## LAWS AND REGULATIONS

OF THE

# British and Foreign Bible Society,

---

- I. The designation of the Society shall be THE BRITISH AND FOREIGN BIBLE SOCIETY, of which the main object shall be to encourage a wider circulation of the Holy Scriptures without note or comment; the only copies in the Language of the United Kingdom, to be circulated by the Society, shall be the Authorized Version.
- II. This Society shall add its endeavors to those employed by other Societies, for circulating the Scriptures through the British Dominions; and shall also according to its ability extend its influence to other countries, whether Christian, Mahometan, or Pagan.
- III. Each Subscriber of One Guinea annually shall be a Member.
- IV. Each Subscriber of Ten Guineas at one time shall be a Member for Life.
- V. Each Subscriber of Five Guineas annually shall be a Governor.
- VI. Each Subscriber of Fifty Pounds at one time, or who shall, by one additional payment, increase his original subscription to Fifty Pounds, shall be a Governor for life.
- VII. Governors shall be entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.
- VIII. An Executor, paying a bequest of Fifty Pounds shall be a Member for life; or, of One Hundred Pounds a Governor for life.
- IX. A Committee shall be appointed to conduct the business of the Society, consisting of thirty-six Laymen, six of whom shall be Foreigners, resident in London or its vicinity; half the remainder shall be members of the Church of England, and the other half members of other denominations of Christians. Twenty-seven of the above number, who shall have most frequently attended, shall be eligible for re-election for the ensuing year.
- The Committee shall appoint all Officers, except the Treasurer, and call Special General Meetings, and shall be charged with procuring for the Society suitable patronage, both British and Foreign.

X. Each member of the Society shall be entitled, under the direction of the Committee, to purchase Bibles and Testaments at the Society's prices which shall be as low as possible.

XI. The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the first Wednesday in May, when the Treasurer and Committee shall be chosen, the accounts presented and the proceedings of the foregoing year presented.

XII. The President, Vice-President, and Treasurer shall be considered *ex-officio* members of the Committee.

XIII. Every Clergyman or Dissenting Minister, who is a member of the Society, shall be entitled to attend and vote at all meetings of the Committee.

XIV. The Secretaries for the time being shall be considered as members of Committee; but no other person deriving any emolument from the Society shall have that privilege.

XV. At the General Meetings, and at meetings of the Committee, the President, or in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list then present; and in the absence of the Vice-President the Treasurer; and in his absence such member as shall be voted for the purpose, shall preside at the meeting.

XVI. The Committee shall meet on the first Wednesday in every month, or oftener if necessary.

XVII. The Committee shall have the power of nominating such persons as have rendered essential services to the Society either MEMBERS FOR LIFE, OR GOVERNORS FOR LIFE.

XVIII. The Committee shall also have the power of nominating HONORARY MEMBERS from among Foreigners, who have promoted the objects of the Society.

XIX. The whole of the Minutes of every General Meeting shall be signed by the Chairman.

## REGULATIONS

Adopted at the Annual General Meeting of the Society in  
1826 and 1827.

I. That the fundamental law of the Society, which limits its operations to the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, be fully and distinctly recognized as excluding the circulation of the Apocrypha.

II. That in conformity to the preceding resolution, no pecuniary aid can be granted to any Society circulating the Apocrypha; nor except for the purpose of being applied in conformity to the said resolution, to any individual whatever.

III. That in all cases in which grants, whether gratuitous or otherwise, of the Holy Scriptures, either in whole or in part,

IV. That all grants of Scriptures to the Society which circulates the Apocrypha, be made under the express condition that they be sold or distributed without alteration or addition; and that the proceeds of the sale of any such copies of the Scripture be held at the disposal of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

## LAWs AND REGULATIONS

OF THE

# Nova Scotia Bible Society.

---

I. This Society shall be called THE BIBLE SOCIETY OF NOVA SCOTIA AND ITS DEPENDENCIES; the object of which shall be the same as that of the British and Foreign Bible Society, viz.: to encourage the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, without note or comment, and to furnish copies of the Scriptures *gratis* to the indigent, and at reduced prices to those requiring them.

II. The business of the Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and a Committee.

III. In order to give effect to the designs of this Institution, benefactors and subscriptions shall be solicited, and books opened for receiving the names of benefactors and subscribers.

IV. Every person contributing annually Ten Shillings at one time, or a donation of Ten Pounds, shall be considered a member of the Society.

V. A General Meeting of the members of this Society will be held every year, before which will be laid the accounts and proceedings of the preceding year.

VI. The whole of the subscriptions and donations, after deducting incidental expenses, shall be remitted annually in aid of the funds of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

VII. Every member of this Society shall be entitled to purchase, under the direction of the Committee, Bibles and Testaments at the reduced prices of the Society, which are as low as possible.

VIII. The Committee shall be authorized to meet for the purpose of conducting the business of the Society as often as may be necessary, and shall have power to add to their numbers as occasion may require.

SIXTY-FIRST ANNIVERSARY

OF THE

Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society,

HELD IN TEMPERANCE HALL,

On Tuesday, 1st December, 1874.

The Chair was taken by Hon. S. L. SHANNON, President, at half-past seven o'clock.

The Chairman called upon the Rev. G. W. HILL, to read the Scriptures, give out a hymn, and engage in prayer.

The President addressed the meeting.

The Secretary read Abstract of Report.

## REPORT.

THE Committee of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society, again greet their friends and patrons at the Annual Gathering. Expressing gratitude to the Great Author of the Bible for His countenance and support; for the prosperity still continued to us as an auxiliary; for His sparing mercies bestowed upon every officer in this Committee; for the strength and unabated vigour still continued to the Agent, and for all the innumerable and unseen mercies which have been ours during the past years. He has made His pleasure to prosper in our hand. Therefore would we sing unto the Lord and bless His holy name, saying with Zion of old, "The Lord hath done great things for us whereof we are glad." Nor is this anthem of praise ours alone, the parent Society, which has reached its three score years and ten, this Auxiliary whose term of years have extended over three score years, and every Branch whose period of existence might have been shorter or longer, but extending as they do wherever the English language is known, wherever God's word has been read, unitedly they ascribe, "Blessing and glory, and wisdom

and *thanksgiving*, and honour and power and might unto our God for ever and ever," unto Him who has given His word, and increased the number and the influence of those who publish it.

Reserving in the meantime the notices of our Auxiliary, we shall hurriedly glance at the operations of the parent Society.

*France* has not yet wholly recovered from the late disastrous war, nor have the judgments of God which pressed heavily upon the land, called forth any National humiliation. But during the past year, as throughout many previous ones, the circulation of that Book which calls to repentance and reformation has been going on. 54 Colporteurs have laboured in 35 of the 86 Departments, into which France is divided. Seven of those Colporteurs laboured in Paris. Each Colporteur sold at an average 93 copies of the Scriptures each month. The total number of Scriptures sold in France within the year has been 98,316.

The Colporteur sowing beside all waters is often gratified to find, that seed sown has not been wholly unfruitful. One of the oldest Colporteurs, having visited Havre after an absence of some years, met with no fewer than three women to whom he had sold the Scriptures in former years, and to whom God had blessed their perusal with saving power. Two of them had been Roman Catholics, but the written Word unaccompanied by human teaching had revealed to them the error, and guided them out of the darkness of a corrupt system, and they are now living members of

a Christian church and rejoicing in the glorious liberty of the children of God. It may be well imagined that the evening which the aged Colporteur spent with these women whilst they declared what God had done for their souls, was to him a season of great refreshment, and a strong incentive to renewed diligence in his labours.

The distribution of memorial Testaments to the relatives of those who fell in the late war, has only this last year been completed. In all 5,178 copies have been circulated in France. The following letter from a French Pastor who has aided in this work is encouraging:—

“Till now I have delayed writing to thank you for the New Testaments, which you kindly sent me for the families of the soldiers who died during the war. I waited, before writing, to ascertain how these books would be received, not being at all sure that they would be favourably accepted. In the neighbourhood of my parish there is a village called St. Maurice d'Hié, entirely Roman Catholic, and led by a very fanatical priest. Not long ago a Colporteur gave away or sold, in the village, a few copies of the Holy Scriptures; but these books were burnt at the instigation of the priest. I had many reasons to fear that mine would meet with a similar fate, and was not at all surprised to hear that the priest had been thundering for three successive Sundays against ‘those infamous societies that avail themselves of every possible subterfuge in order to imbue the minds of unwary country people with their poisonous doctrines.’ The remedy was always the same; it consisted in delivering the heretical book to the flames, without even opening it.

Till within a short time, I had reason to believe that the advice, or rather the commands, of the priest had been obeyed, and I felt in no hurry to let you know the unfortunate result, but I lately received intelligence which made my heart rejoice, and which I hasten to communicate to you.

It appears that on this particular occasion the priest has been preaching to the wind. *Not a single family* that has received this testimony of sympathy from your Society will consent to part with it. The cherished name written on the title-page of the volume has been its safe-guard. Whatever it may contain, and whencesoever it may come, those good people cannot help shrinking as from sacrilege from the thought of giving to the flames this memento of their child, this book on which his name is inscribed. A woman who lost her son in the war said, speaking of her grandson, 'I am determined that the child shall learn to read, were it only to read his father's book, for unfortunately nobody can read in our house.' The priest has vainly tried in private to overcome the obstinacy of the rebels; he has only succeeded in estranging from himself those who possess the forbidden volume. It seems that one of them thus curtly replied to his remonstrances, 'Look here, Monsieur le Curé, this book is in remembrance of my son; do what you please, you shall not succeed in tearing it from me.' The curiosity of the whole parish now seems aroused. One man used often to go to his neighbour's house, in order to read one of those books which were so much spoken of. The reading pleased and interested him, and he afterwards remarked to the owner of the New Testament, 'Beware of burning this book, as the priest bids you; rather give it to me, if you wish to get rid of it.' 'I don't intend either to burn this book or to give it away,' answered the neighbour; 'I mean to keep it carefully in my cupboard.' . . . I might quote many similar facts, suited to encourage your Society in its unremitting exertions to spread the precious light of the Gospel in our unhappy country plunged, for the greater part, in thickest darkness. May our brethren on the other side of the Channel deserve more and more the remark, meant as a satire, but which I take to be the highest eulogy: 'Wherever an Englishman sees a hole he thrusts in a Bible!' It is impossible that the noble ardour displayed in spreading the Word of Life should not produce blessed fruit for the salvation of souls, and for the glory of God."

During the past ten years 145,510 copies of the Scriptures have been sold in *Belgium*, of which number 14,058 have been circulated the past year. Pastor

Wageneer, in writing to Mr. Kirkpatrick, the Society's agent in Belgium, says, that a new Church he has recently built, is already too small for the congregation, which includes from 20 to 40 Roman Catholics each Sunday afternoon. He adds, "This is the result of your Colporteurs labours, and we cannot be too thankful to God for having given us one who works with so much zeal and earnestness." The same Colporteur, Van Helden, says: -

Lately at Munkzwalm, I met a man who said, 'You sell the New Testament, yet the Protestants do not follow the Bible, they do not confess, although St. James commands us to do so.' I looked out the passage and read it to him, pointing out that what the Apostle meant was to confess our faults one to another, and to pray together for God's mercy, but that there is nothing in the text about priests having power to forgive sins. He thanked me, saying he had always felt a strong objection to confessing to a priest, and bought a Bible. Another asked me why I do not go to mass. I read to him Hebrews x. 14-18, and showed him that the mass is not taught in Scripture. He at once bought a Bible, saying that in his village there is a family who read it and are very worthy people.

In *Holland* 43,983 volumes have been issued during the year. Of these 16,625 have been sold by 6 Colporteurs, 9,695 were sold at the Depot in Amsterdam, and over 3000 sold to other Bible Societies.

There are three centres of Bible operations in Germany, Cologne, Frankfort and Berlin, connected with the first of these 17 Colporteurs were last year employed. Their average sales amounted to 2433 each; their average receipts to £88 16s. 80,641 copies of the Scriptures in all were sold last year.

In the district connected with the Frankfort agency, including Central and Southern Germany, there were 15 Colporteurs employed. These sold 35,270 books, partly among Protestants, and partly among Romanists. 32 Colporteurs have been labouring in North Eastern Germany in connection with the Berlin Depot. There have sold 65,785 vols., 54,644 have been disposed of otherwise, 120,429 copies of God's Word have been circulated in connection with this Depot, and throughout Germany last year the large number of 318,026 copies of the Scripture in more than 20 different languages were disposed of.

The "Old Catholic movement is advancing in Germany. At the Congress held in Constance, September, 1873, Bishop Reinkens gave no uncertain sound as to the right and duty of all to read God's Word. "Suffer no one," are his weighty words, 'to hinder you from drawing near to the Gospel, and hearing the Bridegrooms voice.' Read not Scripture *inquisitively* to seek the explanation of things, for which in this state of existence no explanation can ever be found. Read not Scripture *presumptuously*, to lose yourselves in subtle refinings concerning interpretations of things which it is not given man to understand; read not Scripture *polemically* to find reasons to enable you to refute others. But read it in order to enter into the most confidential fellowship with God, and then you, too, will gather courage to say nothing can separate *me* from the love of Christ." As a result of that address, there has been an increased circulation of the Scriptures among the Old Catholics of Germany.

In some districts of Germany, Popery has become more intolerant than ever of Bible circulation. The conflict between the State and the Ultramontanes has in some places created an excitement, which, at times, threatens violence to the Colporteurs.

One Sunday I went into a Roman Catholic Church. It was crammed full. The priest preached on the persecution of the Church and of the Holy Father. He announced processions, and collections for the ceremonies of the Church and for the poor Pope. I began to work on the Monday, and sold fifteen copies. Hereupon the priest got knowledge of it and interfered. In a house into which I came in the afternoon, a crowd assembled, among them a Jew. When I showed him a Hebrew-German Pentateuch, he said, 'I know the books, they are the books of the English missionaries.' He went his way, but now the Catholics began to be suspicious. The excitement grew fiercer; 'We are good Catholics,' they said, 'and will allow no man to rob us of our faith.' One man cried out, 'They are Lutheran books: tear his knapsack from his back, and throw it into the fire!' The situation was becoming very serious. At this point a blacksmith stepped forward, and said, 'Shew me your books.' I showed him a Testament. 'Were you at Nancy during the war?' he asked. I said, 'Yes.' 'So was I,' said he, 'and bought one of these very books of you for four sous. The books are not false, for the army chaplain told me so. Moreover, I have read a great deal in it, and never found anything wrong.' But, in spite of this testimony, the crowd buzzed around me like a swarm of bees, and the buzzing grew even fiercer, and more unfriendly, so that I thought it better to retreat for a while. Later in the day I tried again, but sold nothing. The people who saw me coming closed their doors, and shouted from the windows, 'Nothing, nothing; go away, go away!' On the other hand, when it was dark, a young lady came to the inn where I lodged, and bought three copies of the Testament for her parents.

Connected with the work in *Switzerland*, there are in Berne, Geneva, Nuchetel, Schaffhause, Zurich and

*Saint Gall*, Depots where the Scriptures are sold. 38,964 copies were circulated last year.

138,961 copies of the Scriptures in upwards of 20 different languages, were last year sold in *Austria*. At all the late Vienna Exhibition, though the privilege of circulating God's Word, was not extended, as years before it had been at the Paris Exhibition; still specimens of Scriptures in various languages were exhibited, and a Depot was opened for the sale of the Scriptures in one of the thoroughfares leading to the Industrial Palace. There are difficulties connected with Bible circulation in Austria. As an illustration of the "light and shadows" of Bible work, we extract the following:

At B— one of the men writes that at an inn he met with a man that was entirely deaf, but after reading a short while in a New Testament which had been handed to him, he expressed his great delight that there were yet people in the world willing to send such good books to poor people at so low a price. He was so enthusiastic in the words he used that the bystanders looked astonished, but the fact was that the few verses he had read had made a very deep impression upon him. He begged the landlady to give him his dinner that day and the next on credit, in order that he might with the money he had in hand buy the book.

At P— the Colporteur found the people very willing to buy, but only after they had satisfied themselves that the contents of the books agreed with the Gospel passages which occur in their prayer-books.

At Linz the Colporteur met a man who recognized him as the person from whom he had bought two years ago at S—. He told him that the books had made quite a stir in the place. The parish priest had ordered the people to burn every copy. Some had done so, others had resold their books, but the majority had determined first to examine the contents, and the speaker could not but testify from what he knew himself that the book was excellent.

At another place a similar peremptory order having been given by the priest, but with this distinction, that the people were to bring the books to him in order that he might consign them to the flames, a goodly number of copies were dutifully delivered. One day, whilst the parson was standing in the doorway of his house, he saw one of the most refractory of his flock coming with a large parcel done up in paper under his arm. 'That's right, Joe,' cried the priest, 'I am glad to see you come. Have you brought me your book? It is not a book for you folks to read, is it?' 'No, your Reverence,' was the reply, 'it is true, and I have brought you the book, but not *my* book, but *yours*.' And to the priest's great dismay, the man, undoing his parcel, brought out not a Bible but a 'Book of Legends,' which the Romish clergy circulate by thousands. 'Here's *your* book, sir,' said the man, 'I have a Bible and to that I will stick; since I have read my Bible I find no use for *your* book.'

Mr. Millard, the Society's Agent in Austria, narrates a rather eccentric way in which persons having no connection whatever with the Bible Society, at once outwitted the Romish priests, and disseminated considerable quantities of the Scriptures:

At the public fairs we generally have a table with our books displayed. The tactics of the priests are frequently, with a patience and perseverance, worthy of a better cause, to take their stand close by and warn people off. But mark the following scene:—In a distant corner of the square there is a booth. Its outside is gaudily decorated with huge pictures promising a feast for the eyes to those that will enter. Hundreds are attracted and enter. But notice those that come out. They have small books in their hands that to us have a very familiar look. Are not they our New Testaments and our Portions? The priests are off the scent. They do not heed what is going on here, and behold, whilst they are stirring up police and magistrates and lawyers and the rulers of the land against our Colporteurs, others unknown to us and unbid by us are doing work for us. These are booths with panoramic views travelling up and down the country. Times go hard, business is slack. To induce

people to come in the owners promise a premium to every visitor, and strange to say they have hit on the idea of selecting New Testaments and Portions of Scripture for the purpose. Perhaps it would be stretching charity beyond the limits of truth to suppose than an interest for the Gospel is the actuating motive of this arrangement. A simpler solution is nigh at hand. In all probability there is nothing cheaper to be found than our books. However that may be, it is a fact that more than 500 copies have been distributed in this way, and on making the discovery our surprise was not small.

Considerable progress has been made in *Poland*, 22,797 copies of God's Word have been sold there the past year. Some young Jews attending the higher schools have, with other pupils, been reading the New Testament.

During last year the Scriptures have been circulated in *Denmark* to the extent of 23,476 copies.

The spiritual condition of *Norway* cannot but afford great satisfaction to all who are praying for the extension of the Redeemer's Kingdom. New Churches and schools are being built. City Missionaries and Bible Women are being employed. Young Men's Christian Associations have been formed. The Sabbath School has become one of the recognized institutions of the country. All this, under God, is largely due to the very extended Bible circulation carried on three years past by the British and Foreign Bible Society.

40,481 copies were sold last year. School children have been allowed to purchase the New Testament at a reduced rate.

The large number of 86,877 copies of the Scriptures were last year circulated in *Sweden*.

The work of the Bible has, in *Russia*, these few years past advanced with rapid strides. The present year is memorable by the completion of the entire Bible in the Modern Russ. 127,578 copies in many languages have also last year been circulated.

In Spain, civil war, fraught with its usual evils, has been raging fiercely. But though the floods lift up their waves, the Lord on High is mightier than the voice of many waters, and during the past year His Word amid many difficulties, and much opposition, has been circulated. 18 Colporteurs, 13 of whom laboured the whole 12 months, the remaining 5 averaged 7 months each, sold 55,312 copies of God's Word. In all 82,409 vols., were circulated in Spain.

It could hardly be expected that when "every man's hand was against his brother," the Colporteurs of the Bible Society should escape trial. One thus pleads for help in distress :

With very much pain I send you these lines to let you know I am in prison, without having done anything to warrant it. I was found in this city during the late excitement, and was arrested with many more beside. The three days of bombardment I was in the asylum attending to the wounded, which I can easily prove, but as yet my case has not been brought before the tribunals. Many who were imprisoned with me, having friends outside to help them, have been set at liberty, but I who never dreamt of taking arms, nor am a volunteer, remain yet in confinement, so that I hope you will do all you can to secure my release. I wrote to Calle Zaragoza, begging them to do their best to help me, but no reply has ever been received. I beg of you earnestly to do whatever you can for me, for I am as innocent as on the day I was born.

Two months elapsed before the Colporteur was liberated.

Though the sale of Bibles and Testaments in *Portugal* has steadily increased during the past few years, having risen nearly 1000, a far more extensive circulation had been anticipated. Vexatious interferences, and, in many cases, unprovoked open hostility, have greatly retarded the work. Here is an illustration:—

Going along the road to Xabregas I passed a nobleman's mansion where several ladies and gentlemen were in the verandah; I offered my books for sale, and was desired to walk up. On entering the room, a padre, who was amongst the company, immediately put himself forward and examined the Bible which I offered to him, whilst the rest of the company looked on. 'Have you no other means, my man, of getting your living than by selling these?' asked the padre. 'No,' I replied; 'I get it honestly by a poor endeavour on my part to spread a knowledge of the Scriptures.' 'Why is not the approval of His Eminence the Patriarch attached to this book?' demanded the padre. (The *Licenca do Santo Officio* has been abolished over 50 years, yet this padre did not know it!) I told his reverence that the Word of God required no *fiador* (surety) to vouch for its truthfulness. I read several passages to him, and he rejoined, 'Yes, that is all very well; you Protestants want to do away with us and our Holy Catholic Apostolic Religion. I will buy a Bible and a Testament, and here is the money for them;' then turning to the people of the house he said, 'Now you can tear them up;' and the whole company joined in their destruction. I attempted to remonstrate, but the padre was furious, his looks betokened the rage he was in, and I was glad to escape from a scene that threatened violence to myself. Perhaps this demeanour of the padre was merely assumed, the more effectually to prevent the persons present from looking too closely into the matter; and to lead them to infer that if the Bibles were genuine, the good priest would not be so wicked as to tear them. The great security of the priest lies in the indifference on the part of the laity to search the Scriptures for themselves.

When it is remembered how long the Bible was a

forbidden Book in *Italy*, it is matter of gratitude that 40,903 copies of the Scriptures were distributed among its people the past year. 35 Colporteurs have been at work. One Colporteur laboured in Rome, another has left Rome to labour in the island of *Sardinia*.

It is satisfactory to find that in Turkey last year, notwithstanding all hindrances, a larger number of copies of God's Word were put into circulation, than any previous year. In 1872, 29,894 vols. were sold, in 1873, 41,732. The value of the sales last year was £1,476 2s. 7d.

In *Greece*, 2,281 copies, being more than double the circulation of the previous year was attained.

Throughout *Egypt*, *Palestine* and *Syria*, the circulation of the Scriptures was equal to what had been effected during the previous years.

The various Auxiliaries of India report some of them increased, some of them a slightly diminished Bible circulation.

Time does not permit a more extended notice of the doings of the great Parent Society. Suffice it to say, that last year portions of the Scripture were printed in six languages, in which no part of God's Word had previously been enjoyed.

That the Bible or portions of it has now been printed by the Society in 210 different languages and dialects.

That last year 2,654,080 were circulated, and that on the 31st March last, 71,131,111<sup>2</sup> vols. had been altogether circulated by the British and Foreign Bible Society.

The year before last the expenditure of the Society exceeded its income by more than Sixteen Thousand Pounds sterling. This year its income has exceeded its expenditure by £10,000 stg. But to this fact the Committee would call special attention. Taking the average of the last five years, there has been an excess of payments over receipts amounting to £4530.

Referring to the work of your own Auxiliary, the Committee have little new to present, except to report a growing increase of interest among the friends, especially among the Branches. The Agent's Reports, which were duly submitted at the regular meetings of Committee, are herewith presented. And the Committee would here willingly endorse all they have formerly stated in commendation of Mr. Russell and his labours during the past fourteen years, and which they are happy to state have met with marked approbation, from the Committee of the Parent Society. The wonder is, that he has been enabled to accomplish so much. This year he has visited Prince Edward Island in addition to his other labours. Thanks is gratefully tendered to the kind friends in the country, among whom he has sojourned, for kindness to the Agent for "his works sake." The lively interest exhibited by some to get up a meeting in a thinly settled district, or indeed any place where a spirit of indifference has got hold, for the ready volunteering of the collectors to bring in and forward the many small contributions that go to swell the Society's funds, For the conveyance "takled" up to drive to the coach

Those have all had their place in the Agent's pleasing recollections, and when given in the name of the Bible's Great Author, and for the sake of Him whose servant the Agent is, will in no wise lose the reward of Him who refuses to be the unpaid debtor to His people "for the cup of cold water."

In the name of this Committee, friends are thanked for kindness to the Agent. In the name of the Parent Society, they are thanked for liberal responses to his earnest appeals, by which the free contributions have so signally increased.

The Seventieth Report of the Parent Society (1874,) acknowledges receipt of £450 stg., to free contribution account, and £176 14s. 3d. on purchase account. Thus paying, as Nova Scotia ought to do, for every copy of God's Word used in her homes, churches or schools, and making a total of £626 14s. 3d. sterling.

Your Treasurer's account herewith submitted, exhibits the receipts and disbursements during the year. The following is an abstract of receipts :—

These items are not similar to the previous year's account, and therefore a comparison cannot be correctly

made. Thus we have the Gorham Bequest for 2 years, where last year's account nothing had been paid. But last year's account contained One Hundred Dollars, a bequest from Miss Coyle's estate. By this account there are no bequests reported other than the Gorham Annuity, which is annual. The subscriptions from the City of Halifax have increased to \$416.62, being over the previous year upwards of One Hundred Dollars. The subscriptions raised by the Ladies' Bible Association have slightly decreased. The most striking and marked increase is the Branch Societies contributions, for which, under God, we have to thank the energy of Mr. Russell, the Agent. In this item we notice an increase of nearly Two Hundred Dollars.

Halifax subscriptions do not yet bear a proportion to those of the Branch Societies, or an increase proportionate to its increasing wealth, no nor yet in proportion to what our fathers contributed twenty, thirty or forty years ago.

The Branch Societies and Ladies' Associations have rendered valuable assistance, and deserve the thanks of the friends of the Bible.

We have still with gratitude to report an increased and increasing circulation of the Word of God. Used as it is in many of the schools of our land. Taught in every Protestant Sabbath School, and we trust much read in families and closets, and though the circulation this year may not bear a favourable comparison with the preceding, your Committee rejoice to report

Being a decrease on the previous year of 48 Bibles and about 198 Testaments, sent to Branches—indeed the whole has diminished, indicating that Nova Scotia is abundantly supplied with the Word of God. At this period of our Society's history, it would be like standing with a rush light in our hand in the light of the glorious orb of day, to praise the sun, if we were to eulogise the Bible. True, men with sounding titles in science have cast doubts on its account of creation and conceived a creation of another form. The sceptic attempts to deny its authenticity. And indifference and unbelief in all its forms can show that they can live ignoring its claims. But our own personal experience and observation is, that all good men love the Bible. That all bad men whom we have known are to say the least indifferent to, or openly oppose its authority. That when the increase of Bible knowledge goes hand and hand with secular education, purity of life, as well as elevation of mind will be the result.

Now, in proof of those assertions, we do not need to read about France and Spain and the Southern Continent of America, where there is a name of Christianity, but not the pure Word of God. But, those who can remember the past in our own City and Province, who

were the men who fought "the battles of Benevolence and Philanthropy?" They were men who loved the Bible, and gave this testimony that they believed its record true. They contributed largely to make it known to others. Take an example in the name of the late J. W. Nutting, Esq., of whom it is claimed by his friends, that he was the first Sabbath School teacher in the town of Halifax, and for forty-five years was a contributor to this Auxiliary, and his followers are the devoted men and women who have during, and since his day, taken their places for the instruction of the ignorant, and have now brought systematically Sabbath Schools and their Associations and Conventions to us as near perfection as it is possible for human works to be. We might name over the other Benevolent institutions, as Bell and the Asylum for the Insane, Murdoch and the Blind Asylum, the Deaf and Dumb, the Fallen, the Sailor's and the Servant's Homes, societies for Relief of Poor. Efforts, some of which were successful to their ultimate end, others upon whom our Heavenly Father smiled upon with success. Of the founders and leaders of every one of them, it could be said they were Bible men and women, who loved the Bible and felt its record true.

The signs of the times are fraught with encouragement. The Young Men's Christian Associations, and the Evangelical Alliance, are all the outgrowth of that Catholic spirit Bible Society's first planted and ever upholds. Indeed in some places throughout our Province, it is yet the only meeting where all denominations

We are no unnecessary alarmists, but he would read the signs of the times with gratitude, that as yet no such open and avowed opposition exists with us. In the Thirty-third Report of the Upper Canada Bible Society, we have the following paragraph, after noticing the opposition, "from a hostile Roman Catholic priest, "at whose instance or instigation, after Mass on the "Lord's Day, at Sault Ste. Marie, twelve out of the "thirteen copies of the Holy Scriptures which he (the "Colporteur,) had distributed, were on that, or the "following, day publicly committed to the flames. "Were this audacious act not credibly affirmed, we "could scarcely believe it possible that it could have "been perpetrated, in the Protestant Province of "Ontario."

It is a source of gratitude to reflect, that we, in this Province, have never had exhibited any avowed hostility by public demonstration against God's Word. We know not what time may disclose, but hopefully look forward to a more hearty appreciation of the Word of God, than ever has yet been exhibited. When the knowledge of the Lord shall cover the whole earth, as the waters cover the channels of the deep. When not only God's name, but His Word, shall be honoured, from the rising to the setting of the sun.

## MR. RUSSELL'S REPORTS.

### To the Committee of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society:

On Saturday, the third day of April, I, this year, began labouring in Nova Scotia, by visiting our Branch in *Clifton*. That evening, and the day following, I had opportunities, in the Presbyterian Churches there, of adverting to God's Word, and its circulation throughout the world. Some old and some new subscriptions were obtained, and more will be received. Next week visited all our Branches in *Stewiacke*. In the *Village*, *Springside*, *South Branch*, *Middle Stewiacke*, and *Lower Stewiacke*, meetings were held, with the exception of the one in Lower Stewiacke, all of these were well attended. Rev. Messrs. Grant and Sinclair presided over the two former. Subscriptions which had been contributed, \$42.90 from the Village, and \$31 from Springside, were handed me. Rev. Edwin Smith presided at the meeting in Middle Stewiacke. At the close \$23.12, the greater part of which was subscribed at the close of my address, was handed me. \$10.60 was also obtained at the meeting in South Branch. Rev. R. Haire presided at the meeting in Lower Stewiacke, at which \$5.70 of old, and \$4.64 of new subscriptions, were paid.

On Monday, April 12th, came on to *Halifax*, to attend the quarterly meeting of Committee. The

weather was stormy and roads bad, so I rested the remainder of the week.

Went on the first of the week after to *Londonderry*. Held a meeting, well attended, in *Debert*. Collectors will go round. Went on to *Great Village*. Held an excellent meeting in the Presbyterian Church. \$40.17 of old subscriptions were paid, and collectors appointed to solicit more. Went on to *Portaupique*. Gratified by an increased interest in my work here. The meeting was larger, and the subscriptions greater, than at any previous visit. After the meeting rode down with Rev. Mr. Cameron, to *Bass River*. Here I have always had encouraging meetings, but the one held this year was better than any heretofore. \$6.80 of old, and \$36.59 of new subscriptions were obtained. The labours of the week were closed by a good meeting in *Economy*. Rev. Mr. McKay presiding. At the close \$42.08 were paid, and \$4.50 has since been received.

On Monday proceeded to *Five Islands*. At night held a small, but spirited meeting. Five minutes after its close, I was in the postman's carriage, on my way to *Parrsboro'*, which place was reached about three o'clock in the morning. That evening a meeting was held in the Wesleyan Church, *Parrsboro'*, not so satisfactory as I would have liked. At its close went on board the packet, which sailed within half an hour after for *Windsor*, which place was reached in the morning. A small meeting was held in the Presbyterian Church. The Society was re-organized, Rev. Roland Morton was appointed President, and Walter Lawson, Esq., Secretary and Treasurer. No collection was taken, but a Committee was appointed, who were to meet in a few days, to devise ways and means to have subscriptions taken up, and upwards of \$160 have since been paid.

Next day went on to *Avondale*. A small meeting in the Wesleyan Church was obtained. A collection

of \$2.13 was received, and collectors are to be sent round by and bye.

Next day (Sabbath,) at *Miller's Creek* in the afternoon, and in the Presbyterian Church, *Brooklyn*, in the evening, had opportunities of advertizing to God's Word, and its circulation. Collectors will, as usual, in connection with the *Newport* Branch, go round.

On Monday and Tuesday evenings, held meetings in *Rawdon* and *Woodville*, neither largely attended. On Wednesday evening an excellent meeting was obtained in the Hall, *Chiverree*. Rev. Messrs. Sutherland and Moore were present, and both lent their valued aid. Next day, partly riding, partly walking, went on to *Walton*. In the Baptist Church a few assembled to hear of Bible Society work. Went on to *Noel*. A good meeting in the Hall. The eighth and last meeting of the week was held in the Presbyterian Church *Lower Selmah*. It was not largely attended.

On Monday evening an excellent meeting was held in *Maitland*. Rev. Mr. McNeil presided, who with Rev. P. G. McGregor, of Halifax, largely contributed to the interest of the evening. *Maitland* is one of our Branches which every Fall takes up, and sends on a handsome subscription. Next evening a small gathering—in consequence of a school meeting having been appointed—was obtained at *Five Mile River*. To those who assembled I spoke briefly on the work of the Bible Society. Returned to *Truro*. On the following evening the Annual Meeting of the *Truro* Branch was held in the Baptist Church. There were more out than I had seen at a Bible meeting in *Truro*, for years. James K. Blair, Esq., President, Rev. Messrs. Goucher, Shenton and McMillan, with several lay gentlemen addressed the audience. The proceedings were unusually interesting, and some young ladies have since collected more than \$130. The following Sunday

afternoon accompanied Mr. Blair to *Johnson's Crossing*, where in the school house, after an address on the work of the Society \$6.73, was collected, and handed me.

Left Truro, Tuesday, May 26th, to begin a tour in the Western part of the Province, and that evening addressed a small meeting in *Avonport*. Went on next day to *Lower Horton*, where I held another small meeting in the Wesleyan Church. Went on to *Wolfville*. Tried, but failed to get the Branch here re-organized. From *Wolfville* went to *Kentville*. Few out at the meeting held in the Hall. The labours of the week were concluded by a good meeting in the Baptist Church, *Port Williams*, where a collection was obtained.

Next day at *Canard* and *Canning*, in the Wesleyan and Baptist Churches, addressed pretty large audiences on the work of the British and Foreign Bible Society. Collections were taken, and young ladies will, as usual, go round to solicit more.

Went on to *Berwick*. As usual, the meeting was small. But an excellent meeting and liberal subscriptions were obtained the evening after in *Somerset*. Went on from *Somerset* to *Aylesford*. Very small meeting in the Baptist Church. Proceeded to *Wilmot*. There were more out at our Bible meeting than I had seen on a similar occasion in *Wilmot* for years. Fair meeting at *Nictaux Falls* the following evening. The labours of another week were concluded, and the *ninth* meeting held in the Wesleyan Church, *Lawrencetown*. Next day in *Lawrencetown* and in *Paradise*, had opportunities of pleading the claims of God's Word. I had never held a meeting in *Paradise* before; but, if spared to return, I shall endeavour to awaken an interest in the work of the Bible Society there.

During the remainder of this week meetings were held in *Bridgetown*, *Annapolis*, *Hillsburg*, and *Digby*.

Some of them well attended, especially the meeting in Digby. I had written on to *Weymouth* appointing a meeting there for Friday evening, but no notice was given. Went on to *Yarmouth*. A very good Bible meeting was obtained in the Tabernacle. Accompanied by friends, I obtained in Yarmouth \$176.74. More I expect, will yet be forwarded.

Went on June 17th to Barrington, by coach. Under a heavy rain walked down to the Passage. Went to the *Kirk*, where a meeting had been appointed, but the rain prevented any attendance. Next evening a small gathering was obtained in the Wesleyan Church *Barrington Head*. And the evening after, a still smaller one—owing to a Bazaar going on at the same hour—in *Shelburne*. Next day accompanied Rev. Mr. Miller to *Jordan Bay*, where I adverted to the work of the Bible Society. The following day at the *Ferry*, and again in *Shelburne*, had opportunities of speaking of Bible distribution throughout the world. In *Shelburne* I obtained \$29.50, a smaller sum than I was wont to receive.

Took the coach Tuesday morning, June 23rd, to *Liverpool*. In *Milton* that evening in the Congregational Church, addressed a small meeting. Next day, accompanied by W. H. Freeman, Esq., obtained \$23.16 of subscriptions. Next evening a small meeting was obtained in *Liverpool*. But the handsome subscription of \$59.15—about \$50 of which was collected by one lady, was handed to me. Another friend in *Liverpool* gave me \$10. Went on to *Mill Village*. The times here seemed very depressed. A small meeting, and the smallest subscription I had ever received here, was obtained. Returned by *Lunenburg* to *Halifax*.

I had oftener than once been urged to visit *Prince Edward Island*, to, if possible, awaken an increased interest in Bible circulation. So this year I resolved

to proceed thither during the time I should have been resting at home. I went on Friday, July 10th. Spent twelve days on the Island, during which I travelled 274 miles, and addressed sixteen meetings, in twelve different places, namely, *Bedeque, Summerside, Malpeck, Port Hill, Clifton, New Glasgow, Cavendish, Covehead, Mount Stewart, Alberton, Georgetown* and *Charlottetown*. Some of the meetings, owing to defective notice given, were small. At every place visited I was warmly welcomed, and strongly urged to return. Had time permitted, I would have liked much to have visited other places. I am not without hopes but that my hurried visits to the places named, and the words spoken at them all, "have not been in vain in the Lord."

The last meeting in Prince Edward Island, was held in Charlottetown on the evening of Wednesday, July 22nd. An hour after its close I was on board the steamer for Pictou, and then to Port Hawkesbury. Reached Hawkesbury on Thursday night. Rode on to West Bay. Took the steamer *Neptune*, and next afternoon reached *Sydney*. Had arranged to hold a meeting that (Friday) evening, in the Bethel, *North Sydney*, but another meeting interfered. I had to postpone mine until Monday evening. Crossed to Sydney town. Here in Saint Andrew's, on the evenings of Saturday and Sabbath, I had opportunities of pleading the claims of God's Word. Above \$46, partly old, partly new subscriptions, were received. On Monday evening addressed a small meeting in the Bethel, North Sydney. Collectors were appointed to solicit subscriptions. Came on in steamer *Neptune* to *Baddeck*. As on former years I received a free passage on this boat. In *Baddeck*, at the Forks, and in Greenwood Church in the country town, held meetings. Some subscriptions were received, and more will be obtained and forwarded. Went on to *Margaree*. Here in the Baptist Church in

the North East, in the Presbyterian Churches up the "Big Intervale," and at the "Harbour," had opportunities of pleading the claims of God's Word. The meeting in the Baptist Church was very large; the others were not so well attended. Some subscriptions and collections were received, and more subscriptions will be procured. Came on to *Mabou*. The farmers were now busy hay making, and the meeting held here was small. An hour or two after the meeting was on my way by stage to Hawkesbury, which place we reached about nine in the morning. At night failed in obtaining a meeting. The evening was rainy. Only the Rev. Mr. Weldon appeared in the Wesleyan Church, at the appointed hour. We waited a while, no one came, so we left. Mr. W. handed me as I was leaving a very handsome subscription.

Next day the steamer (which had been delayed fifteen hours beyond its time,) made its appearance. I left in it for Pictou, and on Saturday morning, reached Truro. The last meeting was held in the Presbyterian Church, Brookfield, last Sabbath afternoon. At the close of my address I received \$15.39 of a collection, which had been contributed at the door, as the people were entering.

Since the first of April, I have traveled in every County of Nova Scotia, with the exception of two, and in fifteen of these have attended, and addressed meetings; besides the meetings held in the three Counties of Prince Edward Island. I have during these four months traveled by land conveyances, 1637 miles, sailed 528, walked 209, addressed 100 meetings, in 84 different places, and obtained of subscriptions and collections, and on purchase account of Bible Society, \$1275.84, being an increase of \$113.65 over the amount obtained the corresponding four months of last year, and during the past three years there has been an

In each address delivered I try to present and press the grand motive to Christian liberality, love to Him, "who gave Himself for us," and I have had the satisfaction of seeing many a hearty response given. May each contributor to the Bible Society realize that "it is more blessed to give than to receive."

**To the Committee of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society:**

I arrived in Truro from New Brunswick, on the evening of Monday, Nov. 2nd, and, the day following, began labouring in Nova Scotia. Visited, and held Bible Meetings that week in *Wallace, Pugwash, Oxford, Amherst*, and *Athol*. The meeting in *Wallace* was small, but spirited, and a handsome subscription has since been received. In *Pugwash* very few assembled, and but little interest was manifested. In *Oxford* an excellent meeting was obtained, the handsome subscription of \$41 was received, and more money has since been forwarded. The very tempestuous night of Friday, Nov. 6th, caused a thin attendance at the meeting in *Amherst*. But arrangements were made to have collectors go round. Since my last visit to *Amherst*, death had removed the venerable Dr. Clarke,

a warm friend of the Society, and for many years the President of the Amherst Branch. Rev. Mr. Steel was, at the meeting, elected President. The meeting in Athol was small, but some subscriptions have since been forwarded. Returned to *Truro*. After a few days rest went on to Lunenburg County. The first meeting—a small one—was held in Temperance Hall, *Chester town*. Some subscriptions were received then, and more have since been obtained. The following evening a small meeting was held in the Baptist Church, *Chester Basin*. Went on to *Mahone Bay*. At night an excellent meeting was held in the Lutheran Church, Rev. E. McNab, presiding. Obtained over \$30 of subscriptions. Went on next day to *Lunenburg town*. That evening held a meeting in Temperance Hall, Rev. Mr. Owen presiding. During next day, (Saturday) and partly on Monday, accompanied by Stephen Finck, Esq., gathered up over \$69. *Not one who was asked refused to give*. Through the efforts of a lady collector about \$15 additional have been obtained. Went on Monday afternoon to *LaHave Ferry*. A severe storm, which began as I was leaving town, prevented any meeting being held. Went on to *Lower LaHave*. A large meeting was held in the Presbyterian Church, Rev. D. McMillan presiding. Some subscriptions were obtained, and collectors were appointed to secure more. Next afternoon accompanied Mr. McMillan to Dublin, where, at night, a small meeting was held in the Presbyterian Church. Walked on, next morning, to *Petit Reviere*. In the evening addressed an excellent meeting in the Wesleyan Church. Next day, partly riding and partly walking, went to *Bridgewater*. In the evening a good meeting was obtained in the Hall, Rev. Mr. Gelling presiding. At the request of Rev. Mr. Hunten, I addressed his people the following Sabbath forenoon on the work of the Bible Society. A collection of \$3.40 was taken, and handed me.

Altogether in *Bridgewater* I obtained \$68.54, and more has since been obtained and forwarded.

Early Monday morning, Nov. 30th, I left *Bridgewater*, by coach, for *Halifax*, and next evening attended, and took part in the Annual Meeting, in *Temperance Hall*.

On Saturday, Dec. 4th, went on by rail and coach to *Antigonishe*. Next day had an opportunity of advertising to the work of the Bible Society, in the Presbyterian Church. A collection was taken. On Monday several subscriptions were added, making in all upwards of \$81, from *Antigonishe*.

About ten o'clock on Monday night, under a pelting rain, left *Antigonishe*, to ride on by mail—and in an open carriage—to *Guysboro'*, which place was reached about seven o'clock in the morning. It continued stormy all day; and the Bible Meeting held in *Temperance Hall*, at night, was consequently very small. From the Ladies' Bible Society I obtained \$19.50, from the other Society \$12. Rode on to *Sherbrooke*. Here and in *Goldenville* held meetings, neither of them large. Went on to *Saint Mary's*. In the Presbyterian Church, *Glenelg*, on Sabbath, 13th Dec., had opportunities of advertising to the work of the Bible Society. Obtained \$30 from the Ladies' Branch, *Saint Mary's*. Rode on to *Caledonia*. In *Lower* and *Upper Caledonia* in the two School houses, held meetings, both well attended, and subscriptions good. Rode on, by mail, to *Upper Musquodoboit*. A meeting appointed in the *Upper Settlement*, proved a failure; but some subscriptions were obtained, and more will be forwarded. The week's labour closed by a fair meeting held in the School house in the *Flat*, and the last meeting in connection with this tour, was held in the School house, *Middle Musquodoboit*, on the evening of Monday, 21st Dec., Rev. Mr. Tweedie presiding. Returned to *Truro*

the evening following, and busied myself in preparing subscription papers, &c., for the forthcoming Annual Report.

Since the 3rd of Nov., in prosecution of my work, I have travelled by rail, coach, or private conveyances, 902 miles, walked 103, addressed 33 meetings in 25 different places, and obtained of subscriptions, and on purchase account, \$729.05.

During 1874, in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island together, I have in connection with my work, traveled by land conveyances, 5476 miles, sailed 1104, walked 461, addressed 230 meetings in 195 different places.

With the exception of about a fortnight's illness, last September, I have not during the past year—nor indeed during many years—been hindered one day by sickness from doing my work. And even the places in *New Brunswick*, which, owing to that indisposition, I had disappointed, I was able afterwards to visit. To HIM who is the God of my life, and the length of my days, I would desire to feel very grateful for His continued kindness to me, and to devote myself more unreservedly than ever to His service.

As year follows year, I see an increased interest taken in my work. Over \$2000 of subscriptions and payments on purchase account, have, this year, passed through my hands, besides the sums directly forwarded from Branches to Halifax. This is nearly \$300 in excess of the past year, and it exceeded the receipts of any previous one. The way too in which money is frequently given is exceedingly pleasing. Last Summer a friend in Liverpool, in addition to a previous subscription, handed me \$10. Two months ago I received, by mail, \$10 from an unknown friend, in Pictou County. \$2 from another unknown friend, in Cornwallis. A warm-hearted friend of the Bible Society,

who last year gave me \$100, this year handed me a similar sum. Nor is this increasing liberality confined to Nova Scotia. A few weeks ago I received a letter from the North of New Brunswick, enclosing a two dollar bill, with the words, "Will Mr. Russell accept the enclosed \$2, as a contribution to the Bible Society, from a little boy and his sister." Such gifts, and obtained in this manner, indicate love to Him, of whom the book—we seek to circulate—testifies.
