Petrograd, Aug. 19.—It was officially announced today for the first time, that the new residence of the deposed Russian Emperor Nicholas, is at Tobolsk, a western Siberian town, which recently achieved a certain dublous publicity in revolutionary Russia as the birthplace of Gregory Rasputin, the Mystic Monk, who wielded a remarkable influence over the ex-Emperor's family up to the time of the priest's assassination in Petrograd last December. The official announcement says:

"Owing to reasons of state, the government decided to transfer to a new residence the ex-Emperor and the ex-Empress, who are detained under guard. The place selected was Tobolsk, where they were taken after requisite measures were completed to ensure their safety. With them went, of their own free will, their children and most of their entourage."

According to some newspapers the ex-Imperial family will reside permanently in the former governor's palace at Tobolsk, which is a large house without modern improvements, built in the eighteenth century for a local speculator. Sas Van Gent, Holland, Aug. 19—Terrific explosions of bombs dropped by Entente Allied airmen in a raid shortly before midnight on Selzaete, as Belgian town on the Dutch frontier, eighteen miles north of Ghent, awakened all the inhabitants of the town. London, Aug. 19—British troops this morning stormed the German trenches in the neighborhood of Gillemont Farm, between the towns of Lempir and Bony, on the Somme front in France. On this same front British radiung parties last night entered German positions southwest of Havrincourt. Field Marshal Haig reports that heavy casualties were inflicted on the Teuton garrisons.

The text of the statement given out by the war office today reads:—
"We carried out a successful local operation early this morning south-of Epeky, in which we captured the German trenches in the neighborhood of Gillemont Farm, and took several prisoners.



EXHAUSTING THE ENEMY

(Continued from page 1)
One of the most heroic deeds put on record in the Canadian Corps since the war began is that of a runner of Colonel Ormonder's Alberta Battalion. The company to which he was attached was hotly engaged near the chalk pits, and he was given a message to take back to the battalion headquarters, over ground on which shells were falling continuously. He had not gone far when he was seen to fall, and another runner was at one sent out with a duplicate of the message. The second message carrier was killed on his journey, but two hours afterwards the first one arrived at the battalion headquarters with his left arm blown off near the shoulder. His terrible wound had been roughly dressed in the field, and the messenger, far spent from loss of blood, had then staggered on to do his duty. He was removed in a dying condition, but he carried his message to its destination.

A fine example of bravery and resourcefulness was given by a Russian private in the same battle. As the platon to which he belonged approached the chalk pits they came under machine gun fire. The Russian, going torward, found the muzzles of two machine guns sticking out of the entrance to a dugout. One of them was in action, sweeping the line of advance To get in front of it, the only way to tackling the crew, concealed in the entrance, meant instant death. A piece of plank lay nearby. To the Russian it was a Heaven-sent weapon. With it he struck the protruding gun barrels so hard a blow that they and their crews went clattering down to the bottom of the dugout, whence came cries of Kamerad. At that moment a riflle builtet struck the elbow of the Russian and denrived him of the use of one arm. Holding his rifle with its fixed bayonet at the charge, in one hand, he ordered, the Germans to come up. They came, an officer and five men, who were dufy turned in, with their


