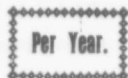




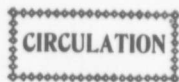

DONT be afraid to describe minutely the quality and condition of the stamps or articles you offer for sale, in advertising be brief and to the point, it pays.

DIE CUT STAMP MOUNTS.

Messrs R. F. Albrecht & Cos, 90 Nassau Street, New York, U.S.A., surpassing stamp Mounts at 15c. per 1000 are the best in quality and price that I have seen they emanate from that well known English firm Messrs. Butler Bros, of Clevedon.

DONT you think that a 40 word sale or exchange advertisement under "Wants & Offers" one insertion and this publication one year is worth 50c. or 2/- if you have use for it. Then why hesitate.

A STAMP COLLECTORS ALMANACK.

Mr. S. Stewarts 1897 Stamp Collectors Almanack in sheet form contained a compilation of information most valuable to philatelists, the Family Sheet Almanack is popular in Great Britain but I do not think it meets with American approval. Mr. Stewart informs me that his 1898 issue will appear in book form price as usual 1d. = 2c. take my advice and do not fail to secure a copy.

DONT use perforated stamp waste to mount stamps it causes loss of time and often damages most valuable stamps.

Mr. Paterson then made an important announcement. "I had hoped," he said "that Mr. Mulock, the Postmaster General, would have been here to night, because it would have been more proper that he should make the announcement that I have to make. He has given me permission to make it.

A POSTAL REFORM.

The permission came over the telephone. He said: "We have and expect to have closer and more intimate commercial relations with Britain under our tariff than ever before. You know, he says, that the Government have recognized the fact that while now you can at a cost of three cents send a letter of communication weighing an ounce to any part of Canada or the United States, it costs ten cents to send that weight of letter to Great Britain. Economies have been effected while efficiency has been maintained and increased in our Post Office Department. Revenues have come in under the Postmaster General that have enabled him to give effect to the wishes of the Canadian Government, who want to do everything they fairly can to facilitate trade between Canada and Great Britain, and he tells me the word has gone forth and has been flashed across the Atlantic that after January next an ounce letter may be sent to every part of the British Empire, where ever the British flag floats and three cents shall carry it.

This announcement was received with loud and prolonged cheers.

To those collectors interested in B. N. A. Stamps the above figures are a fair criterion to go by in the valuation of the same. I believe a stamp is worth what it will bring at any of the principal auction sales of the world. Catalogues are becoming as numerous and as conflicting in prices and description of stamps that it seems to me that the public auction is the place to learn the true value of a good stamp, and as a rule it does not pay to offer for sale stamps of a doubtful value such as cheap remainders or commemorative and speculative issues. To any collector interested in the value of postage stamps I would recommend him to subscribe to either or all of the following publications and acquaint himself with the markets quotations.

"The Weekly Philatelic Era," "The Stamp Collectors Fortnightly" and "The Boston Stamp Book."

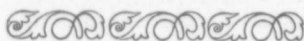

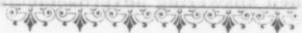

Canada's Foreign Postal Rate.

LATEST INTELLIGENCE.

The following notice to postmasters has been sent out by the Government: Postmasters are informed that the proposed reduction in the postage rate from Canada to Great Britain and other parts of the Empire to 3 cents per ounce has been suspended, pending a conference with the Imperial and Colonial authorities in regard to the subject of Inter-Imperial postage, and in the meantime the old letter rate of 5 cents per 1/2 ounce continues in force. It is hoped that the postmasters will do all in their power to cause this to be generally understood, so that letters may not be sent forward short-paid and so subjected to collection of double the deficient postage on delivery.
