardinian Government had requested the British Government to interfere against aggression, and Great Britain had written a strong letter to Vienna, but in the meantime the Austrian authorities had stated that it was their intention to remove Sardinian troops from parties proving themselves unaccounted. Lord John Russell also stated that government had received notice that the Grand Duke of Tuscany intended to visit the Emperor, and allowed them to leave Tuscany.

FRANCE. The Emperor's policy at present is to present a quiet aspect towards all governments until after the coronation.

The political news is scarce. Great anxiety is manifested for the Pope's visit to Paris. It is not certain that he will come.

On the 18th, the Emperor of Austria insists on the Pope coming to Vienna to crown him, but to this Napoleon will not consent.

The Niagara brings 95 passengers and a full freight. On account of the fog prevailing she struck at the entrance of the harbor, but received no damage.

The Ark steamer Arctic arrived out on the 18th. The screw steamer Arctic arrived out on the 18th, in 12 days and 12 hours, from New York.

The screw Steamer City of Manchester, from Philadelphia, arrived out in 11 days and 8 hours.

The Royal Mail steamship City, sailed from Boston on the 30th March, at noon, with 38 passengers, and 15 the 4th of April. Among the former is Mrs. Harriet Beecher.

Mrs. Fillmore died at Willard's Hotel, at Washington, at 9 o'clock, A. M., on the 30th March. She had been suffering from pneumonia, for some time past, but no serious result was anticipated until within a few days. Mr. Fillmore with his family and friends will leave with her remains early to-morrow for Buffalo. The senate adjourned immediately on hearing of the death of Mrs. Fillmore.

The Prussian Minister had issued cards for a State Dinner at Washington on the 30th ult., but it was postponed in

consequence of the death of Mrs. Fillmore. A terrible steamboat disaster occurred at Galvestone Bay on the 23rd. The Steamers Neptune and Farmer were racing from Houston to Galvestone, when the latter, exploded, killing the Captain, Clerk and Second Engineer; 13 of the crew, and about 20 passengers were either killed or missing; 20 passengers, mostly ladies, were saved.

INDIA AND CHINA. Express reached London on the 23rd inst., with dates from Bombay to February 5; and Hong Kong January 28.

The revolution of Ava had terminated in the deposition of the King of Burmah by his brother. The stockade at Aeng Pass had been surprised and captured by the British, on the 5th of January, but General Steele had been repulsed before the Sitang Stockade. A Boat expedition against a robber chief near Donabaw, was also driven back and a second was under orders. The King of Siam had, it is said, opened negotiations with the British, the British Commander-in-Chief, and an embassy had started for Ayack.

At Bombay trade was brisk and money abundant. Calcutta market depressed.

In China trade was inactive, owing to continued unfavorable intelligence from the interior. The United States Minister had been appointed to the province of Szechuan, and the rapid and successful progress of the rebels, who were close to Han-Kow-Chin, one of the largest marts for trade in the empire. Their object was to advance and capture Nanking. Other towns had fallen into the hands of the rebels. Large operations had taken place in tea, owing to the accounts of 8th November, received from London, and prices of Congous and greens had advanced.

Accounts had been received from the Cassini steam freight, dated Wilmop in the island of Peking. It is stated by the press that the French Charge d'Affaires in China has had a long conference with the Mandarin of the province relative to the treaties which authorize the exercise of the Catholic religion in the Celestial Empire.

FOREIGN ITEMS. There has been a horrible railroad accident in Hanover, which concerns you in America. A collision took place between a passenger train and an emigrant train—seven persons were killed—one of them a young clergyman from the United States, who was completely impaled by a large piece of wood. His young wife—they came on their wedding tour—had both her legs broken, and on seeing her husband die, lost her reason. She expired a few hours after.
