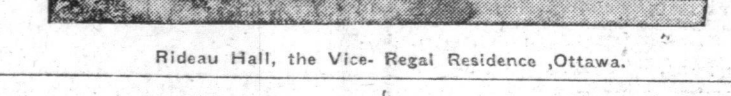

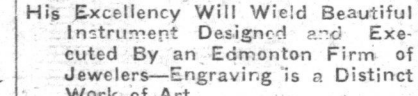

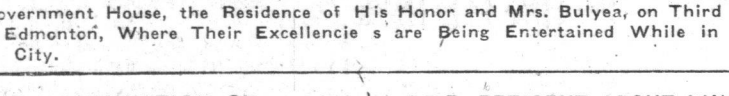
MADE IN EDMONTON TROWEL TO BE USED

THE ILLUMINATION OF THE CITY IS SUPERB.

A short distance away it presents the appearance of a permanent structure. Flugs, bunting, evergreen, shrouds of white and provincial crests are arranged to form a most symmetrical whole.
