LADY ABERDEEN PRESIDED OVER NATIONAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN

Members Were Officially Welcomed in Toronto Last Evening—Delegates from 23 Countries Present.



Toronto, June 16.—Toronto was taken by storm today by the delegates to the International Council of Women, who poured into the city by two trains. They came some 200 of them from twenty-three countries and the work of sorting them out and sending them to homes at which they are billeted was a task of no small magnitude.

MRS. HOWARD GOULD HAD A VERY STRENUOUS DAY

Forced to Sit Yesterday and Hear Damaging Testimony as to Her Habits—Witnesses Declare She Was Often Helplessly Intoxicated—Ex-Servants Say She Used Bad Language.

New York, June 16.—Howard Gould did not go on the stand today as had been expected to testify against his wife, Katherine Clemons Gould, whose suit for separation he is opposing. Instead there was a continuation of servants' accounts of their former mistress' alleged fondness for alcohol and of her manner when under the influence of the beverage. The effect of liquor, said indications are that the plaintiff must endure for another day, possibly for two, the embarrassing ordeal of listening to the testimony of former servants, all of whom have been called at the instance of her husband to sustain, if possible, his contention that living with his wife was impracticable and decidedly unpleasant, hence that the charge of abandonment, the mainstay of Mrs. Gould's case, is not borne out.
