WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—The early paragraphs of President Cleveland's message to Congress to-day deal with foreign relations, the tariff, the Chinese act and the extension of time for registration, canal tolls, extradition treaties, the Samoan difficulties. He details the Hawaiian trouble, and says as soon as information as to results of his visit is obtained Congress will be fully informed.

Touching the silver question, he says: "The recent report of the provision law requiring the purchase of silver bullion by the Government as a feature of our monetary scheme has met with the approval of the people."
